## Varsity Football

During the 1956 season, there were times when the Tigers played very good football. However, the team was on again, off again during the season. They finished with a 500% record of 4 wins, 4 losses, and 1 tie. After losing 10 of his first 11 starters, Coach Warren Smith had a tremendous rebuilding job with this year's team. He was ably assisted by Oscar Adams, John Bruckbauer, Harry Ryan, and Herb Sleiger. Larry Mackey and John Maddy were the capable co-captains of the 1956 Tigers.

The opener with Rantoul, on September 14, started the season off right. In this game Mackey led the Tiger offense, carrying for more yards than any other player. A long pass from Ron Moore at midfield to Chuck Beard near the goal line was the spectacular play of the game. Although Beard was caught, it led to Urbana's second TD. Even though the Tigers outgained Rantoul in the second half, much fumbling kept Urbana from scoring. Urbana outrushed the Eagles almost 5-1. Rantoul netted only 29 yards by rushing in the entire game. In the next game Urbana fought off Georgetown drives during the second half to emerge victorious in that contest. Both teams scored all of their points in the first half.

A veteran Danville team handed the Tigers their first defeat. Many times it seemed that Urbana was moving toward pay dirt, but a fumble or costly penalty stopped them. In the homecoming game, Urbana was outscored by Mattoon as a crowd of 4,000 enthusiastic fans watched. When the statistics were totaled, Urbana led in both passing and rushing in this contest. Bounding back in the Schlarman game, Urbana won with team effort. Coach Smith used a different starting lineup in this contest, and Schlarman's only score came late in the last quarter. The loss of Co-Captain Larry Mackey for four ball games, because of an injury, was a definite handicap to the ball team.

The presentation of a blanket to Coach Smith by the varsity players showed how much they enjoyed the season. Steve Thomas and Ted Lowry were chosen as co-captains for next year. Thomas was also honored by being selected as the most valuable player. Honored as the outstanding lineman was Jim Russell, who received the Dick Pittman award.

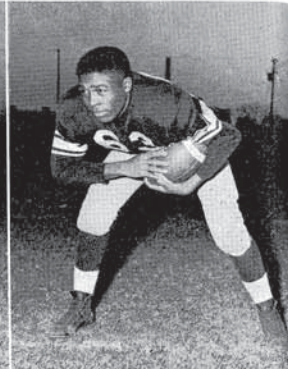

Steve Thomas was chosen by the sports writers and school officials as the most valuable player for the 1956 season. The award was presented at the annual Elks banquet for the football team.

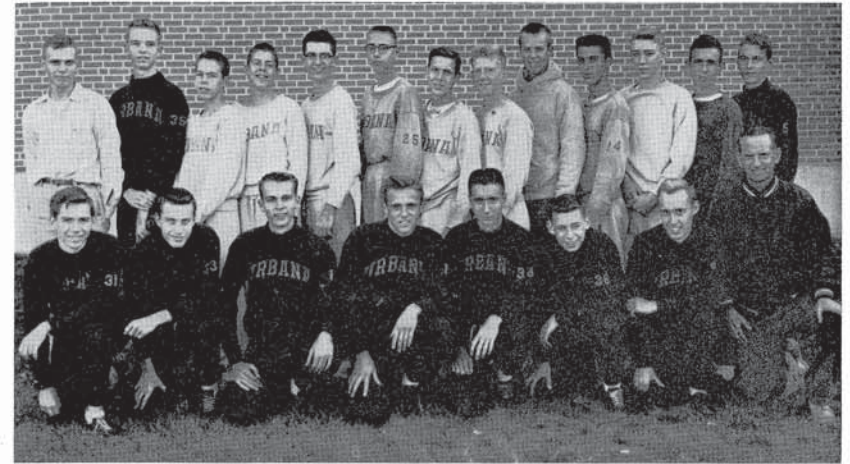


Jim Russell, senior, was named the 1956 winner of the Pittman Award. This trophy for the outstanding lineman of the year was presented at the fall sports awards assembly.

The Harriers, coached by Athletic Director Gene Armer, started by losing to Mattoon by one point, 28-27. High points in the season were wins over the powerful Cumberland, Mattoon, and Champaign clubs.

