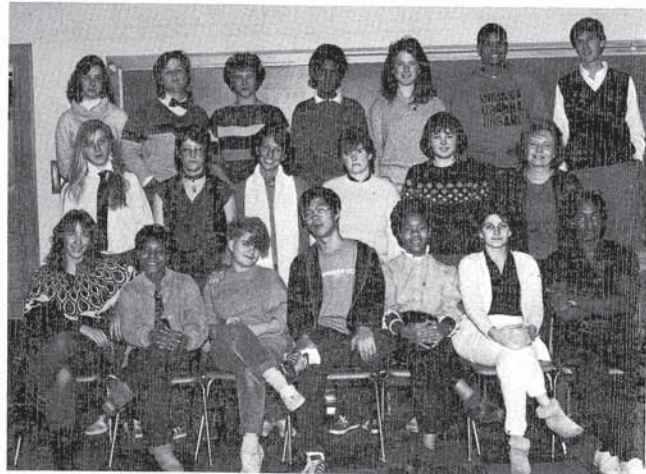

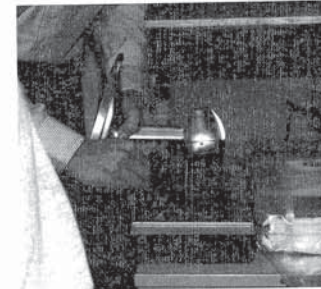

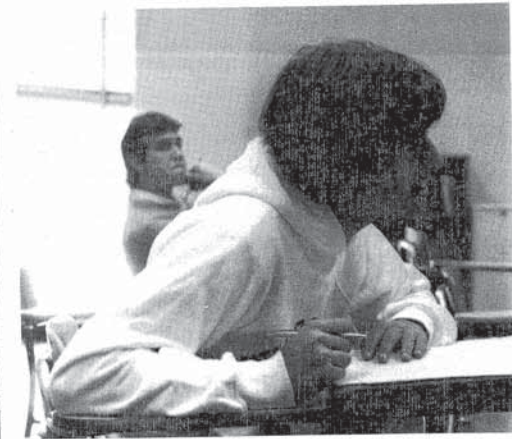
Develop Tiger Talents

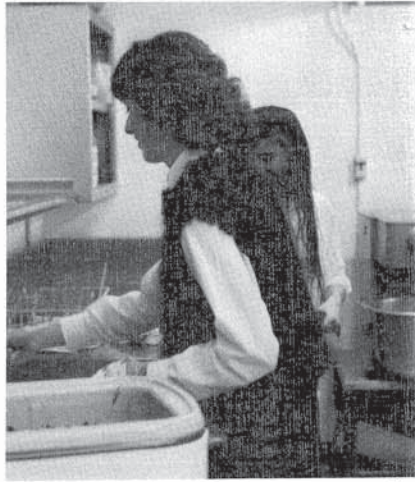

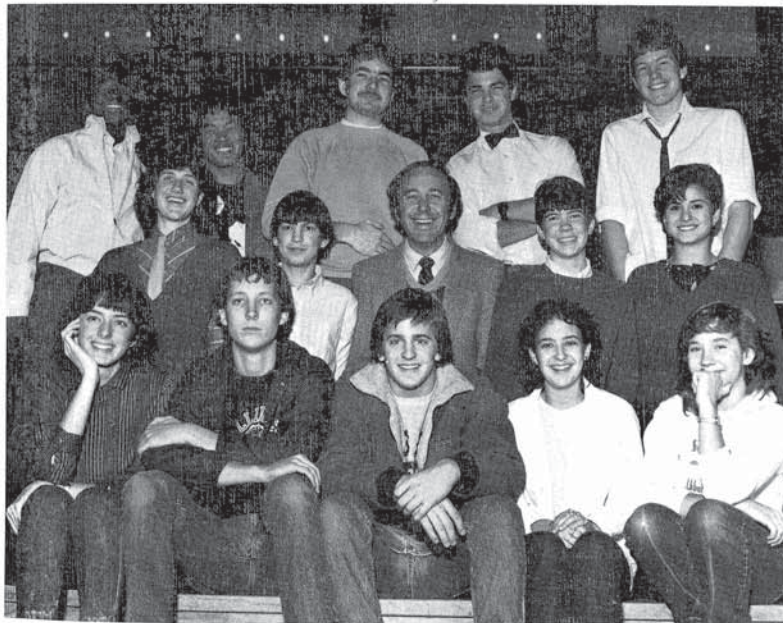

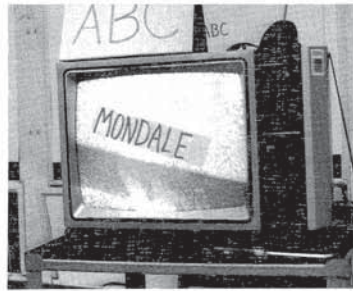

