





In addition to having received an International First Place Rating from Quill and Scroll, the *ECHO* was awarded the Quill and Scroll "A" for Achievement. This latter award represents a new step forward for the UHS newspaper. For the first time the *ECHO* was chosen by the National Scholastic Press Association to receive its publication, Scholastic Roto, for distribution monthly with the *ECHO*.

For the sake of efficiency, two new staff positions were added. A close look at various departments and organizations at Urbana High was given in a new feature, "Close-Up."

Although the *ECHO* worked to give the best possible coverage to school events, it also believed that events outside of school would be of importance to the students. More emphasis was placed on prominent people in the news. During election time, the *ECHO* carried interviews with state officials and presented coverages of the appearance of the Presidential candidates.

For the first time try-outs for positions as reporters were held twice during the year. In addition to the regular try-outs in September, try-outs were held in March for those persons who wished to write but did not try out at the beginning of the year.

Quill and Scroll



The Den is run by a youth council composed of ten seniors, nine juniors, and nine sophomores. This group is advised by Oscar Adams who is assisted by an adult council.


A membership card costs twenty-five cents, with an additional charge of ten cents for each evening spent at the Den. Admission for those who are not members is twenty-five cents.




FOOTBALL


CROSS COUNTRY





BASKETBALL

The Tiger cagers' 15-10 record was one of the finest in Urbana basketball history and their second-place finish in the Big 12 was the highest for UHS in 22 years. Highlights of the year were wins over Decatur, Springfield and Champaign. This year's victories marked the first time Urbana had beaten Decatur on the Reds' floor in 20 years; the 53-46 victory over CHS was the first win in 13 consecutive games, and the Solon loss was Springfield's first conference defeat of the year. WRESTLING

Injuries plagued the Tiger grapplers throughout the 1960-61 season, but nevertheless, Urbana captured the district crown and second places in both conference and sectional meets. Captain Tom Tinkham headed the list of six returning lettermen that presented a fine nucleus for coach Bob Raudonis. Six front-line wrestlers, half of the entire team, were injured at crucial points in the season. UHS ended the season undefeated in dual meets and will return 11 of 17 lettermen next year.



TRACK

The 1961 Urbana track team was the finest in the history of UHS. Gene Armer's Tigers went to the state meet with the best chances of scoring in many years. Pacing the trackmen all year were two individuals who became the greatest in their events in UHS cinder annals. Quarter-miler Thom Walters ran the 440 faster than any other high school runner in Illinois history. Captain Bob Hubbard developed into the top hurdler Urbana has ever seen. He entered state competition with outstanding prospects of winning the highs and good chances in the low hurdles. In addition, a crack Tiger mile quartet possessed the fourth best time in Illinois going into state action. Urbana was undefeated in all meets other than the state. The Tiger cindermen successfully defended their district and Big 12 titles and also won the Paris Relays, Oak Park Relays, Urbana Open, Shelbyville Open, Normal Relays, and dual meets with Champaign, Danville, Decatur Eisenhower and Decatur MacArthur. All victories this year were by top-heavy Tiger totals.