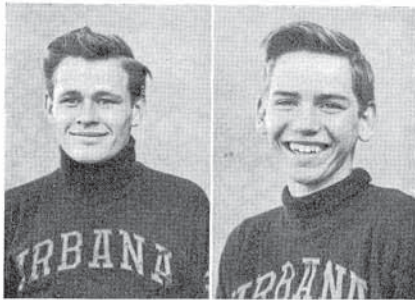
The team made a fine showing in the Big Twelve conference meet, placing second. They were led by senior Bob Johnson, who placed fifth, and senior Dick Luker, who placed ninth.

Urbana hosted both the District and State Championships. Urbana, though favored, lost out to Cumberland and Champaign in the District. They had beaten both schools during the regular season. Only Jim Vitton qualified to run in the State meet held the following Saturday.

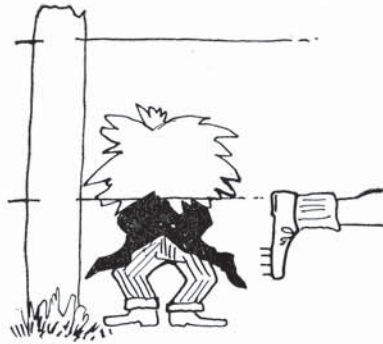
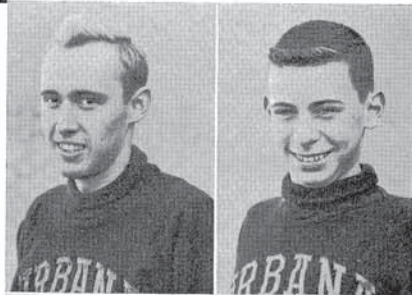

## Basketball

Under the capable guidance of Coach Jack Bruckbauer, the Tigers finished the 1956-57 season with a record of four wins and twenty losses. In many ways this can be called a successful season because, during the latter part of the cage season, the team made noteworthy improvement with many underclassmen drawing praise. After losing the season opener with Rantoul, the cagers defeated Hoopeston, 50-37. Following several defeats, the Tigers conquered the Springfield club, 57-47. Then the Tigers lost several more games. However, the tallies were close in many of these contests. In the last game of the regular season, with Danville, Urbana was the victor, 55-54. In the regional tourney, Urbana walloped a well-rated Bement club, 69-37. The season ended when the Tigers were defeated by cross-town rival Champaign.

Coach Bruckbauer loses only two lettermen by graduation, Captain Don Visur and Paul Davis. Ten returning regulars make the 1957-58 basketball picture very bright.

Urbana's wrestling team with six returning lettermen, coached by Oscar Adams, had a very successful regular season with twelve wins and only one loss. The lone defeat was at the hands of a strong Danville team. Bill Myers was undefeated during the season. Captain Tony Williams had only one draw on his otherwise perfect record. The team took third in the Big 12 Meet as they did last year. The three individual champions from Urbana were Jim Roberts, 103; Tony Williams, 112; and Bill Myers, 133. Urbana also placed third in the sectional held at Champaign. The Tigers' Myers won at 133, while four others placed second. They were Jim Roberts, 103; Tom Hart, 127; Randy Freeman, 154; and Jim Russell, 175. These five boys entered the state meet at the University of Illinois. Roberts took fourth at 103 pounds.

Team members chose Jim Russell as the most improved wrestler and Jim Roberts as the most valuable. Ted Lowry was chosen captain for 1957-58.

