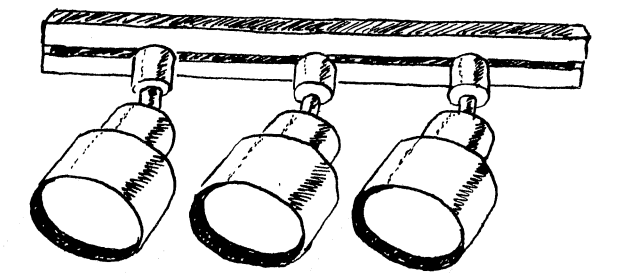
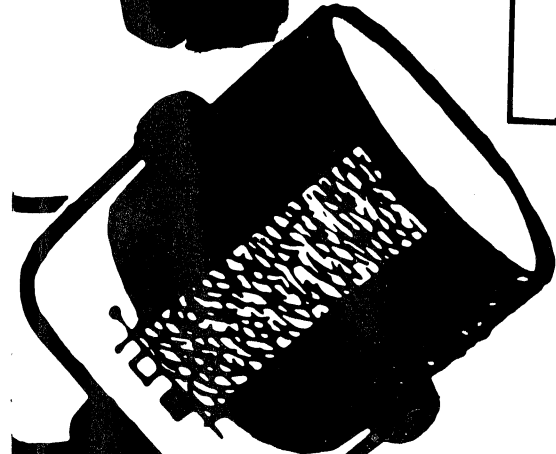

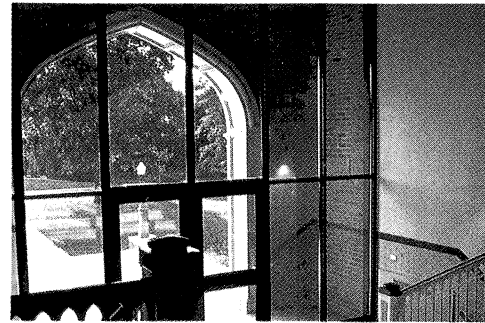
THE NEW U.H.S.

