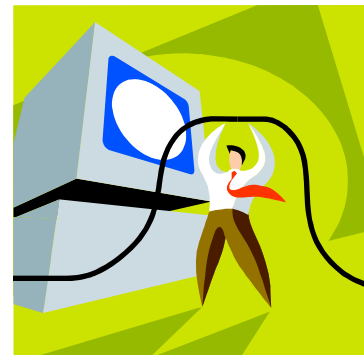

# Genealogists **LOVE** technology

- Communicate with others doing research – even globally – fast, easy, cheap
  - ❑ BBS (remember those!)
  - ❑ Email lists
  - ❑ Web sites
  - ❑ Facebook
  - ❑ Skype

# Genealogists **LOVE** technology

- Quick and easy access to sources with comprehensive knowledge on how to do genealogical research, historical information, and archives
  - Genealogists used to have to visit libraries, subscribe to journals and magazines, attend conferences
- Relatively inexpensive

# Genealogists **LOVE** technology

- Incredible access to vital records (digitized!) and other documentation
  - Ancestry.com
  - Footnote.com
  - HeritageQuest.com
  - Familysearch.org
- Access to foreign (Polish) websites
  - Google translate – not good but better than nothing

# Genealogists **HATE** technology

- It can easily lead to:
  - sloppy documentation of research
  - erroneous information, which can send a person down the wrong path for years!
- Genealogists aren't technologists
  - It's confusing for a society to decide what it needs to or should provide to members
- It can be expensive



# Genealogists **HATE** technology

- Technology still needs manual intervention
  - Someone needs to scan the records
  - Digitalized vital records are computer files that need to be renamed as something recognizable
  - Databases need to be populated with data by manual input
- In other words – good, old volunteers!

# Genealogical Society Tech Issues

- Very small non-profit businesses, generally with limited sophisticated technological knowledge
- Generation technology gaps within the members of the society that need to be bridged
- Need for a community resource to which governing bodies of societies could turn for technology guidance