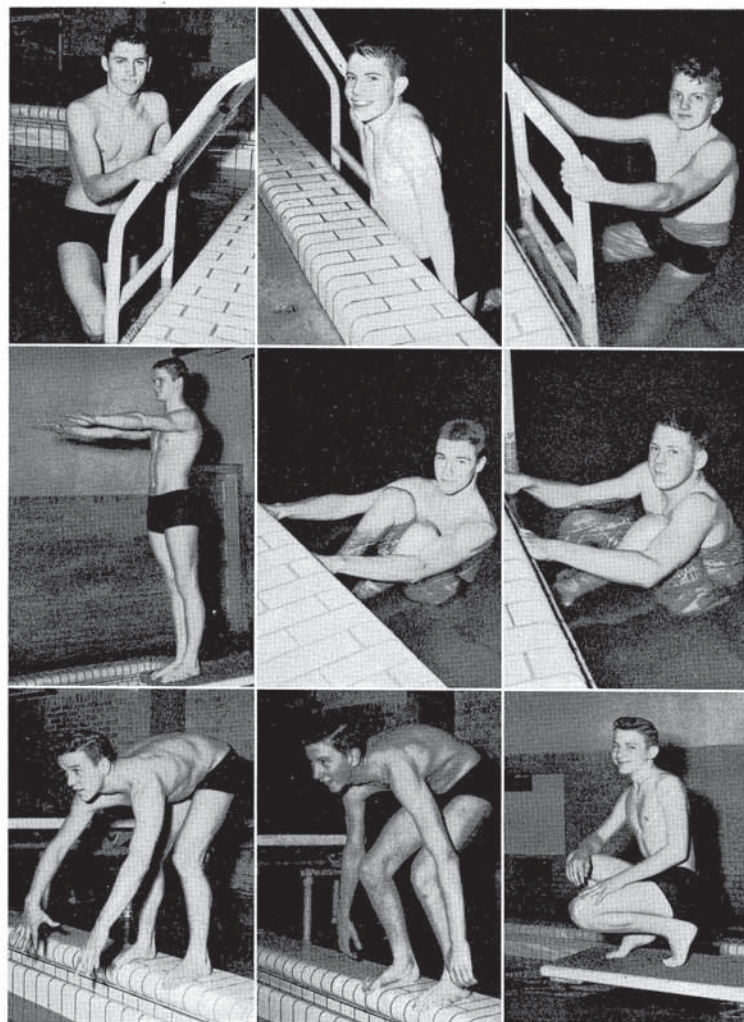
## Swimming

The UHS swimming team, coached by Dick Thompson and captained by Chris Moyer, finished the 1956-57 season with two wins and seven losses. With only five returning lettermen, there were many new members on the squad. Early in the season, the squad was hampered because the pool was being repaired. After losing the first two meets of the season, the swimmers trounced Onarga, 70-7. In this meet the Tigers won in all the events. As the season progressed the tankmen showed considerable improvement. The team turned in their best performance of the year against Champaign on February 12. Although UHS lost, 31-45, the outcome was not determined until the last event, the free style relay. Even though the Champaign tankmen defeated all Big 12 teams, they met their strongest competition in Urbana. In the Big 12 meet on February 10, Urbana finished fifth. In this top-notch competition, Joe Kuypers, a consistent winner for UHS, placed second in fancy diving.

