## 1st Class Musicians Seniors

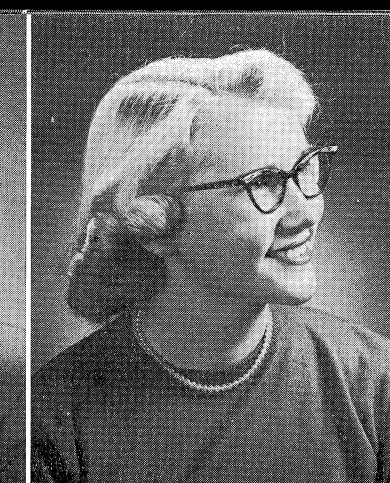

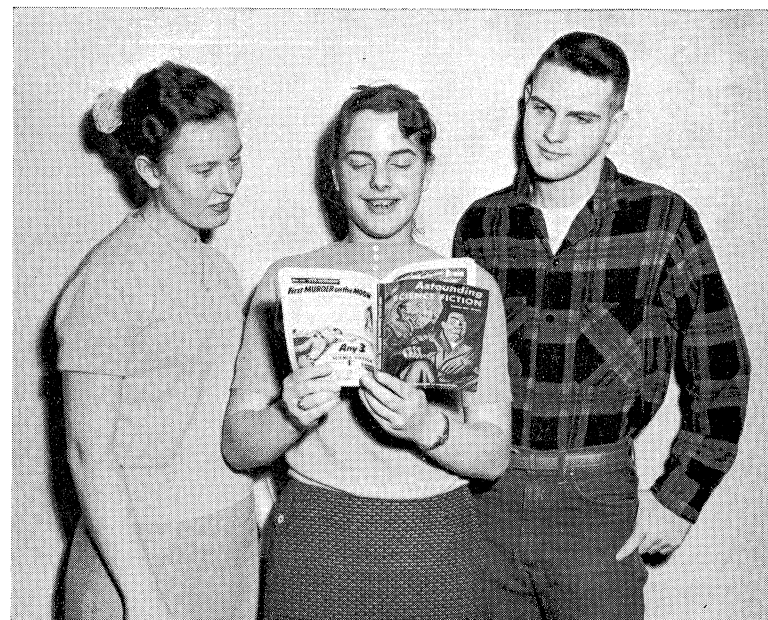




# Science Fiction Club

Diversified Occupations is cooperative part-time vocational training. The D.O. co-ordinator interviews and counsels students regarding the results of preference and aptitude tests. Then placement is made with a carefully selected co-operator in industry who trains the student on the job for a minimum of three hours per day. The student also receives related instruction in classroom work for one hour each day. This allows the student-learner to receive training for a skilled trade before leaving high school. He also receives a beginner's wage when he starts his training, and upon completion of training, receives his regular graduation diploma from high school.

Even though the Tigers outgained Rantoul in the second half, much fumbling kept Urbana from scoring. Urbana outrushed the Eagles almost 5-1. Rantoul netted only 29 yards by rushing in the entire game. In the next game Urbana fought off Georgetown drives during the second half to emerge victorious in that contest. Both teams scored all of their points in the first half.

The loss of Co-Captain Larry Mackey for four ball games, because of an injury, was a definite handicap to the ball team.

