Ray – recent awardees for PCC funding had matching 27-46%

Zernial – cybercommittee: get youth involved
tonight 6 PM, Salem

Brainstorming how to reduce budget request:
Brandon – reduced our number of PCCs to about 22
Only \$5M so far 1st round given out SBA/PCC

Maria – cut down hours of teaching to reduce budget
Discussion about matches: questions about what counts as in kind
Budget discussion about high amount requested (Ray says not so high)

Bill will tweak wireless budget: he argues for birth to grave training

Rev Bogan – 75 people use Salem lab (60% use computers)
We need count of how many for each PCCs –
Maria asked why not include all users in projection, since there is a likelihood if they walk in the door they might eventually use the computers

Ann: estimate of total vulnerable population and put PCCs within walking distance

Bill & Ray: Are computers bondable? [Later in the day, the answer is NO.] Wireless counts; wiring

Rev. Bogan: adequate wiring not available: renovating what we have

Cut Columbia – ?

James – Lower grade computers may lower power needs
Low-power WISE terminals; virtualize; thin clients

Bill- Redo library rack servers, reliant pcs – but different kind of expense

Bill and Mezolink → cloud service, Virtual density
e-rate dollars
someone else manage the virtual desktop
servers not needed at sites

could lower cost of computers and save \$21K; James could lessen Maria's budget

Ann and others--pro-Columbia, ties into family

Cut DMBGC? Cut high end video stuff – not good return; can use Urbana Public TV or IMC to learn video production

Parkland (9 training sites)

Director of Ed – coordinate sites, training

Part-time teachers; lab monitors/assistants

Library already has IT staff

Reverand Bogan – where's the workforce development

Not teacher but community technology center manager – PCC train the trainer

Ann – tiered and pipeline

Pay 10% to people who are at these sites already

Do what they do now to enhance skills for 3 years -- \$20/hr for 10 hrs/wk for 3 years – times N sites

Ray – Parkland Scholarships for volunteers?

Sustainability – on site training and then continue post-grant

Wide-ranging discussion about staffing—

Staff to do what we want to do

At Parkland:

1 director of ed \$60K/yr (oversee 12 pccs) – reasonable amount of work

Pt teaching \$20/hr for 72 hours

Lab asst \$10/hr for 80 hours

IT tech support 121 computers -- \$45K/yr

Administrative asst –

Cut down number of switches & cables, servers

Ann – suggests keep it centralized and add to Parkland

Maria – can't do larger scale without more staff

Add asst director?

Half-time tech support → \$22,000

Cybernavigator = lab asst (increase #)

PCC Manager (with training)

SBA director works with Neighborhood Services manager

Cybernavigators – out in community to help folks hook up modems, etc.
