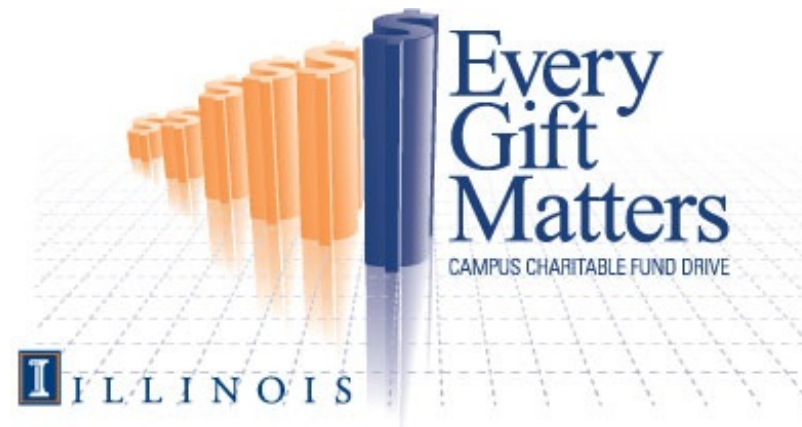

The United Way of Champaign County addresses serious local issues like hunger, homelessness, child abuse and neglect, domestic violence and support for senior citizens. By funding local human service agencies young children can be assured of crisis safe shelter around the clock, advocacy in foster care, child care and preschool tuition assistance, access to medical and dental care, school readiness programs and special services for developmental disabilities. Youth in our community receive mentoring, homework assistance, afterschool and summer programs, opportunities to participate in recreation and scouting, shelter for runaway teens and emergency services for homeless children trying to stay in school. Families get help meeting basic needs by accessing food assistance from local pantries, finding transitional housing in local shelters, escaping abuse from domestic violence and gaining self sufficiency through money management classes.

Individuals with disabilities receive apartment and employment assistance and adults with mental health challenges find treatment for a range of issues. Finally, senior citizens can continue to live independently in their homes through delivered meals and health care assistance.

United Way of Champaign County funds dozens of programs that provide essential services to those most vulnerable in our local community. In addition UWCC advocates for services,