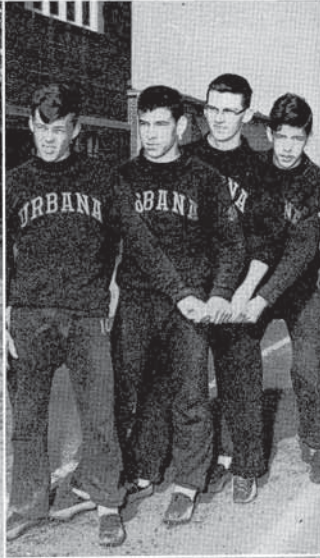

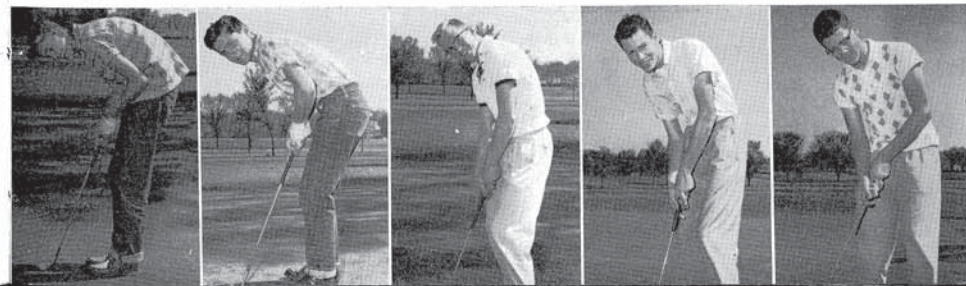

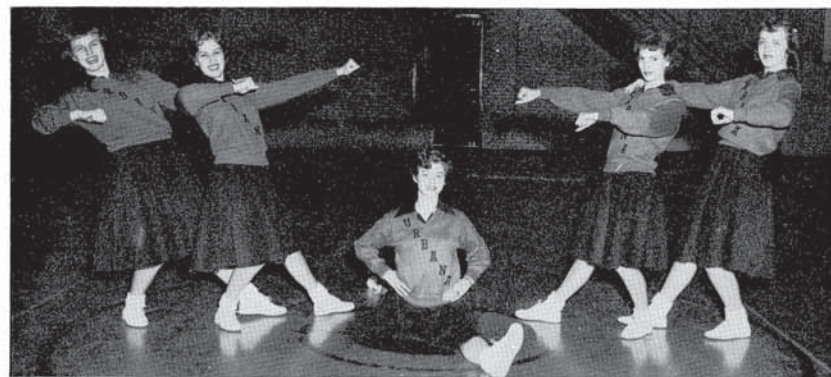
### OUTSTANDING SENIOR ATHLETE

The Outstanding Senior Athlete Award is presented each year to the winning senior at an all-sports banquet of the Association of Commerce, sponsors of the trophy.

