It is through this program that Urbana High School is able to bring a foreign student to Urbana for a year and to send a UHS junior abroad for the summer. Kathy Hansen was the general chairman of this year's program.

Thirteen hundred dollars was needed to finance this year's program. The sale of AFS chocolate bars netted 90% of this amount. The rest of the sum was obtained from donations and from a bermuda day during which students paid for the privilege of wearing bermudas to school.

Several assemblies were held during the year at which Gary Storm told about his AFS-sponsored trip to Switzerland and Eva Unger, Urbana's foreign exchange student from Vienna, told of her native Austria.

For years to come everyone at UHS will remember Eva's fun-loving and vivacious manner.

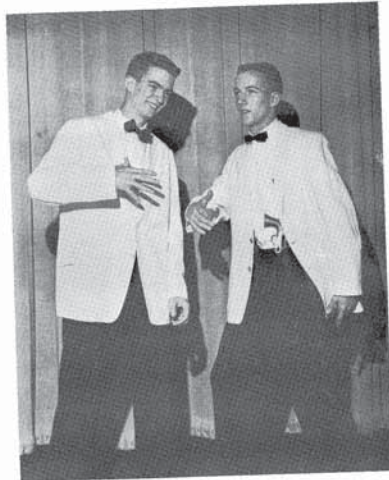
