Stars of the First Magnitude



Losing books, forgetting locker combinations, and wandering through the halls in bewilderment were all signs of the freshmen as they became acquainted with U.H.S.






Four performances of the 1958 Terrapin Show were held, each ending in a Tiger finale and the traditional "T" for Terrapin.



Girls' Athletic Association



Cross-Country

The Urbana Cross-Country team ended a very successful season by placing fourth in the State. In the State competition, the Harriers were paced by Harold Shaw, who took 33rd place, and Captain Jim Vitton, who placed 34th. In District competition the team tied Cumberland for the championship. In that meet, Urbana's first five all ranked in the top ten places: Harold Shaw, fourth; Dick Gillis, seventh; Jim Vitton, eighth; George Thornes, ninth; and Wayne Shaw, tenth. In the Big Twelve meet held at the Champaign Country Club, the Tigers took the championship laurels with a total of 42 points. Individually, the same five placed in the top twelve.

The Harriers ended the season with an impressive 11-1 record for dual meets. They had double wins over Danville, Champaign, and Mattoon, their only defeat being to a powerful Cumberland five by a margin of just one point. Although the first five members of the team have graduated, the outlook for future years is bright. Three lettermen will be returning next fall: sophomore Joe Vitton and freshmen Gil Wilson and John Shaw.
