Bethel AME Church 136 years of Faith, Love and Tradition

The history of a person, an institution or state is a record of the outward deeds, with a background often unexpressed, of hid longings, aspirations, and struggles; of his failures and triumphs, his defeats or approximation of success; which reveal character, and enable posterity to vivo retrospectively and objectively the record; and evaluate his worth in terms of religious and spiritual values, and at the same time consider the contribution he has made to his time and generation. So it is with a church.

*The history of Bethel African Methodist Episeopal Church may not be one of brilliant achievement viewed from material standards, but when all lactors are taken into consideration its luster remains undimmed. Founded in an early period of the Civil War, in a pivneer community built upon oirgin prairie lands in a young commonwealth; organized by a handful of Freedmen - just released from the chains of slavery, and a few other Regroes; with only a few of their group to draw upon; with an economic handicap inherent in a situation of a settlement of

impeeunious emigrants, with little work - at small wages, and their own personal struggle for existence and to eke out a competence for the proverbial "rainy day"; with a little financial assistance from their white neighbors, who too were struggling to erect churches, schools, and a college, and create businesses; with little or no educational background upon which to draw, its founders with almost prophetie vision, laid a most enduring foundation for a building that was to be a sacred heritage to posterity in succeeding generations, seroing them with ever increasing usefulness and effectiveness; and erected an enduring monument to typify their struggles, aspirations and achievements. To their vision, consecration, and dedication of self to a great cause; and to their singleness of purpose and practical sense that prompted them to translate their dreams into objectioe reulity; we are today, their beneficiaries, deeply indebted for this priceless legacy.

At a church conference and get together held at Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church, July 14, 1938, a discussion arose on the early history of the church. As a result of the discussion, Rev. Thomas H. Stoner, Pastor, appointed a committee on Church History for the purpose of research and to secure facts concerning the early history of the church.

*The personnel of this committee was Mrs. Luana Riley, Mrs. Florence Louis Mileum, Mrs. Clara Anderson Allen, Mrs. Mary Blackburn Jones, and Mr. Albert R. Lee, Chairman. The members of this committee, with but one exception were citizens of this community, and had resided here for a number of years. They were able to call upon their own memories, and relate the traditions that had come down to them from their parents.

*The committee checked facts, interpreted and evaluated all data obtained, reached conclusions and agreements which they presented to constitute the history of Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church.

EARLY HISTORY

*Early church records before 1800 were not found, if kept, nor was the committee able to secure conference minutes of earlier years. This can be explained easily as Bethel AME Church is older than the Illinois Annual Conference. The Quarterly Conference Journal in 1891, stated the Church was 28 years old, which would place its origin in 1863.

*From diverse accounts given by early settlers, along with newspaper stories, excerpts from chronicled history of Champaign County, the church organization known as Bethel AME. Church came into being during the year 1863

*Lothrop's History of Champaign County, states that the first church was built in 1864, at a cost of \$600.00.

*In 1877, the property at the southeast corner of Park and Fourth Streets was purchased and the frame building at 405 E. Park Avenue was moved to 402 E. Park Avenue, making both building and ground the property of Bethel A.M.E. Church. During the ministry of Rev. Charles Holmes, 1880-1881, the first parsonage was built in the back of the church on Fourth Street.

*Records show that on June 6, 1892 an abstract for property was signed by the following trustees: Robert English, L.H. Walden, Clay Brown, John Moss and General Cass Lee.

*A Church meeting was held October 5, 1892 to incorporate the church and take action on building a new church and the following were named trustees to the new church: William Lee, L.H. Walden, Clay Brown, John Moss and General C. Lee.

*The corporate name of the Church was to be "The African Methodist Episcopal Church of Champaign, Illinois."

*Building the new church began in early
June 1892 and was completed in January
1893, at which time the church was
dedicated. A Corner Stone laying by
Lone Star Lodge No. 18, F & A.M.
featured the early stages of building.

*The new church was a brick building with beautiful stained glass windows. There was an auditorium, a lecture room; a choir room that was often called the Baraca Room because the Baraca Class, which has an enrollment of 100 at one time. Bethel was the first church in the Twin Cities to have a Baraca-Philathea affiliation with the National Baraca-Philathea Bible Study Group.

*The growth of the membership of the church has been gradual but steady. We have no figures of the membership from its beginning but it must have been small as the number of Negroes here was small. In 1888 the membership was sixty two (62.) The membership in October 1938 was approximately 270.

*On November 6, 1895 the church voted to finish the inside of the church. At this time the pews were installed, the altar rail installed, a new furnace and one hundred folding chairs for the lecture room. October 13, 1911, under the leadership of Rev. George W. Jones the following trustees were elected: Archie Penny, A.R. Lee, P.J. Carey, B.J. Woodruff, and George Pope. The church decided to make extensive repairs and a loan of \$1500.00 was acquired.

