PREFACE

The Membership and Outreach Ministry of Salem Baptist Church has grown increasingly large. Not only does the ministry work directly with the church, but it also sponsors various spiritual and outreach programs and activities annually. For example, the family and friends day celebrations are an integral part as well as a major event of the ministry.

The ministry was founded in February 1993 when Dr. Claude E. Shelby, Sr., Pastor, of Salem Baptist Church, requested Deacon William S. Hoff, Jr., to go out and recruit prayer members of the church and organize a committee which was called at that time "The Membership Committee". In 1994, the name was changed to "Membership and Outreach Ministry". Our Pastor's vision of the ministry described its mission and purpose as follows: "My greatest motivation behind the Membership and Outreach Ministry of Salem Baptist Church is the mandate declared by Jesus Christ in the 'Great Commission' found in Matthew 28:19-20. The passage reads: 'Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with Thee always, to the close of the age'. (RSV)"

Jesus also assured his disciples that "All authority in heaven and earth has been given to me". Therefore, we as Christians and also disciples must go out into the highways and hedges and compel them to come in so that His house may be filled.

Christ also admonishes believers not to forsake to assemble themselves together but exhort one another; our church covenant stresses that we should watch and pray over one another in brotherly love, remember each other in prayer and aid each other in sickness and distress. As we labor in kingdom building we become more inspired in our efforts to spiritually promote and sponsor vital programs of the church. For instance, we encourage training and discipleship with evangelistic workshops, and fulfill our mission through specific means by door to door ministry in the community, seeking and engaging those who desire to restore membership and/or those who desire to join the church, collective fellowship with family and friends by annually celebrating family and friends day and seeking to build up the membership by participating in the University of Illinois Annual Quad Day Activities on Campus, seeking members by compiling a list of new students and telephone numbers.

As Chairman of the Ministry, on behalf of our officers and members, we are grateful to our prayer members past and even now for the continued support and cooperation. God bless you all.

HISTORY OF THE MEMBERSHIP AND OUTREACH MINISTRY

Family and Friends Day celebrations are an integral part and a major achievement of the Membership and Outreach Ministry. The Ministry was founded in February 1993 when Dr. Claude E. Shelby, Sr., Pastor of Salem Baptist Church, requested Deacon William S. Hoff, Jr. to go out and recruit prayerful members of the church and organize the Ministry. The Pastor's vision of the Ministry describes its mission and purpose as follows:

My greatest motivation behind the Membership and Outreach Ministry of Salem Baptist Church is the mandate given by Christ based on the "Great Commission" found in Matthew 28:19-20. The mission statement is "To develop ways to reach the unsaved and un-churched, encouraging them to accept Christ as their personal Savior and uniting with His church. To reach out to those members who have withdrawn from the fellowship, encouraging their return and participation. To encourage membership participation in the ministries of the church by developing and using their individual talents. Promote active and loving fellowship among our members."

Just before the "commission" Jesus assured them of his power. "All power is given me in heaven and upon earth." He then sent them out to make all the world His disciples. Further, Jesus said, "Go out into the highways and hedges, and compel them to come in, that my house may be filled." Since we recently doubled the size of our sanctuary, we at Salem must be about the business of reaching out to the community. This task is to be carried out by every member of the church. It is next to impossible to marshal the forces of the entire congregation to carry out this mandate. Therefore, we saw a need to organize this ministry of dedicated individuals to take the lead with the view of inspiring others to, also, carry out this very vital work of the church.

We have the admonition of the Bible in Hebrews 10:25 which says, "Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another..."
Thus, our Membership and Outreach Ministry attempts to keep in touch with the entire membership, giving special attention to those who have become slothful.

Our church covenant states that we are to watch over one another in brotherly love; to remember each other in prayer; and to aid each other in sickness and distress...

Our efforts in this ministry help us promote these vital responsibilities of the church of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, "that His kingdom may come and His will be done in earth as it is done in heaven."

Since the establishment of the Ministry in 1993, the church is now blessed to celebrate its Fourteenth Family and Friends Day. The first Celebration was in August 1994; the second on August 27, 1995, the third on April 21, 1996, the fourth on April 20, 1997, the fifth on April 19. 1998, the sixth on April 18, 1999, the seventh on April 30, 2000 and the eighth on April 22, 2001. Benjamin Myers; Sis. Carol Lewis and Joe Lewis. Sisters Betty Hassell and Evelyn Hickman served as Chairpersons for the 13th year, the 14th year the chairpersons were Bro. Robert Spencer and Sis. Carol Lewis. Sisters Carol Lewis and Christine Goines served as Chairpersons for our 15th year. This year marks our 16th year celebration, Christine Goines and Douglas Williams serve as chair and co chairperson for the event. All these chairpersons have made significant contributions to the development of the Ministry.

On April 6, 1996, the Ministry's first workshop was conducted by Minister Reginald Buckley. It was designed to teach members the significance and meaning of witnessing to a dying world. To help those who do not know God; that they will seek God; that they will recognize the lost world; and that we would pray for those who are lost. At the end of these spiritual workshops the Ministry experienced its first "Door to Door" Ministry, a dream that became a reality on Saturday, April 13, 1996. A second Evangelistic Workshop was held in May, 2002, conducted by Min. Norman Hale. The third Evangelism Workshop was held in May, 2003 conducted by Min. Ted Hedrington of the Church of the Living God, under the leadership of Pastor Shelby. The Fourth Evangelist Workshop and a door-to-door ministry was held in 2005 conducted by Rev. Lorenzo Bolden.

It is important to note that the Ministry was first entitled as: The Membership Committee and later in 1994 changed to the Membership and Outreach Ministry. By April 10, 1993, a proposal was presented to the Committee by the Chairman, Deacon William S. Hoff, Jr., and it was approved. The objectives of the proposal were the following:

- 1) To plan phone calls visitations to homes of members of the church and assure them that the church is able to meet their spiritual needs and desires their continued fellowship. To do this, the church would ask 30 or more members to spiritually serve as group leaders. Each leader would then be responsible for approximately ten (10) members.
- 2) All members of the church are eligible to become group leaders.
- 3) Group leaders will receive orientation about their duties and responsibilities.
- 4) A membership phone/visitation contact report form will be used by the Group Leaders.
- 5) Initially the Membership Committee will hold bi-weekly meetings to review the progress of the program.
- 6) Group Leaders will be responsible for turning in reports to Deacon Hoff.
- 7) During the worship service, members in the pews will be required to list the names of any familiar person who has been absent for more than one Sunday. A form will be provided for this purpose and should be torn off and placed in the offering tray.
- 8) Each auxiliary is asked to check on its membership and phone those who have been absent from several meetings.
- 9) Deacon Hoff will report monthly to the Official Board and/or the Church Monthly Business meetings.

The original spiritual group leaders were: Melissa Bolden, McClenda Pollard Bell(deceased), Bernice Franklin(deceased), Mother Lee Anna Goines (deceased), and, Deacon R. E. Goines, Pamela Wilson and Brenda Wiggins.

These group leaders were faithful and diligent in their task. During the week, they called members of the church who had been away from the church for a long time and encourage them to return. They also observed the familiar members in the pews who were absent from church during that church service and recorded their names and later in the week called those individuals. In addition, these dedicated leaders submitted monthly reports to the Ministry and Deacon Hoff in turn apprised the Official Board of the church.