The Sophomores and the Freshmen

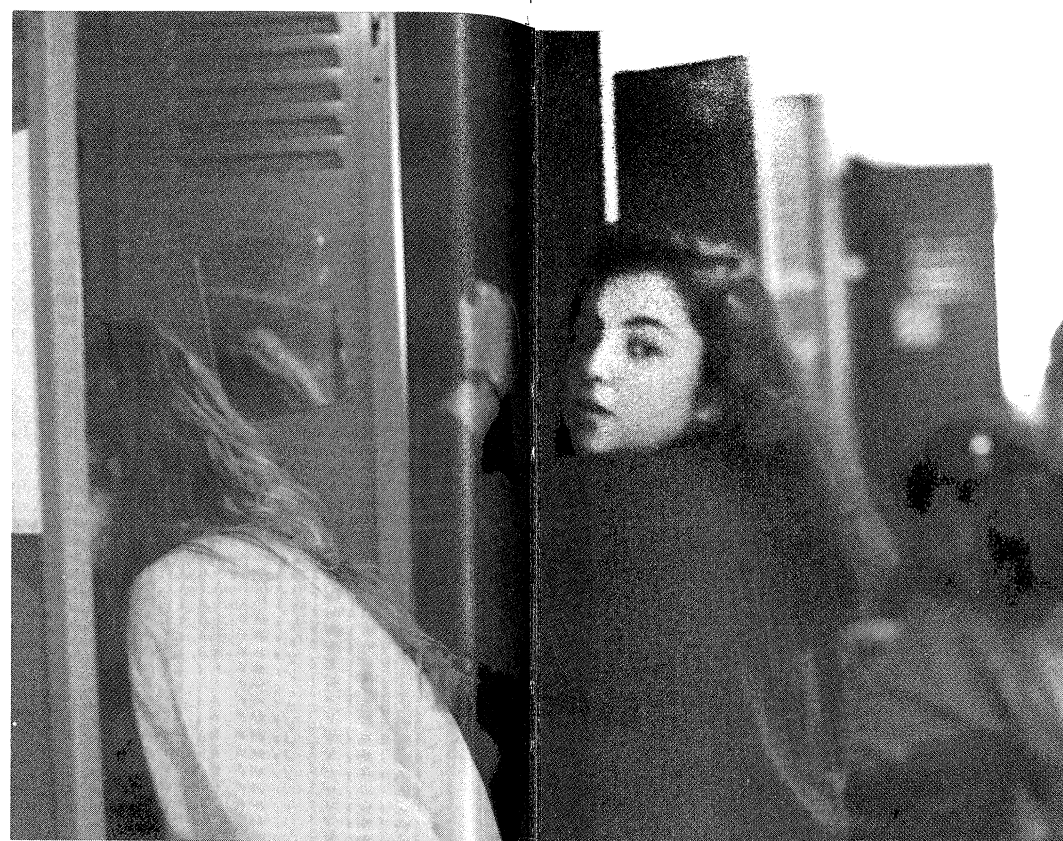

The Homecoming parade was also really exciting, as the number of entries were increased, and the number of people who had turned out to watch had also increased. Students

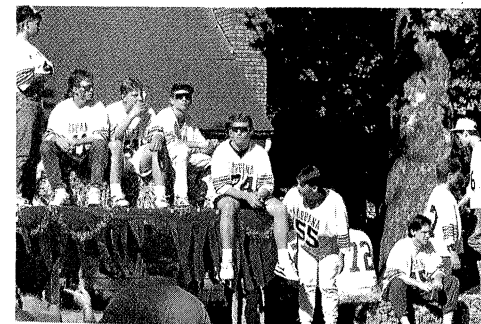

U.H.S. Students Excel

While enjoying themselves and excelling out of the classroom, the students at Urbana High School also had great success in the classroom. In fact, for what it was worth, on the average, Urbana High School had scored higher on College Standardized testing (ACT, SAT) than either of the Champaign high schools. Urbana had expanded its class schedule from six to seven classes this year, and it had opened

up many possibilities for students to take more elective classes. In light of this fact, the high school offered a few new classes, like television production and honors seminar. For students, these were both welcome additions to the curricular and had benefited many students.

As always, though, if you did not find the classes you wanted, you could do an independent study or an executive internship outside of the general classroom structure. Eric Bailey felt that the independent study program "gave me a creative outlet to study in areas that interested me but were not offered by the school nor the classes."

In spite of the changes made in the curriculum and the scheduling, many students still felt that the number of required classes and credit demands, had inhibited their pursuit of a well rounded education. Frequently, students found themselves unable to take course work in the areas of art and music because of the extra requirements needed of the health classes. This was more of a problem for some than others, but the counseling department had worked hard to find solu-

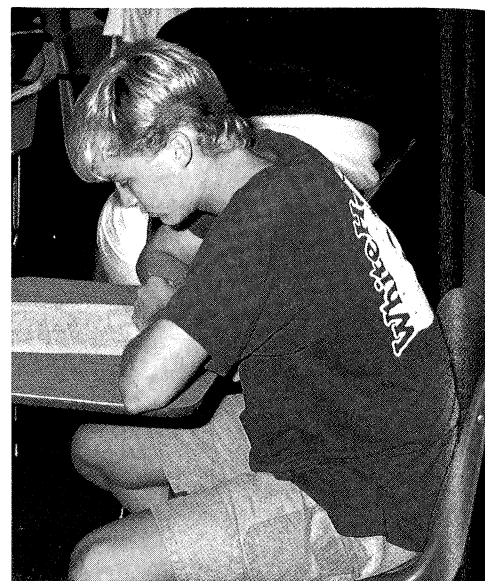
tions for these problems.

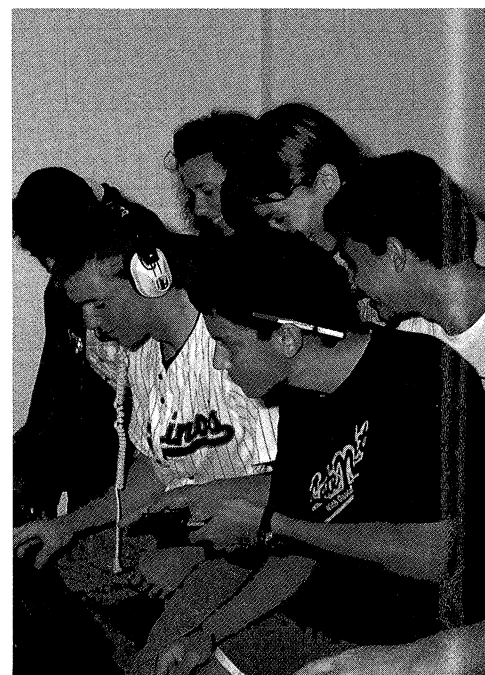
The students themselves also deserved a lot of the credit for the educational improvement that the school showed. They also

the extent of all the activities offered at UHS, but it is a good overview.

