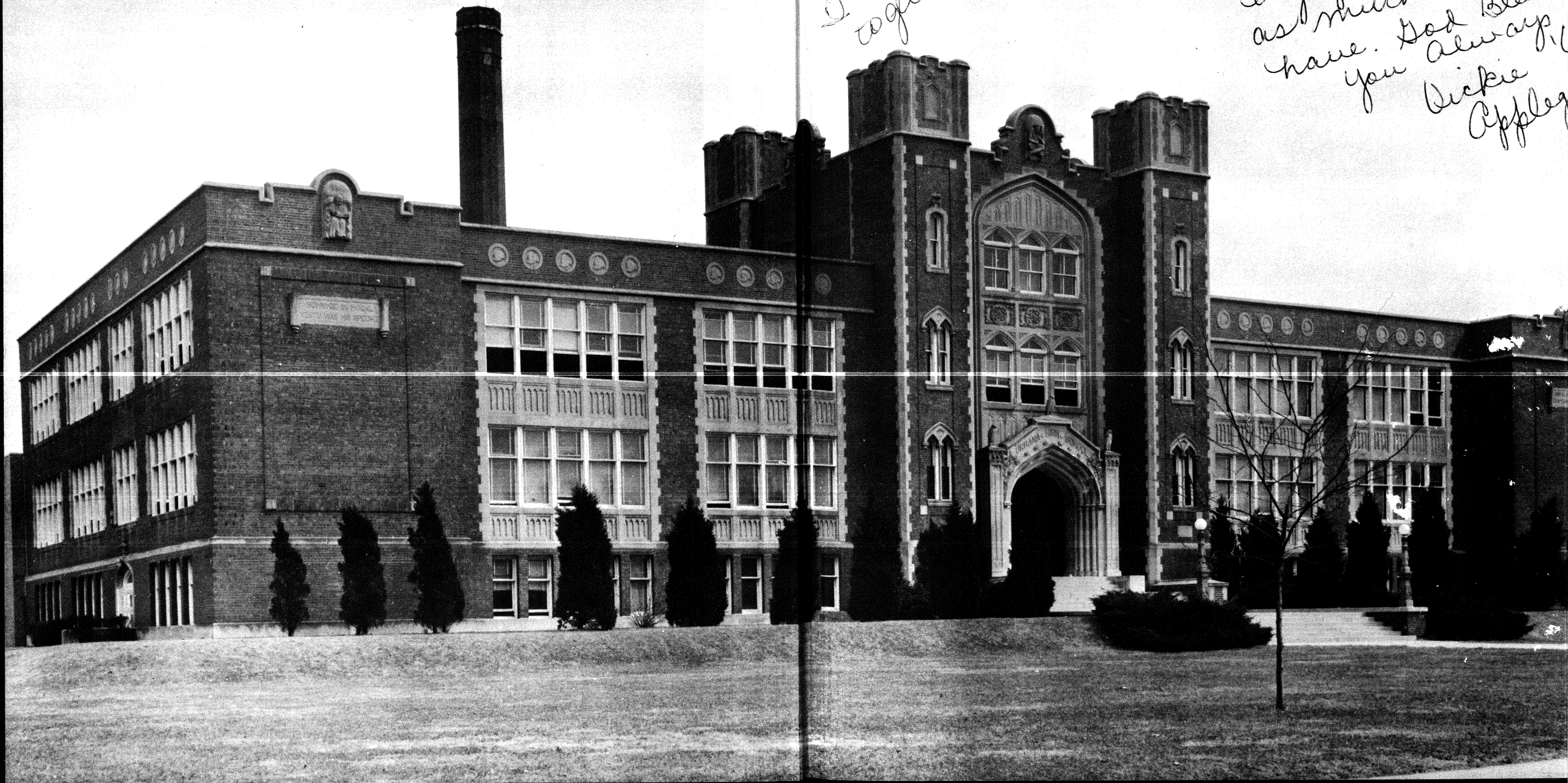

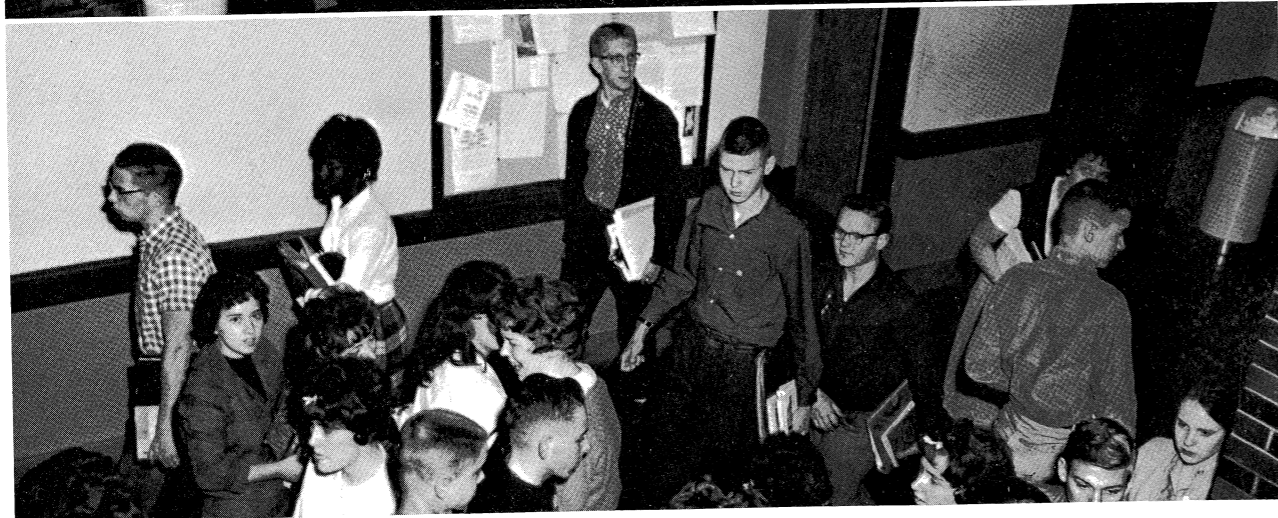
