Rev. Rickey E. Parks was born to parents Chester, Jr. and Azzilee Parks. He was an extra special baby because his parents were told that his birth could cause health concerns or even death if the pregnancy was not terminated, but with the faith of God and many prayers, his mother was determined to bring her son into the world. He was born at the Jefferson Regional Medical Center on Thursday, January 10th, 1963 at 4:46 pm and he weighed 6 pounds and 15 ounces.

Having been the only boy in his family, with two sisters Sharon and Carlotta, he was spoiled rotten to say the least. As a child, Pastor Parks' favorite toy was Batman. He also loved western cowboys. He thought he was the baddest thing in Pine Bluff, wearing his little cowboy hat and holster.

One of his favorite subjects was Physical Education. Upon graduating from high school, it was no surprise that he would pursue his advanced education in that field. In 1986, he received a Bachelor of Science Degree in Community Recreation and Physical Education from the University of Arkansas, Pine Bluff. Pastor Parks later received his Master of Science degree in Secondary Education.

During his college years, he met the love of his life, or as he would put it, his "rib" or the were married on August 12th, 1989.

At the age of 18, God called and Pastor Parks accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior. During his early discipleship at the Rose Hill Missionary Baptist Church, he served as an usher and as a choir member. On June 27th, 1999, he was ordained as a Minister at the Rose Hill Missionary Baptist Church. In 2002, Pastor Parks accepted the call to pastor at Star Bethel Missionary Baptist Church in Wabbaseka, Arkansas. Through his extensive work history, he now has experience with the church on local, state and national levels.

In 2008, Rev. Parks was called to pastor at Pilgrim Missionary Baptist Church. Since February 2008, well over 140 new disciples have joined by way of baptism, reinstatement, letter, or Christian experience.


Quarterly bowling outing