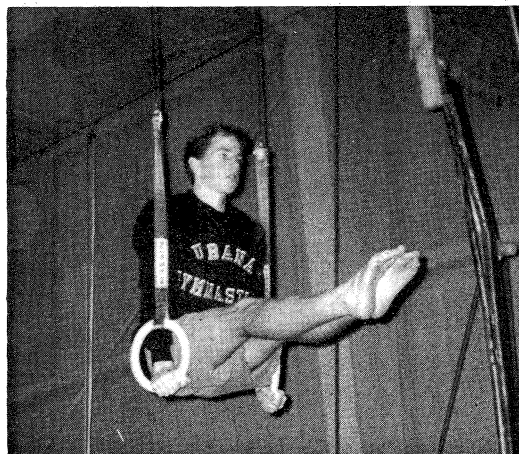

lenged in competitive play against some of the best players in the state at Big 12 and Regionals.

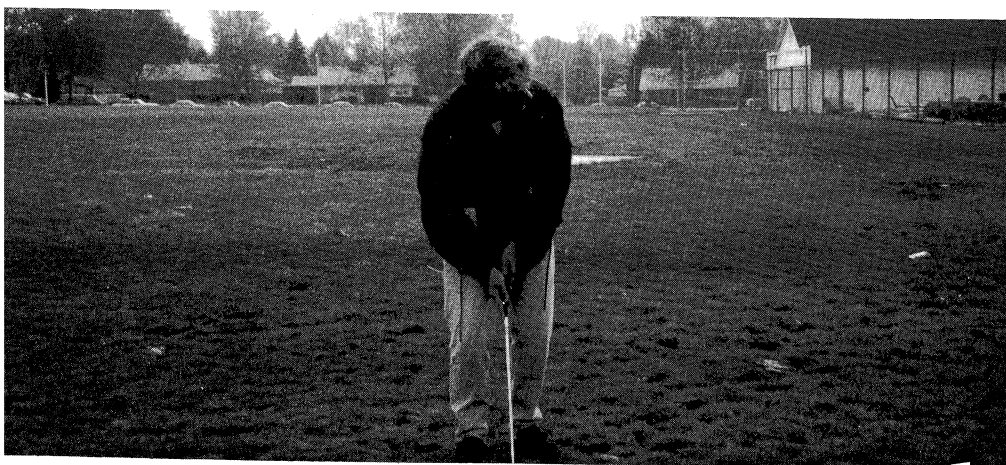
The highlight of the year was an upset victory over Danville-Schlarman, edging them out by several strokes. Also, Charles

The guys had surprised themselves with an amazing second place finish at sectionals, with the doubles team duo of Adam Rak and Mark Swanson finishing third

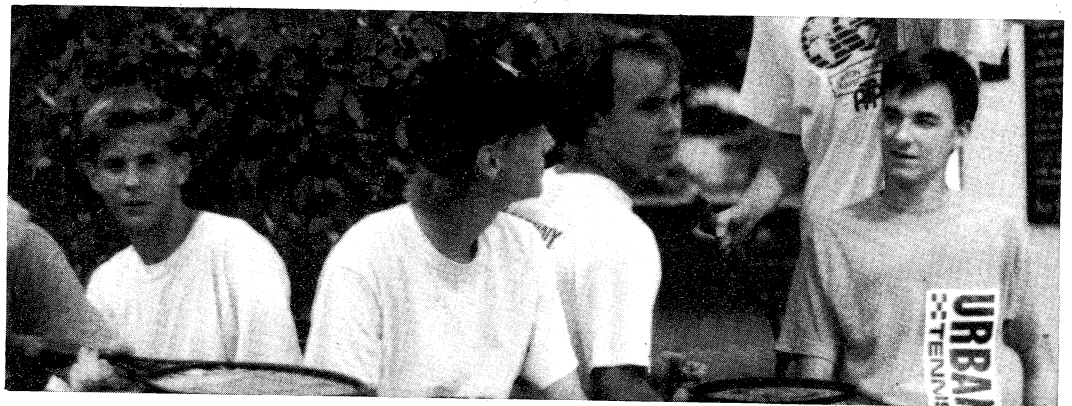
overall. They were extremely pleased to have been given the chance to redeem themselves, for they knew that they had the ability to play at that level.