Election Night

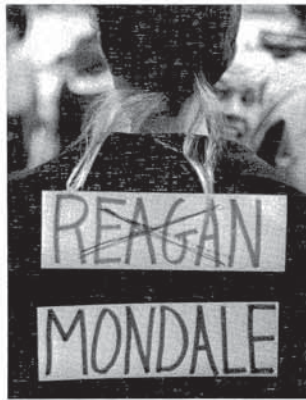

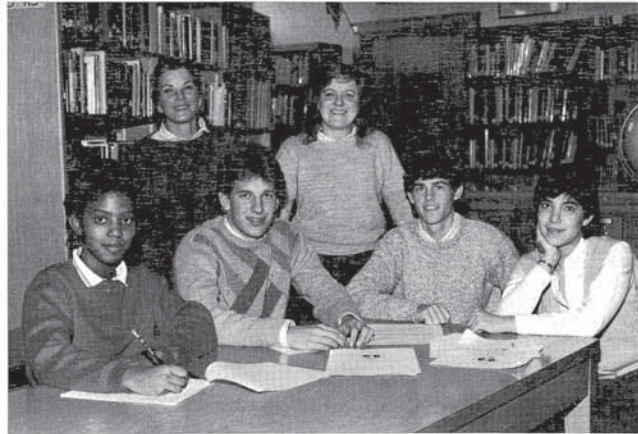
F.S.A. Flowers Funds

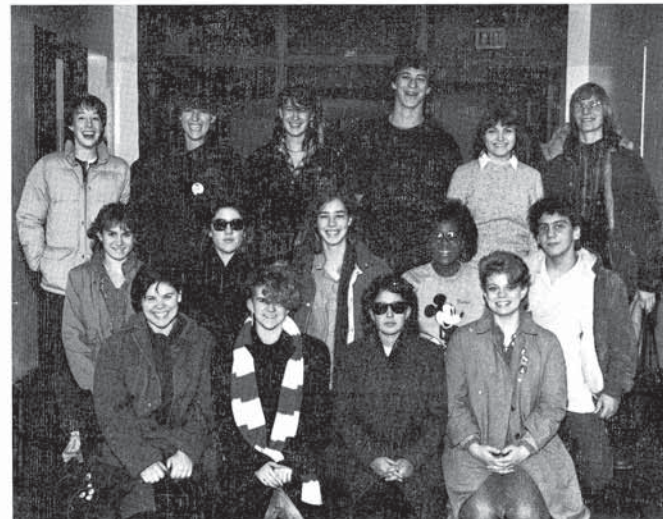

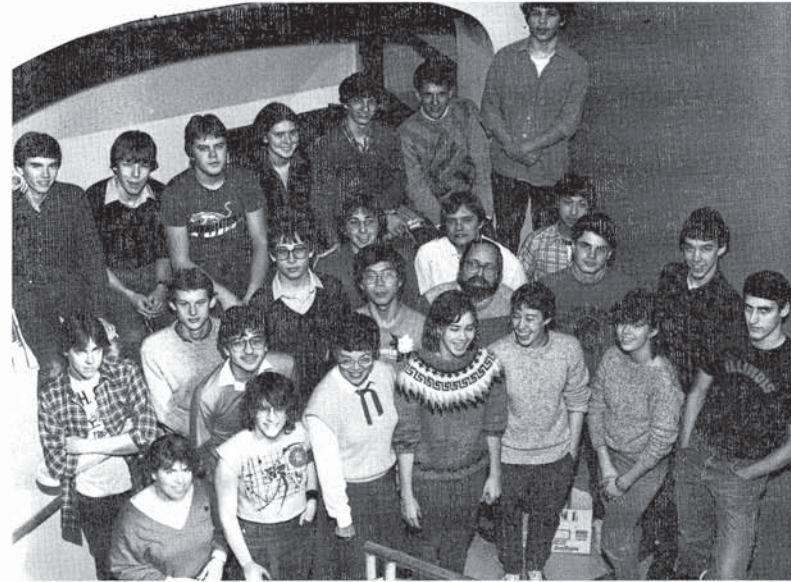

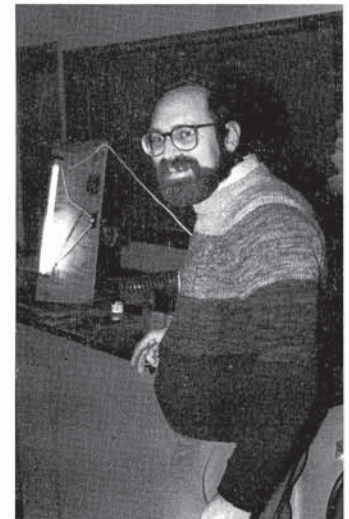
