




Student Council Ends Year with Success

Afro-American History Club Probes into Background.








Back Stage . . .






Tigers Finish in Triumph












Tigers Cope Regional Title, Best Record Ever


1968 was a year of triumph for Urbana basketball. In addition to winning the regional title, the Tigers won twenty-two games to set its best record in the history of the school. They finished a very close third in one of the state's toughest conferences, and the greatest triumph of all was defeating arch rival Champaign Central two out of three times, to establish their rule over the twin-cities.

With a Team composed mainly of seniors, Coach Oscar Adams put together an aggressive, experienced and balanced team. Top scorer, Ardell Webb, Co-captain Bill Mock and Ron Bitler all had scoring averages within a few points of each other. Co-captain Dave Werkman, Willie Southall, Mark Beckrum and Terry Ruppel added to the Tiger depth.










