- BRIEF HISTORY OF WOMEN'S DAY -

Women's Day at Salem Baptist Church was organized in 1943 by the late Mrs. Mildred Webb, Mrs. Webb was the wife of one of the Pastors of Salem, the late Rev. A. S. Webb. Mrs. Webb became aware of the Women's Day Celebration while attending a General Baptist Convention and brought the idea back to the Church. Salem readily accepted the idea and voted to adopt the program. The fourth Sunday in March was designated as the annual day and the first observance was March 28, 1943. This day was originally called Woman's Day (a day set aside for each individual woman) however, we now refer to it as Women's Day for the collective group of women.

Mrs. Webb served as General Chairperson for four years. The late Mrs. Annette Officers, State President of the Women's Auxiliary was the guest speaker for the first two Women's Day observances.

Salem has been blessed with having many Active Missionary Groups. The Missionary Society was divided into Circles under the Pastorate of Rev. W. H. Donaldson. Sister Clara Donaldson was named president of the General Missionary Department and all of the Circles were required to make their monthly reports to the General Mission.

The Missionary Groups of Salem were: The Senior Missionary Society; Circle #1; Circle #2; Circle #3; The Webb Circle; The Young Matrons; The Matrons; The Esther Circle; The James O. Wilson Circle; and The Mary Jane McKinley Circle.

The James O. Wilson Circle was named in memory of Deacon James O. Wilson, who served as Superintendent of the Sunday School. The James O. Wilson Circle was organized in 1986. The initial officers were: Sister Ella Knox, President; Sis. Rosalind Lewis, Secretary; Sis. Antonia Cole, Correspondent Secretary; Sis. Dorothy Goines, Treasurer; and Sis. Corrine McDonald, Leader.

The Mary Jane McKinley Circle was organized in 1986 in memory of Mother Mary Jane McKinley. Sister Juanita January was the first President. The Mary Jane McKinley Circle send cards to the shutins; flowers to bereaved members and food or flower baskets to seniors. They give warm foot wear or throws to the members of Salem who are now in nursing homes and have donated to toiletries to "A Women's Shelter." This tradition has continued by the McKinley Ministry especially at Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Under the pastorate of Rev. Claude E. Shelby, Sr., the mission circles are now called Mission Ministries and the Mary Jane McKinley ministry is still very active. The Officers of the Mary Jane McKinley Ministry are: Dorothy Carter, President; Pearleana Stevens, Vice President; Betty Hassell, Secretary; Patricia Adair, Treasurer; Montrula Shelby, Devotional Leader; Pamela Wilson, and Jean Rowan-Kennedy, Sick Committee Chairpersons..

Shelby, Sr., she moved to Lovejoy, Illinois where she completed High School and also attended Belleville Area College.

The Church has always played a major role in her life. Her church life began at Ward Chapel A.M.E. Church of Junction City, Kansas. She later united with the Southern Tabernacle Baptist Church of Lovejoy, Illinois which was her husband's home church. There she was a Sunday School worker and a member of the Youth Choir.

After her husband accepted the call to the gospel ministry, she could always be found working right by his side and has continued her faithfulness even until this day. She and Pastor Shelby are the parents of six children.

As first lady of Salem Baptist Church, Mrs. Shelby has served as the Superintendent of Sunday School; assistant youth director; a member of the adult choir; and the devotional leader for the Missionary Society. She has served as President of the Woodriver District Association Women's Auxiliary; and is still serving as the devotional leader for the Mary Jane McKinley Ministry of Salem Baptist Church.

In the community she served ten years as co-chairlady with the American Cancer Society Annual Crusades and is a Past President of the Ministers' Wives' Alliance of Champaign-Urbana area.

An accomplished, classically trained vocalist, Erika sang her first solo at Salem Baptist Church as a member of the Sunshine Choir.

Erika Harold spent her year as Miss America 2003 promoting her platform "Preventing Youth Violence and Bullying: 'Respect Yourself, Protect Yourself.'" Using her experiences as a victim of harassment during the ninth grade as a catalyst, Erika issued a national call for action, urging every segment of society to take a proactive approach in the eradication of these detrimental behaviors. 

