Urbana Residents Fight Carle Parking Lot

About 200 residents of the Urbana Carle Foundation Hospital have joined together to oppose what they call "hoarding" efforts by the hospital to acquire new parking.

Urbana residents at Crystal Lake Park have formed a group to oppose the hospital's request for a permit to use five nearby lots that could add 80 parking spaces.

"The permit is set July 27 to consider efforts to purchase our neighborhood when the blackboarded intentions of Carle first

came to light," said Marlene Schwabke, an organizer of the group who lives at 314 N. Orchard St. U Schwabke said a woman who lives in the lot now of north Orchard Street had been approached by an agent of Stafford & Carley realtors, which handled land acquisition for the hospital and was told her house would be torn down to make room for another "temporary" parking lot.

The woman agreed to let her house be demolished only if represented the first 1800 sq ft of the lot intended to expand operations 3000 sq ft of Church Street. The Stafford & Carley representatives could not be reached for comment Tuesday evening.

Schwabke said a major concern of the

neighbors is how much land the hospital intends to acquire. She added that she will request that the hospital plans be made public at 7:30 p.m. Thursday when the Urbana Planning Commission meets to consider Carle's permits.

Another concern of the neighbors, according to Schwabke, is the loose gravel surface the hospital uses to cover almost temporary lots. She said the gravel also can be used to cover parking spaces and degrade the appearance of the neighborhood, which is within a block of the west side of Crystal Lake Park.

Actually, Carle's request is for three, one permits, although use of the northwest

corner of Park and Orchard Streets for almost three city lots with a potential for 41 additional parking spaces. Requests for permits at 710 and 800 W. Park St. each would use another 20 spaces.

The lot at 800 W. Park St. now is vacant after the former residence was closed last year. The 710 W. Park St. lot is the former site of the Church of God, since moved to north-west Champaign.

City Planner Sue Gorderley said the real estate office staff with survey and Verne Toole, clinic administrator, is discussing the problem of the "temporary" lots.

Gorderley said city engineer Keith Krieger suggested applying an oil-based treatment

that would "absorb" the gravel in place and virtually eliminate the dust.

Gorderley said the Carle representatives requested permission to the suggestion Tuesday and the status of the temporary lots hinges on completion of the parking ramp under construction at the southwest corner of Park and Orchard streets.

The parking ramp, scheduled for December completion, will take about 600 parking spaces in the 500 spaces currently available. Carle officials said that permanent asphalt resurfacing of the temporary lots could begin when the ramp is finished and it is determined how many spaces are necessary.

PEACE SUMMIT SET

Begin, Sadat Set To Meet Carter

WASHINGTON — President Carter will meet with Egyptian President Anwar Sadat and Israeli Prime Minister Menachem Begin at Camp David on Sept. 5 to resume direct Middle East peace negotiations.

White House press secretary Jody Powell said the three leaders will meet "to seek a framework for peace in the Middle East."

Powell said all were agreed there is "no time more important than the present for a permanent settlement."

The meeting is the first since breakthrough in Middle East peace efforts since Soviet suspended negotiations last January. It will be the first meeting between Sadat and Begin since last December.

The meeting was arranged by Secretary of State Cyrus Vance, who will host the Middle East

leader and Begin. The official said Carter decided to ask for it because "the two countries were drifting away from a peaceful settlement and Carter wanted to restore his prominence in the peace negotiations."

The official, who spoke in confidence on condition that he not be named, said the meeting's secret is being called "not because we expect for peace are so good but because the news have in fact been."

"We have no illusion that the meeting in Camp David will itself produce a settlement," the official said. "But it will help a great deal" in focusing attention on remaining differences, he added.

The official said Carter hopes the meeting at the presidential retreat "will encourage the parties to resume more direct negotiations themselves."