*August 19, 1919 under the leadership of Rev. R.H. Hackley and Trustees B.J. Woodruff, Clay Brown, R.J. Green, F.J. Jordan, Woodward Thomas, and Cecil Nicholson rebuilding of the parsonage was begun.

*In 1925, during the second pastorate of Rev. George W. Jones, Mrs. Sarah Watson a staunch member of Bethel passed away and bequeathed to the Trustees of Bethel A.M.E. Church the property of her late husband, Henry M. Watson, who also was a member of Bethel, their property at 1020 W. Main Street, Urbana. The will provided that the proceeds of the sale, after deducting burial expenses, should be given to the trustees for the purpose of liquidating the mortgage of the church. The will was carried out and Bethel was freed from its mortgage debt.

*Bethel had always had a special interest in the youth of the church and the community. The church obtained a recreation lot in the 100 block on Ells Avenue in Champaign and equipped it with volley ball, croquet, and tennis. The church also maintained a Reading Center located in the 100 block on East University Avenue in Champaign.

*Bethel has always been blessed musically. At various times the Sunday School boasted of excellent orchestras, and for years the church never had to leave the membership to find a pianist or an organist. Bethel has had a choir since 1893. In 1915 a new pipe organ was installed. The first choir robes were purchased in 1917 for \$4.00 each. In 1922 the choir was well organized with officers and various committees, working together to make Bethel A.M.E. Choir the finest in the Community and the district.

*In 1946, under the leadership of Rev. John W. Wright, the church agreed to purchase a Mollier pipe organ at the cost of \$3000.00. Within three months all money was collected and the organ was paid for in full.

*The "New Bethel" was fast becoming old and in need of extensive repairs. In 1948, the Helping Hand Club served meals in the basement for a Sunday School Convention and a Church Conference, their profit was \$190.00. Rev. Elsie Taborn, who was pastor at that time asked them how they would like to use the money. The Helping Hand Club wanted the money to be the starter for the building fund for a new church, Rev. Taborn appointed a committee to bring in a report on remodeling the church and a plan for financing a new building. Rev. Taborn's health began to fail and Bethel's leadership passed on to Rev. Andrew R. Parks The task of building a "New Bethei" fell to Rev. Parks, who actively engaged in the problems of the new building until his death in 1957. Before his death he appointed a planning committee to make plans for the new building. First the committee purchased the property adjacent to the church for the sum of \$6000.00. After Rev. Parks death. Rev Charles M. Curry assumed the leadership and continued the building program.

*On April 6, 1958 ground was broken and construction began in the fall of 1958 and was completed in 1959. We marched from "Old Bethel" into our present edifice on Easter, April 12, 1959.

*In 1969 under Rev. W.R. Stewart's leadership a church conference was held

and the church voted to buy the property at 405 E. Park Avenue. Plans were made to improve the property and was almost completely remodeled. This was done under the pastorate of Rev. H.H. Walker.

*On February 8, 1976 under the leadership of Rev. C. E. Carr, Bethel had a Mortgage Liquidation Service with Bishop H.T. Primm officiating. Rev. C.E. Carr appointed a planning committee to draw plans for a new parsonage to be constructed on the property at 405 E. Park Avenue. Construction began in August 1977.

*Under the capable leadership of Rev. A.C. Wright, Jr. construction of the parsonage was completed and furnished by December 23, 1977. Rev. Wright and his family took occupancy on December 23, 1977 and held an open house January 12, 1978. The parsonage was dedicated by Bishop H.N. Robinson, presiding Bishop of the Fourth Episcopal District on November 23, 1980.

*During the leadership of Rev. A.C. Wright the church underwent several improvements; central air conditioning, new roof, new furnishings in dining room and Sunday School, painting of interior and exterior of church.

*Under the pastorate of Rev. John Q. Owens, the parsonage was remodeled and the cross in the sanctuary was purchased.

*During the leadership of Rev. Alfred E. Johnson the pews were refinished and cushioned, kneeling pads were donated

for the altar, the kitchen remodeled, the lower level retiled, storm windows installed, and Pew Bibles and Hymnals purchased.

*Some of the projects undertaken in the "New Bethel" include the purchase of the Piano under the pastorate of Rev. Blaine Ramsey; the Hammond Organ was purchased under the pastorate of Rev. H.H. Walker.

*Donations have been made to the church. Many were made in loving memory of departed loved ones.

*Und:r the present pastorate of Rev. Charles B. Jackson, the organ was donated in memory of Brother Paul Lawrence Pope by his family. New Hymnals have been purchased. The Church has become computerized and the membership is growing.

