

ERNIE WESTFIELD MAKING HISTORY



FORMER NEGRO LEAGUE BASEBALL PLAYER

Making history, U.S. Congress recently declared May 20th, Negro League Baseball Day. Ernie Westfield has turned his legacy into his career. He travels across the country sharing the history of the Negro League Baseball teams and other history with life lessons. He has memorabilia available on line at www.erniewestfield.com.

Black History since Civil Rights

1884- Moses "Fleetwood" Walker becomes first African-American player in major league baseball, signing with the Toledo club in the American Association. Several African-American players were active on the rosters of white minor league teams during the period.

1885- The first all-black professional team, the Cuban Giants, is founded in Babylon, New York.

1890- The International League implements a ban on African-American players. The league's ban will continue until 1946.

1896- In the famous Plessy vs. furgeson case the United States Supreme Court upholds Louissianna's law requiring "separate but equal" public facilities for blacks. The decision firmly established racial segregation.

1896- The Page Fence Giants and Cuban Giants, the undisputed champions of black baseball in the East, play an historic series. The Page Fence fence club prevails, winning 10 of 15 games.

1920- Andrew "Rube" Foster, renowned pitcher and owner of the Chicago American Giants, calls Midwestern team owner to Kansas City. The result of the metting is the formation of the Negro National League.

The League begins the 1920 season on May 2 with the following teams on board: Chicago, American Giants, Chicago Giants, Dayton Marcos, Detroit Stars, Indianapolis ABCs, Kansas City Monarchs and Cuban Stars

1924 The first Negro Series is played between the Kansas City and the Hilldale Club.

1930- Negro National League founder dies.

1931- The Negro National League plays its final season before succumbing to financial pressures.

1937- The Negro American League is formed. Josh gibson and Buck Leonard were power-hitting machines.

1946- Jackie Robinson is signed by the Brooklyn Dodgers and becomes the first player in the major league baseball in the modern era. He wins rookie of the year.

1965- August 6. President Johnson signs the Voting Rights Act of 1965. The act, which King sought, authorized federal examiners to register qualified voters and suspended devices such as literacy tests that aimed to prevent African Americans from voting.

As we reflect on black history month we should consider how our history has shaped our culture, attitudes and perceptions. For example, why are most African-American's afraid of the police, because they don't trust them.

Or, why are most people afraid to speak up, because they are afraid they won't be heard.
Or, how do we overcome?

Unity of all towards lasting positive change for the sake of our children, that will be creating a history of their own.
