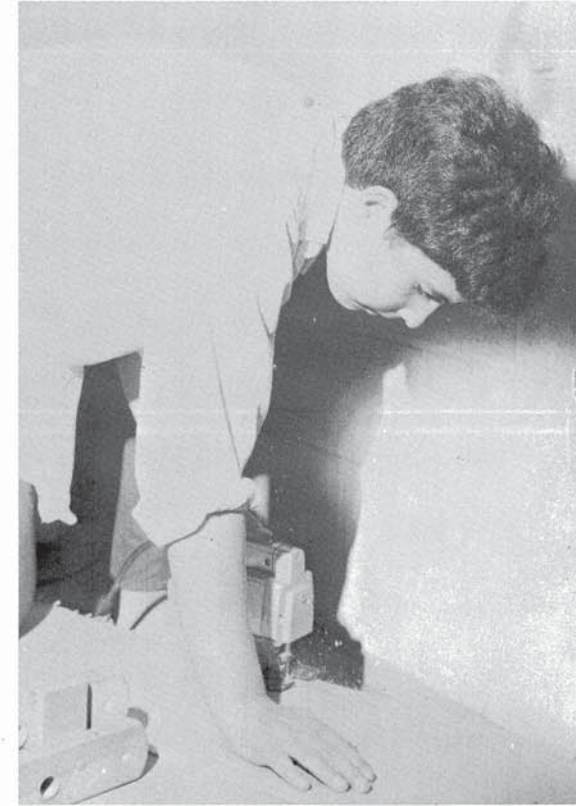
A dance and offstage chorus accompanied by a twenty-eight member orchestra completed the production.

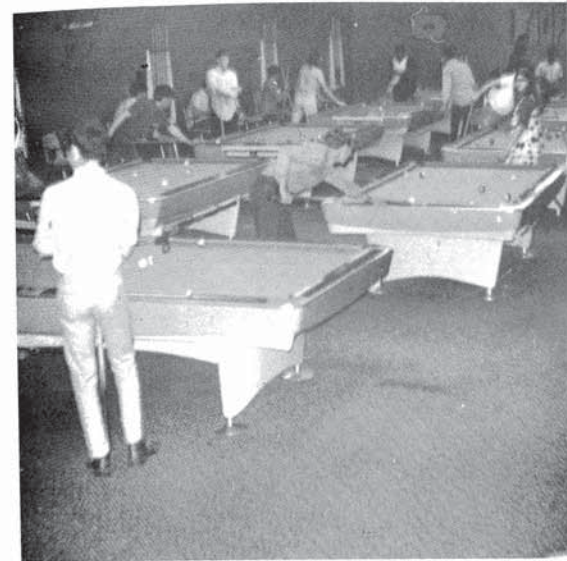