*We can look back and be proud of our Bethe. Family and the progress made. Let us continue to move onward and upward, so that the future generations will be proud of us, follow in our foot steps and fully enjoy the Blessings and Glory of God our Heavenly Father.







My Connection to Bethel AME Church Carrie Luetta Pope Banks

My connection to Bethel AME Church can be found close to the beginning of the congregation. Bethel AME Church predates the Illinois Annual Conference, so the Conference has no record of Bethel before 1880. From the history of Champaign County, it was determined that Bethel was organized in 1863. Where does my connection begin?

My grandfather, General Cass Lee was born in Missouri in 1857. He came to Urbana, Illinois in 1864. My grandmother, Luetta Smith, the daughter of Jethro and Carolyn Smith was born in 1864 in Urbana, Illinois. They both belonged to Bethel AME Church and were subsequently married at Bethel. Rev. Charles Homes, who was the minister of Bethel AME Church performed the ceremony. My grandparents had two children, a daughter, Carrie Alice Lee, my mother and a son William Lee. Both of my grandparents were very active in the church. Records show in June 1892 and abstract was signed by the following Trustees: Robert Engeish, L.H. Walden, who was my mother's uncle, Clay Brown, John Moss, and my Grandfather General Cass Lee. Then on October 5, 1892 a meeting was held to incorporate the Church and to take action to build a new facility. The following were named Trustees to the new church: William Lee, my mother's brother, L.H. Walden, an uncle of my mother, Clay Brown. John Moss and General Cass Lee, my grandfather. My grandfather was also a Steward, Sunday School Superintendent, a charter member of the Baraca Class, and was with Lone Star Lodge #18 F & AM when they laid the Corner Stone of the new church. My grandmother, Luetta Smith Lee was also active in the various clubs of the church.

I also have a similar connection on my father's side. My grandfather, George W. Pope was born in Missouri in and came to Champaign County when he was a small boy. He lived in Sidney, Illinois for a while. It was there that he met his wife, my grandmother. Her name was Sarah Allen. They were married March 19, 1885. To this union, two children were born, Mary Katheryn Pope, my aunt and Cecil Pope, my father. The family moved to Champaign when my father was school age. They also became members of Bethel AME Church. At a church meeting held October 13, 1911, it was voted to empower Trustees to borrow approximately \$1,400.00 to make improvements to the building. Trustees elected were Archie Penney, Albert R. Lee, my uncle, P.J. Carvey, B.J. Woodruff, a cousin, and George W. Pope, my grandfather. Reverend George W. Jones was pastor. My grandfather, George W. Pope served on the Trustee Board for many years. He was also a Class Leader and a Steward. My grandmother Pope was also active in the various clubs of the church.


The Bethel AME Church Choir, in 1908 or 1909, accepted Earnest Harlan Scott as Director and Albert R. Lee as President. E. Harlan Scott was my mother's cousin and A.R. Lee was my mother's uncle. A.R. Lee played a major roll in the choir and the church as a whole. He was also very influential in the AME Connection. Both he and E. Harlan Scott held their positions until their deaths. When E. Harlan Scott died in 1922, my father, Cecil Pope became the Director. At that time, my aunt, Kathryn Pope Means was the organist.

When she resigned, my father became organist, Director and Minister of Music. Cecil Pope held this position until he became ill in the mid sixties. Under my father's direction and the presidency of A.R. Lee, Bethel's Senior Choir rose to great musical and organizational heights. The choir sang all types of music including hymns, spirituals, gospel songs, anthems, and cantatas. We sang not only at Bethel but in the surrounding towns and at many conferences.

My mother, Carrie Alice Lee Pope, was also in the music department. She not only sang in the choir, but she was one of the assistant directors. She was active in the Missionary, Sunday School, the Willing Workers, and the conference level Missionary Society. She and my father had six children. We all joined Bethel at an early age and worked in the church. My brother George L. Pope is a Trustee, a Sunday School Teacher and a former Steward, Director of the Lay Organization and has worked in different parts or capacities of the AME Connection. My brother Cecil A. Pope was in the choir at Bethel. My Brother Paul L. Pope was in the Gospel Choir (his heart.) He also served as a Steward and a Trustee. My Sisters Sarah Pope Potter and Esther Pope Scroggins were both in the choir. Esther also taught Sunday School.

I personally, have worked with the Missionary, Vacation Bible School, Sunday School, YPD and, of course, the choir. I met Nathaniel Banks and his family at Bethel, as they also attended this congregation. Nathaniel and I were married June 2, 1946. We had three wonderful children and they were brought up in Bethel AME Church.

As you can see, my connection to Bethel AME goes back a long way. Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church will always be special to me.