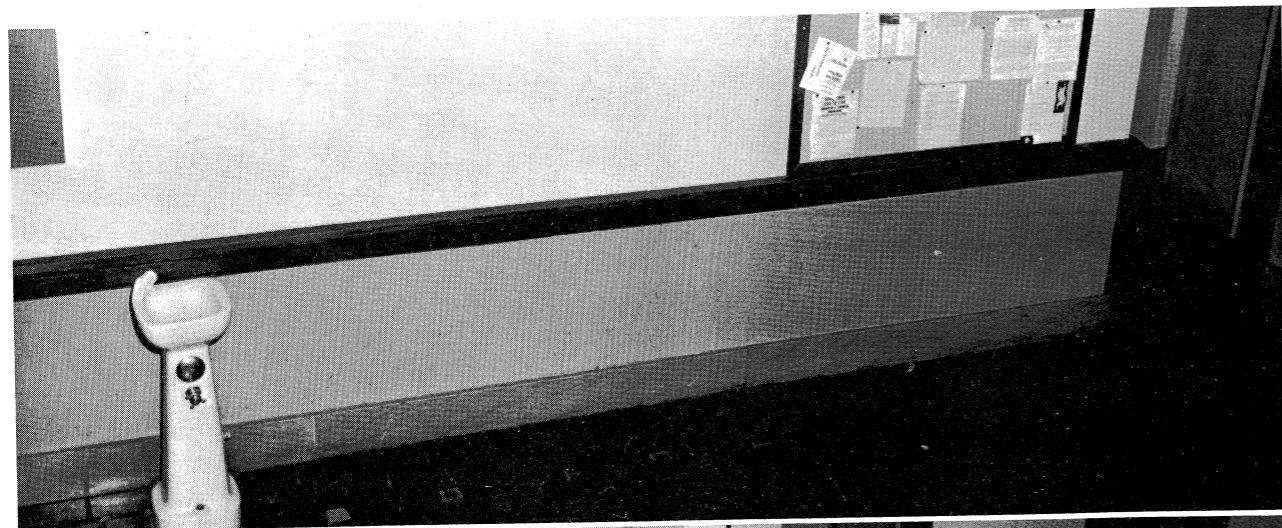
Foreword

