
Dedication


Toni Altenbernd, Homecoming Queen

Marianne was presented with a key to U.H.S. at the half-time of the Rantoul football game by our principal, Mr. Braun.





Student Council


The first Student Council project for this year was the annual orientation day for the freshmen and new students.


Delta Sigma Members

International Language Clubs




Future Farmers of America


Cross Country






Outstanding Junior Athlete

Good wishes go with each of you for good health, happiness, and the realization of your highest potential.