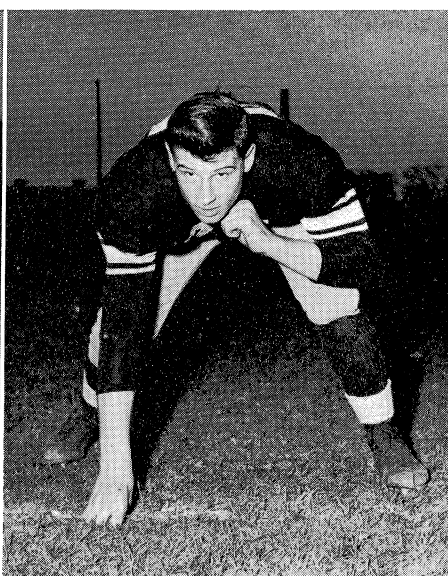

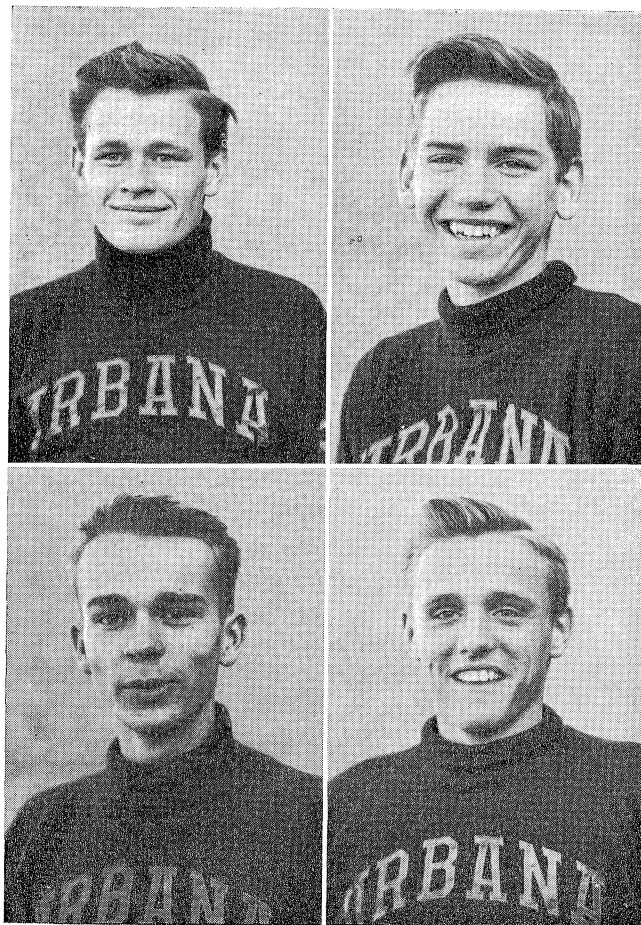

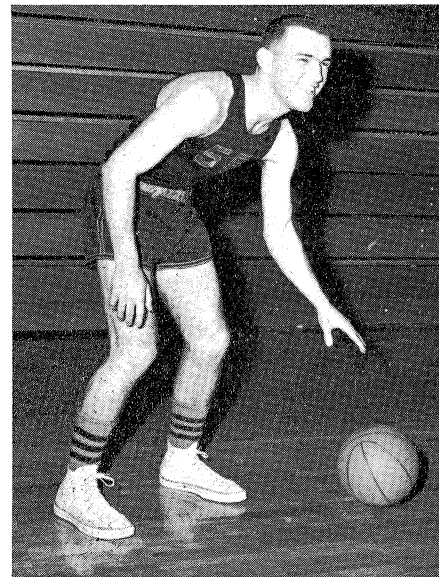