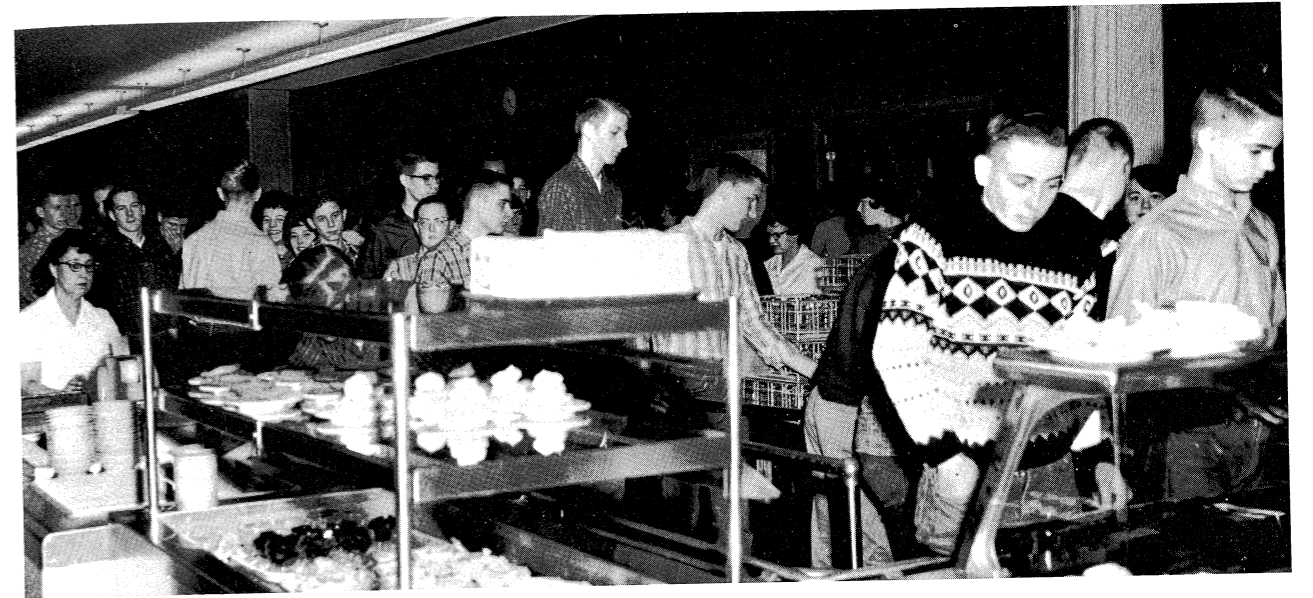

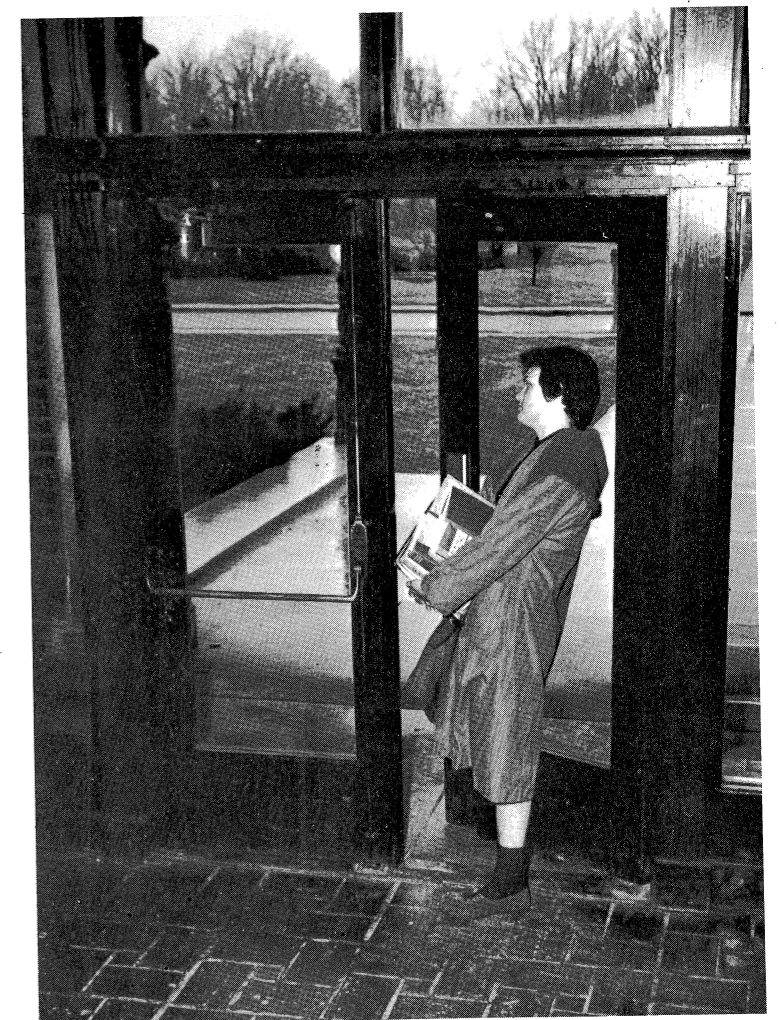

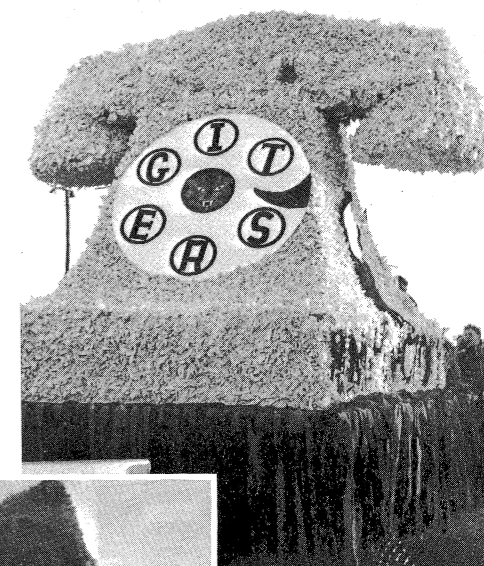

The festivities were climaxed by a Homecoming Dance in the high school gymnasium after the game with the UHS dance band providing the music.

