

The big Thornton Fractional North Meteors from Calumet City came to Urbana to meet the "little" downstate team. The Tigers grabbed the Meteors by the tail and sent them flashing back to Cal City after a 33-7 Urbana victory. Later in the year, the Tigers took a little trip of their own to battle Centralia's Orphans, always a power in southern Illinois. Urbana had little sympathy for the Orphans winning 13-7. Another shining plus was a little halfback named Dave


Crouse. Dave captured the hearts of the entire city as he proved to be the undoing of several Goliaths. At the end of the season, he was selected on the All-State team.

On the minu-wide of the '61 season was a heart-breaking loss to Springfield and the 26-20 loss to Champaign in the final contest of the year. The CHS game was well played by both squads and was one of the finest in the long series between the two schools.

Dave Crouse and Bob Hanes were awarded honorable mention on the prep All-American squad at season's end. Crouse was voted as the Most Valuable Player and Gary Halberstadt was presented the Dick Pittman award for outstanding lineman of the year.


The highlight of the season was the double victories over Champaign. In both games, our cagers came from behind to form a thrilling climax to the victories.

The team, coached by Gordon Burgess, shattered every swimming record in the books. Carrington proved himself to be one of the top high school freestylers in the country with outstanding times in the 40, 50, and 100 yard freestyle events. The team placed sec-

ond in the Big 12 meet, and two swimmers earned a place in the state meet by placing high in the district meet. Carrington and Eric Jones went to the state meet at Evanston. Jones swam his best race of the year in the 100 yard butterfly stroke preliminaries and just missed qualifying for the finals. Carrington qualified in the 50 yard freestyle and finished in a tie for fourth place in the finals.