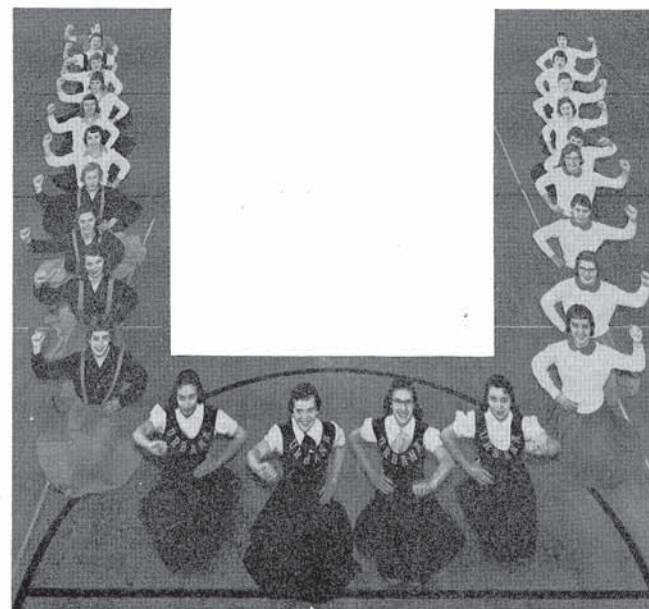

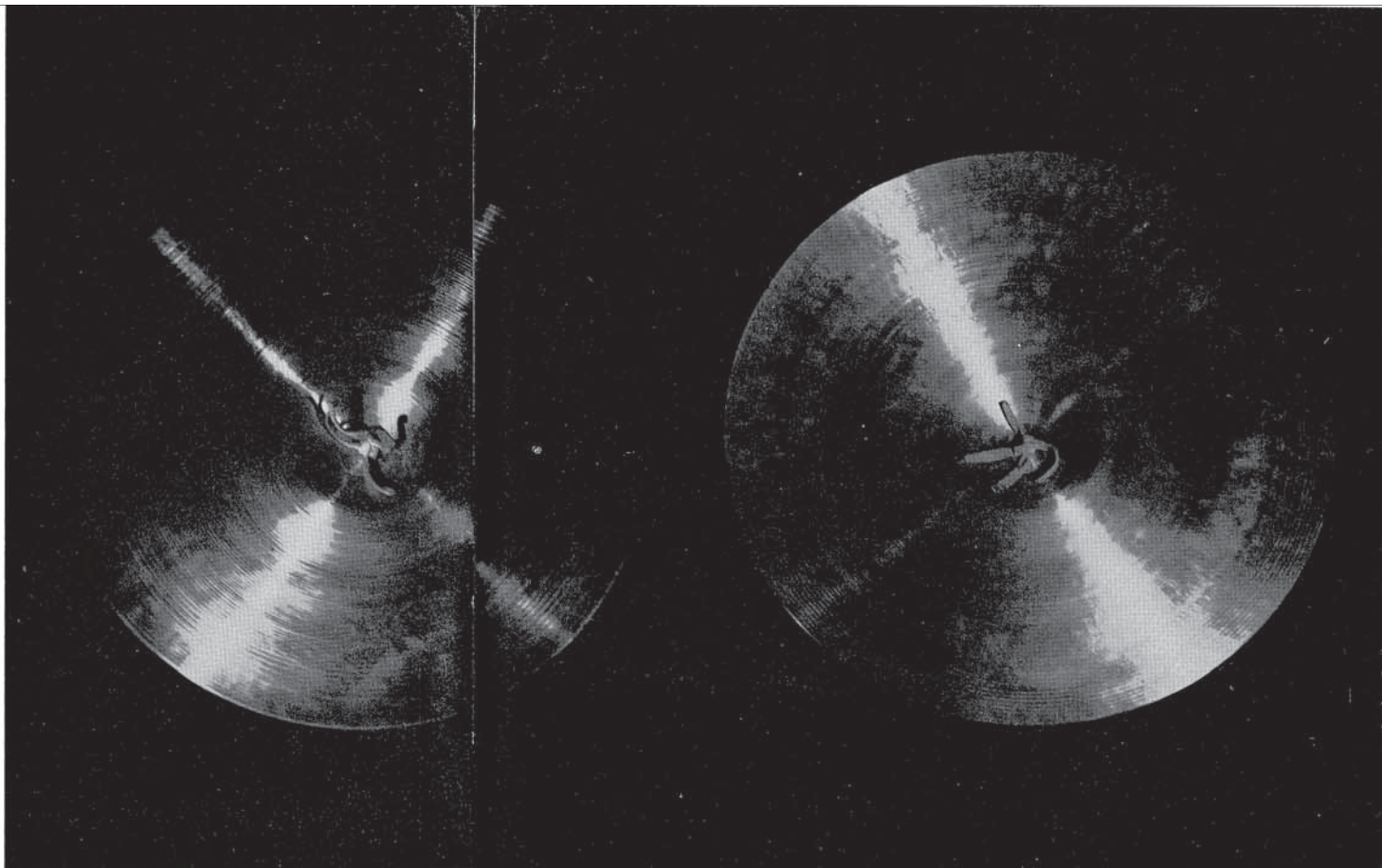

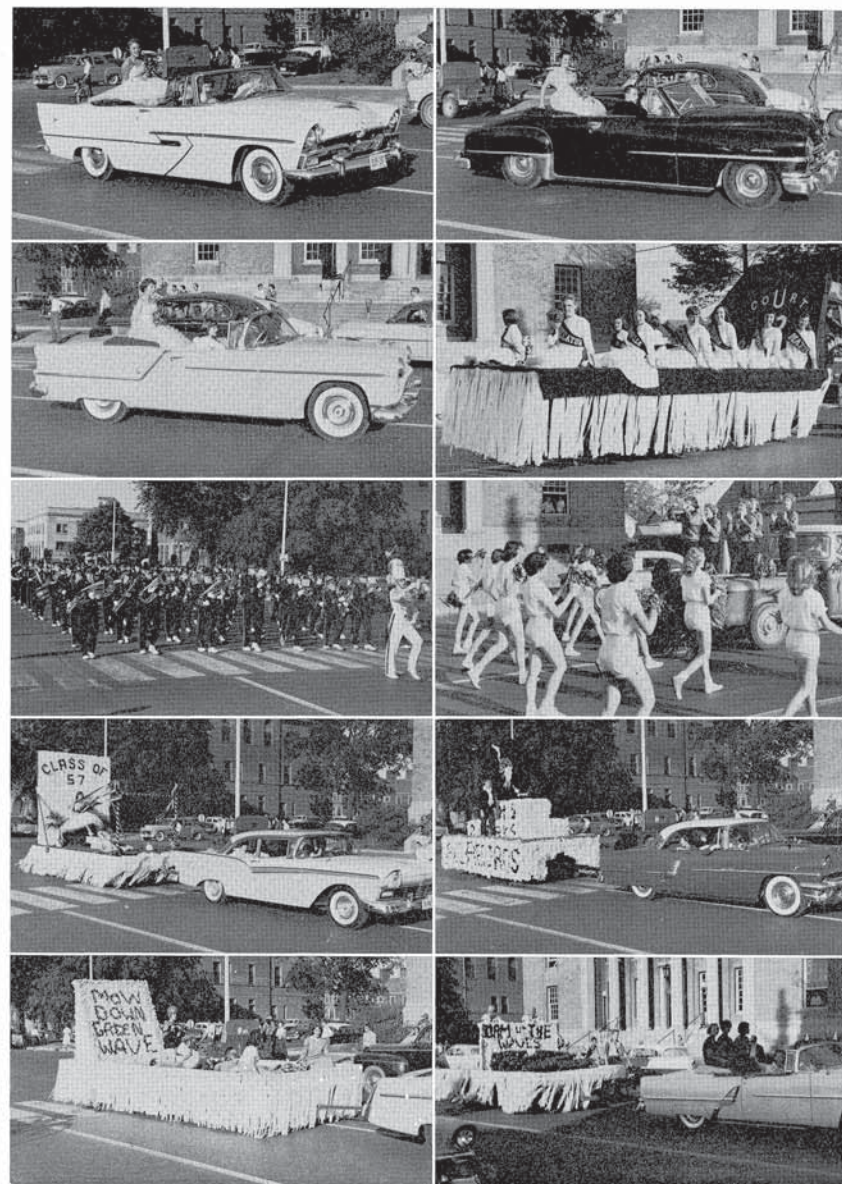


Miss Martha Mock, Homecoming Queen