## Basketball

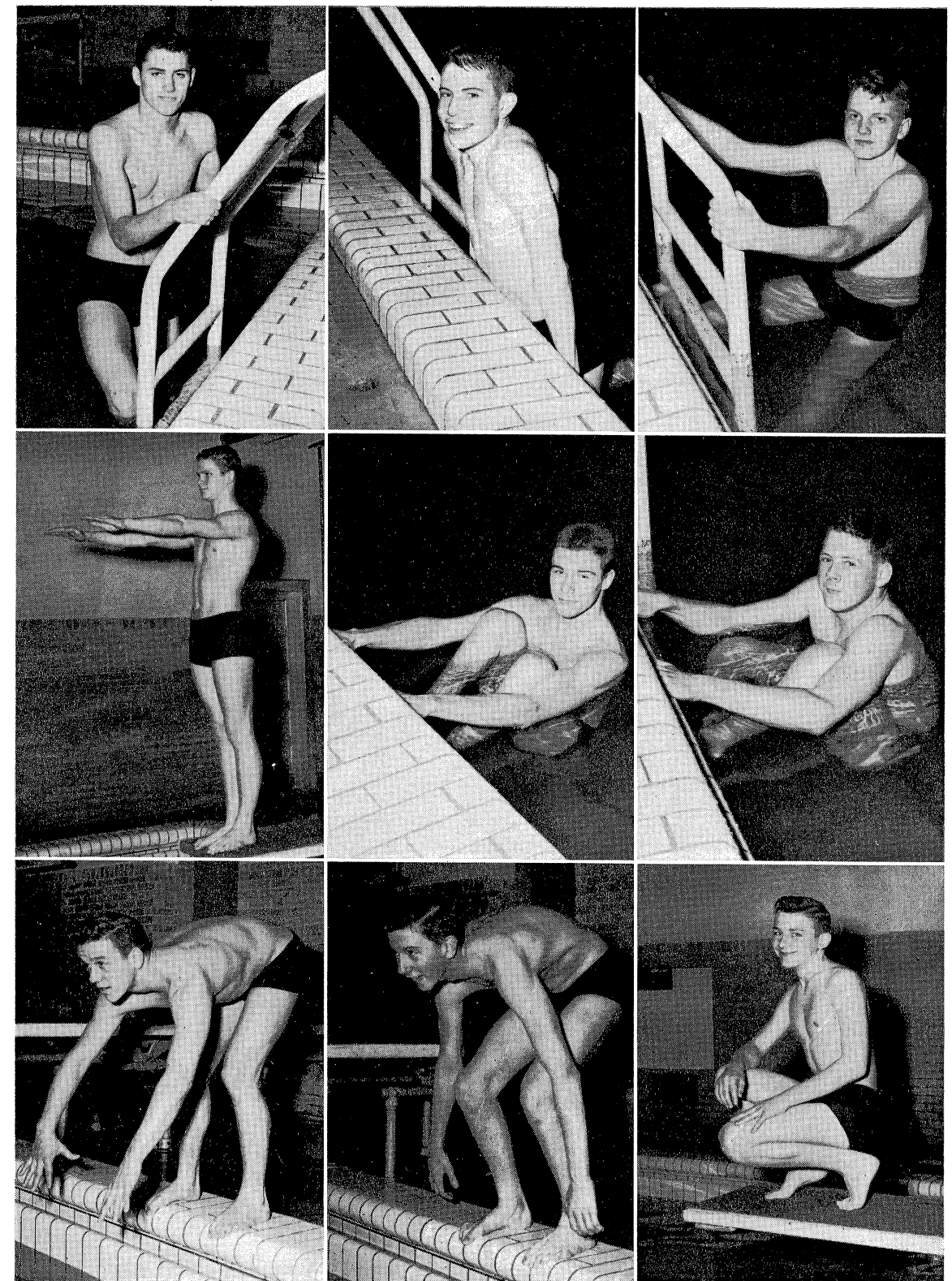
## Swimming

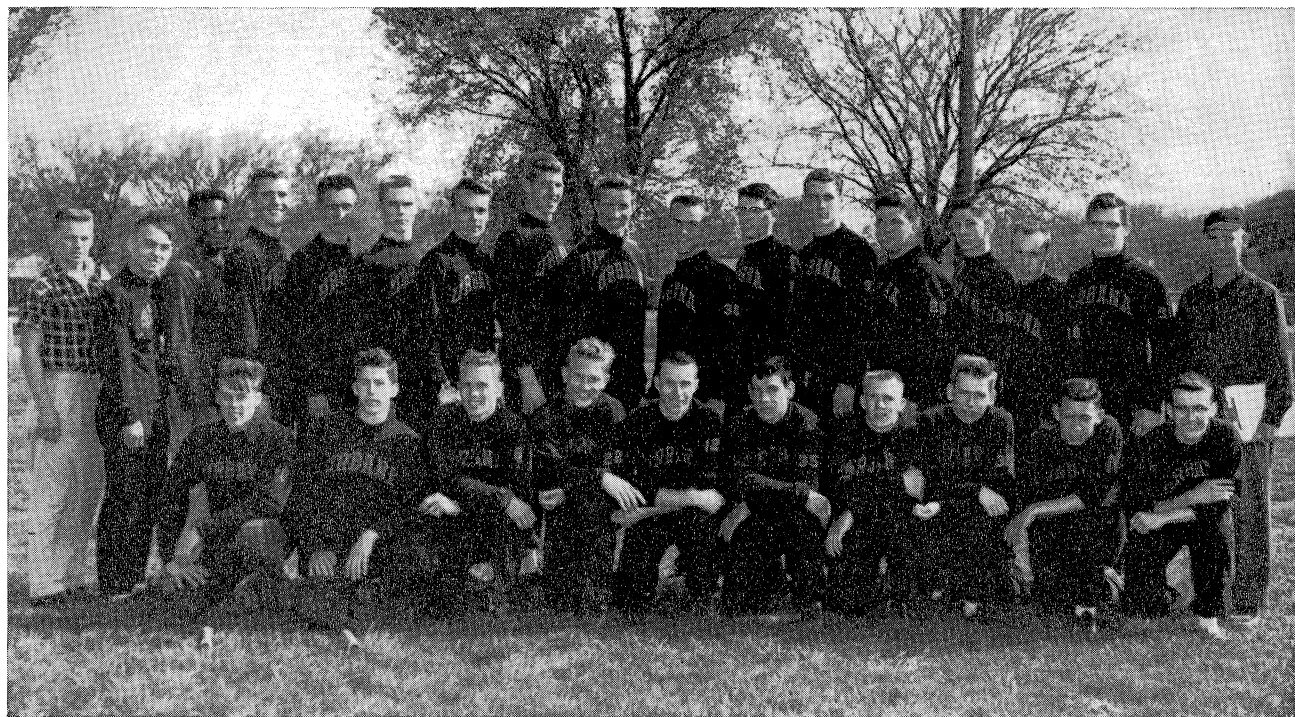

## Track