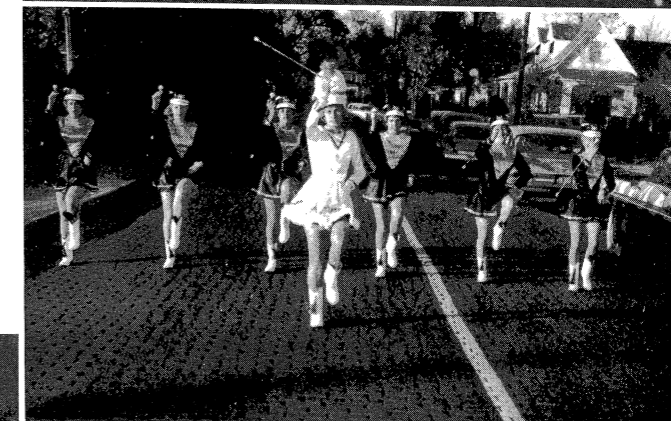

Tigers' Den

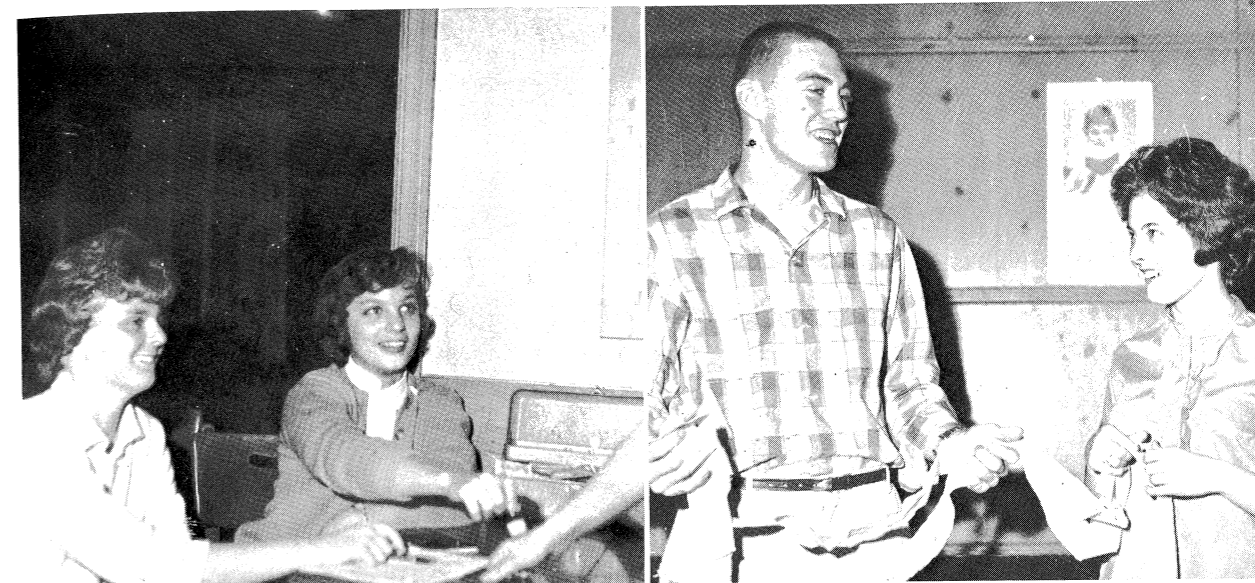

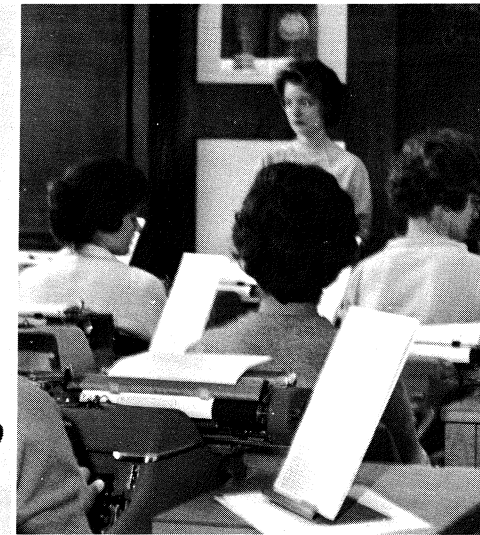

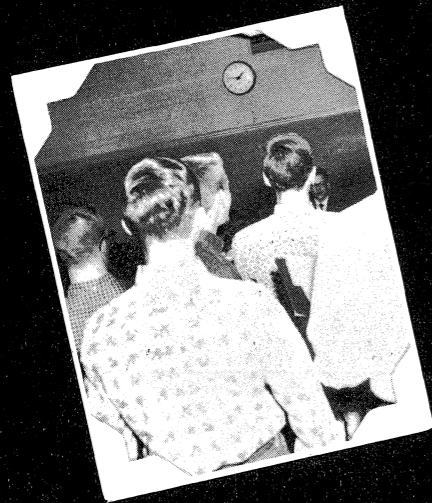
anne Smith.

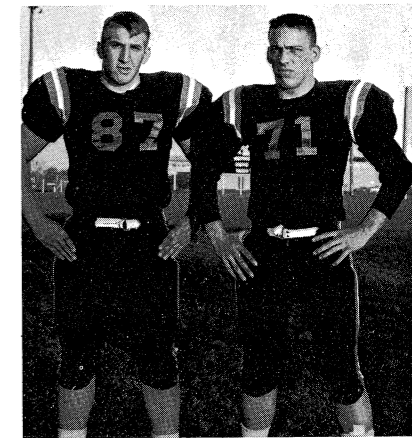
Crouse. Dave captured the hearts of the entire city as he proved to be the undoing of several Goliaths. At the end of the season, he was selected on the All-State team.

