




Meador's good performance at district advanced him to sectionals where he placed 22nd. The year ended with a banquet where Thies was honored as the most valuable runner, and Sam Batzli was honored as the most improved runner. 1979 was the first year for girls' cross country at Urbana. Because other teams had so few runners, most girls' meets were not scored. But the district meet was scored, and there Urbana placed 2nd. Everyone on the team lettered, and five girls qualified for state at the season's end.