The co-chairmen of this year's parade were Bette Freeman, Virginia Trotter, Janice Dilley, and Toby Wiley.





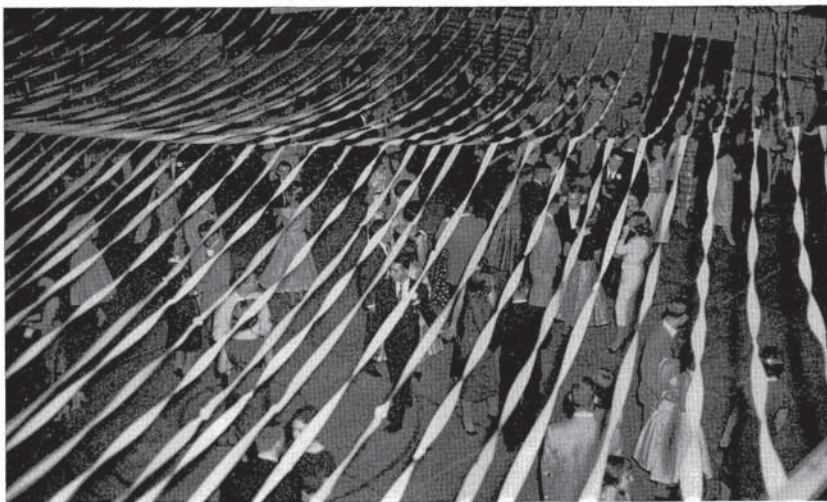

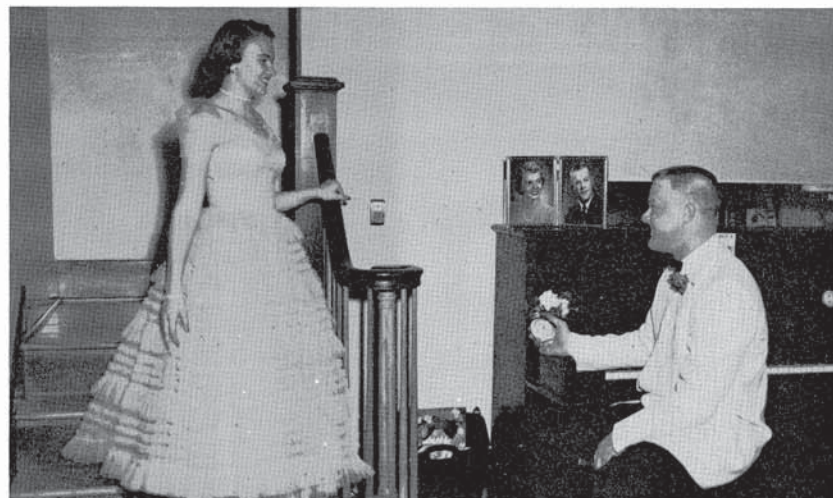