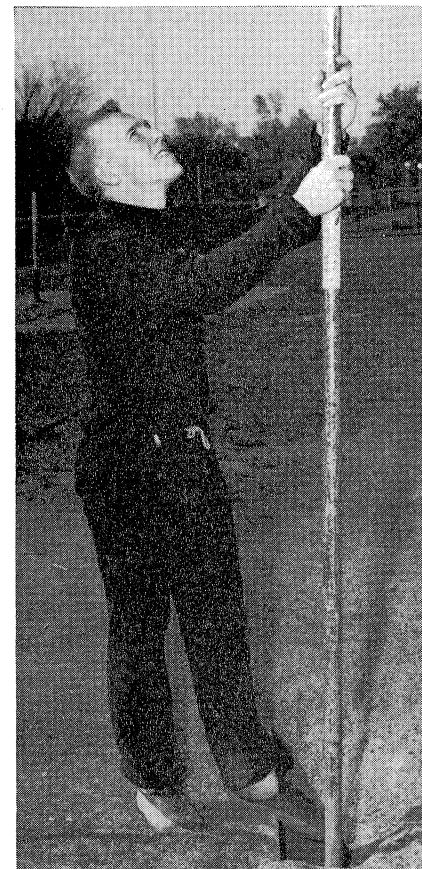

The co-chairmen of this year's parade were Bette Freeman, Virginia Trotter, Janice Dilley, and Toby Wiley.