PREFACE

(RSV)"

HISTORY OF THE MEMBERSHIP AND OUTREACH MINISTRY

Family and Friends Day celebrations are an integral part and a major achievement of the Membership and Outreach Ministry. The Ministry was founded in February 1993 when Dr. Claude E. Shelby, Sr., Pastor of Salem Baptist Church, requested Deacon William S. Hoff, Jr. to go out and recruit prayerful members of the church and organize the Ministry. The Pastor's vision of the Ministry describes its mission and purpose as follows:

My greatest motivation behind the Membership and Outreach Ministry of Salem Baptist Church is the mandate given by Christ based on the "Great Commission" found in Matthew 28:19-20. The mission statement is "To develop ways to reach the unsaved and unchurched, encouraging them to accept Christ as their personal Savior and uniting with His church. To reach out to those members who have withdrawn from the fellowship, encouraging their return and participation. To encourage membership participation in the ministries of the church by developing and using their individual talents. Promote active and loving fellowship among our members."

Just before the "commission" Jesus assured them of his power. "All power is given me in heaven and upon earth." He then sent them out to make all the world His disciples. Further, Jesus said, "Go out into the highways and hedges, and compel them to come in, that my house may be filled." Since we recently doubled the size of our sanctuary, we at Salem must be about the business of reaching out to the community. This task is to be carried out by every member of the church. It is next to impossible to marshal the forces of the entire congregation to carry out this mandate. Therefore, we saw a need to organize this ministry of dedicated individuals to take the lead with the view of inspiring others to, also, carry out this very vital work of the church.

We have the admonition of the Bible in Hebrews 10:25 which says, "Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another..." Thus, our Membership and Outreach Ministry attempts to keep in touch with the entire membership, giving special attention to those who have become slothful.

Our church covenant states that we are to watch over one another in brotherly love; to remember each other in prayer; and to aid each other in sickness and distress...

Our efforts in this ministry help us promote these vital responsibilities of the church of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, "that His kingdom may come and His will be done in earth as it is done in heaven."

Original membership of the Committee:

Deacon William S. Hoff, Jr., Chairman Sister Carolyn Dixon, Vice Chairman Sister McClenda Pollard Sister Melissa Bolden Sister Viola Bradley Chatmon Sister Betty J. Hassell, Secretary Sister Nettie Scott, Assistant Secretary Sister Edie Purdy Sister Veola Tinsley

It is important to note that the Ministry was first entitled as: The Membership Committee and later in 1994 changed to the Membership and Outreach Ministry. By April 10, 1993, a proposal was presented to the Committee by the Chairman, Deacon William S. Hoff, Jr., and it was approved. The objectives of the proposal were the following:

- 1) To plan phone calls visitations to homes of members of the church and assure them that the church is able to meet their spiritual needs and desires their continued fellowship. To do this, the church would ask 30 or more members to spiritually serve as group leaders. Each leader would then be responsible for approximately ten (10) members.
- 2) All members of the church are eligible to become group leaders.
- 3) Group leaders will receive orientation about their duties and responsibilities.
- 4) A membership phone/visitation contact report form will be used by the Group Leaders.
- 5) Initially the Membership Committee will hold bi-weekly meetings to review the progress of the program.
- 6) Group Leaders will be responsible for turning in reports to Deacon Hoff.
- 7) During the worship service, members in the pews will be required to list the names of any familiar person who has been absent for more than one Sunday. A form will be provided for this purpose and should be torn off and placed in the offering tray.
- 8) Each auxiliary is asked to check on its membership and phone those who have been absent from several meetings.
- 9) Deacon Hoff will report monthly to the Official Board and/or the Church Monthly Business meetings.

The original spiritual group leaders were: Melissa Bolden, McClenda Pollard Bell(deceased), Bernice Franklin(deceased), Mother Lee Anna Goines (deceased), and, Deacon R. E. Goines, (deceased) Pamela Wilson and Brenda Wiggins.

These group leaders were faithful and diligent in their task. During the week, they called members of the church who had been away from the church for a long time and encourage them to return. They also observed the familiar members in the pews who were absent from church during that church service and recorded their names and later in the week called those individuals. In addition, these dedicated leaders submitted monthly reports to the Ministry and Deacon Hoff in turn apprized the

Official Board of the church.
