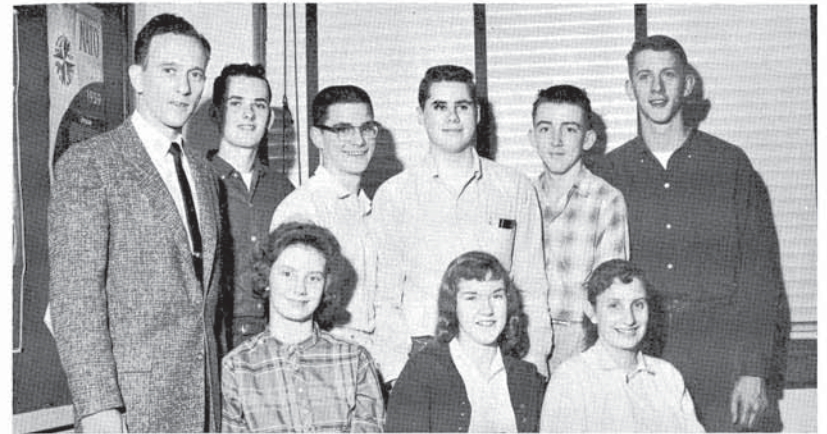
Art Club

Social Klub

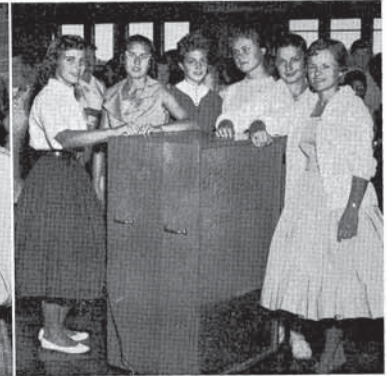

Future Farmers of America

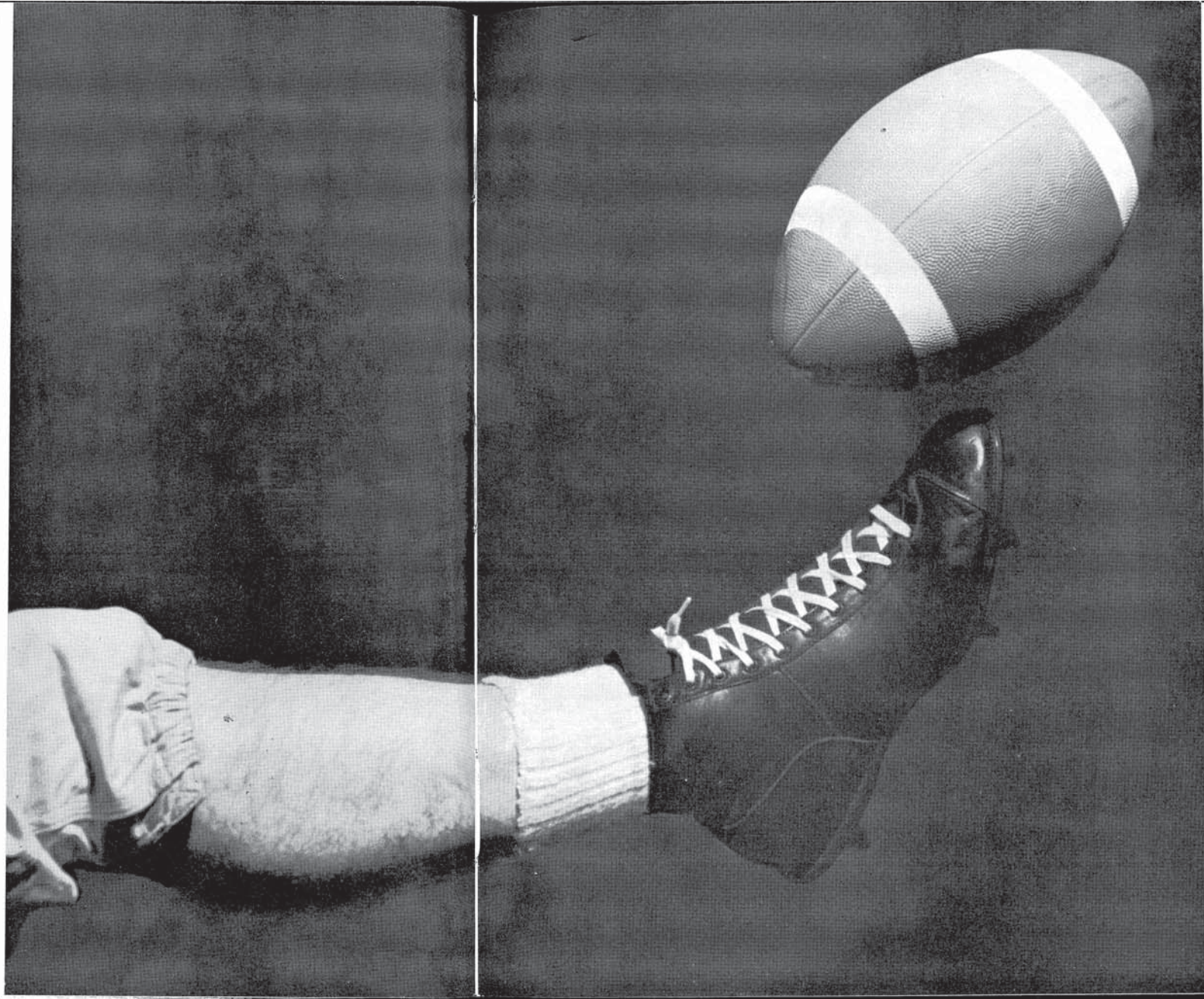

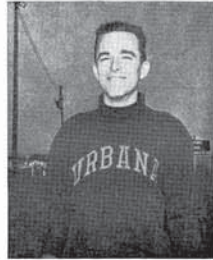
Cross Country