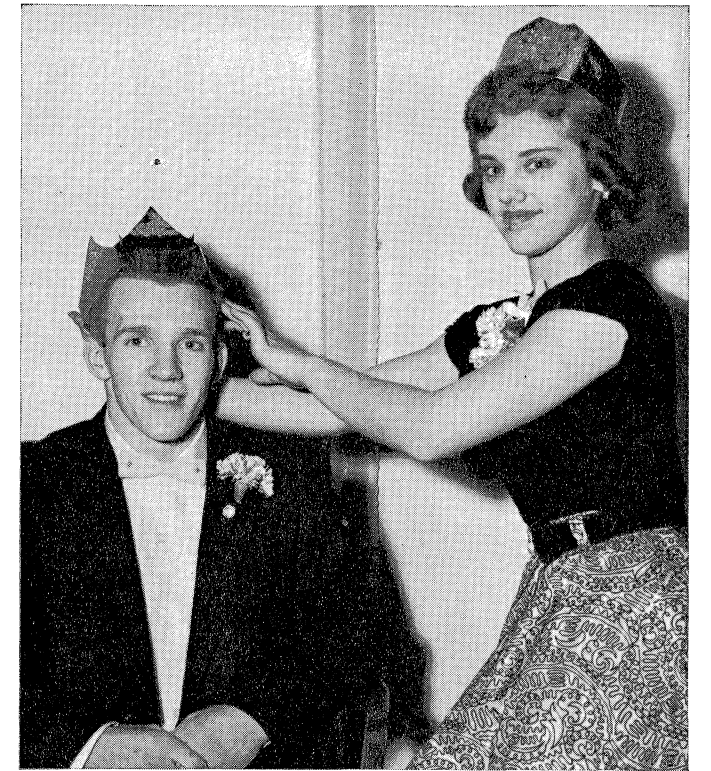




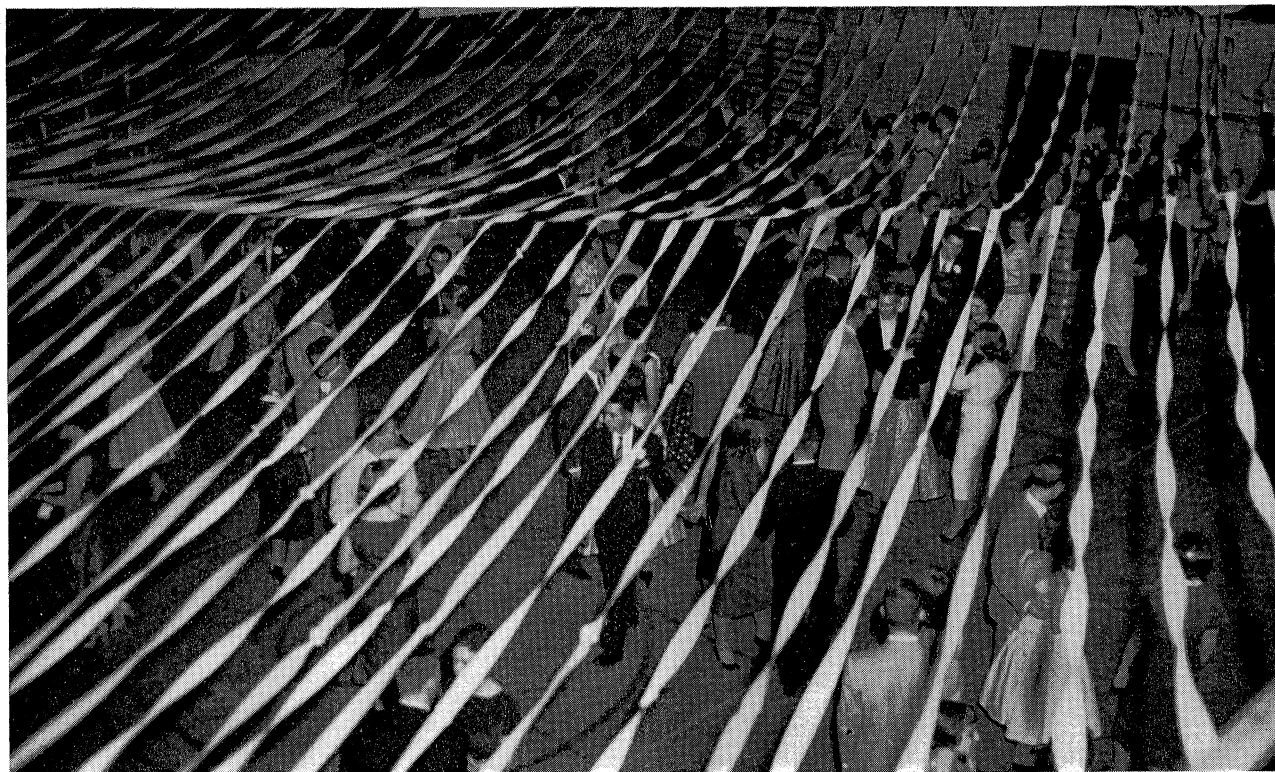