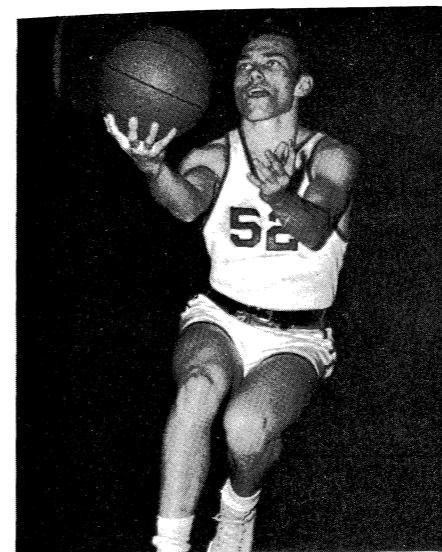
The highlight of the season was the double victories over Champaign. In both games, our cagers came from behind to form a thrilling climax to the victories.

The outlook for next year is good. With three returning lettermen and a strong sophomore team moving up, the cagers should prove to be one of the top teams in the area and in the conference.

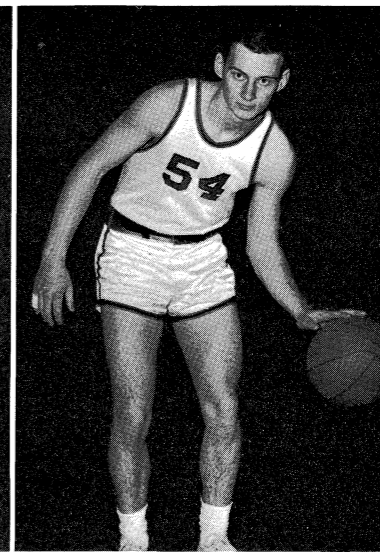