The only major drawback about using this pool, was that there were no diving boards and because no one could practice diving, they were always at a disadvantage at swim meets.

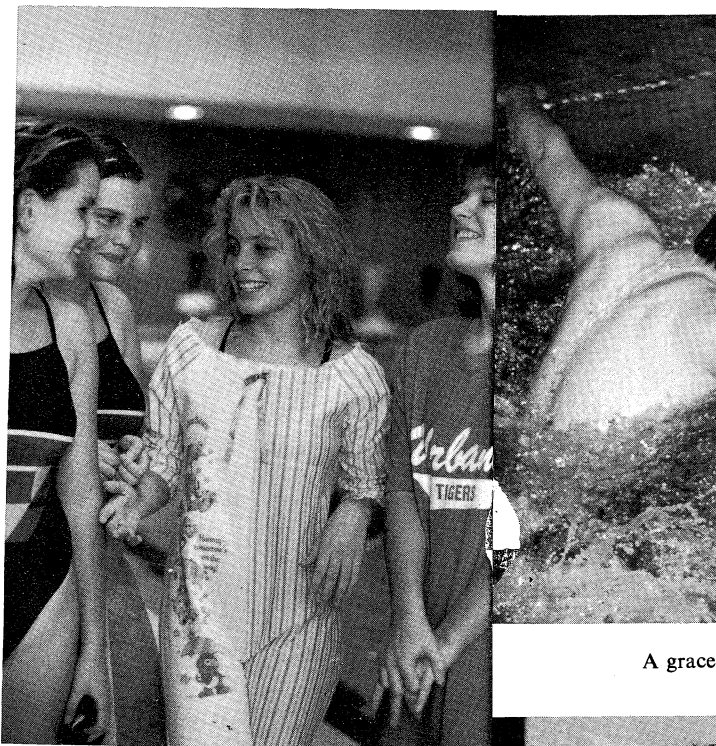
However, despite the incon-

Most of these hoopsters saw the season as a difficult experience, but all look forward to next year.

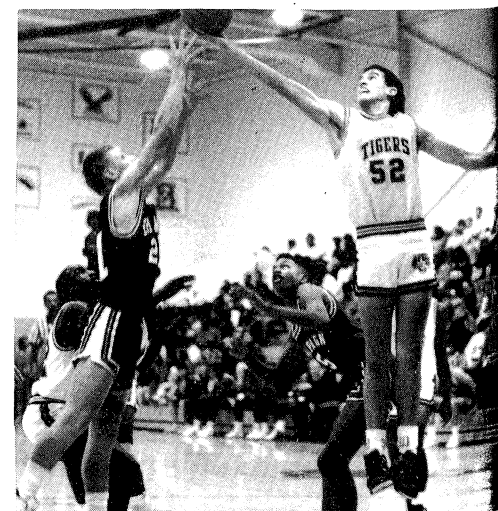

The girls had a rather good year even though the size of their team prevented them from participating in all the events of each

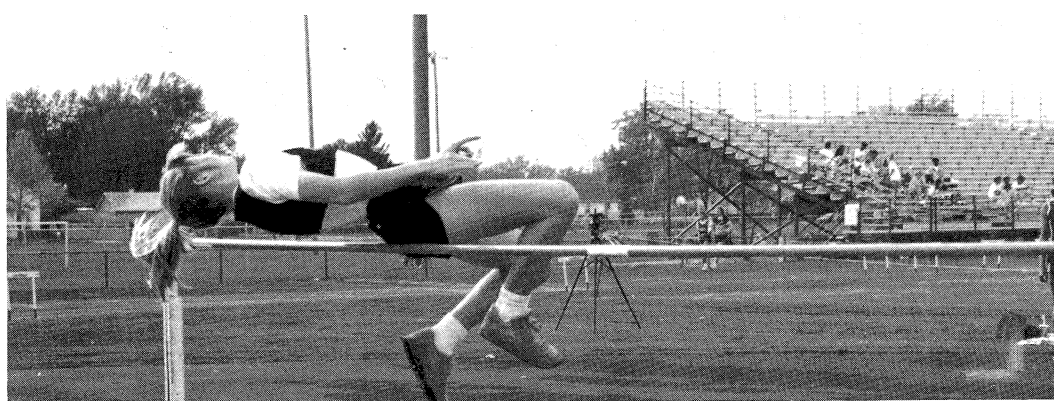

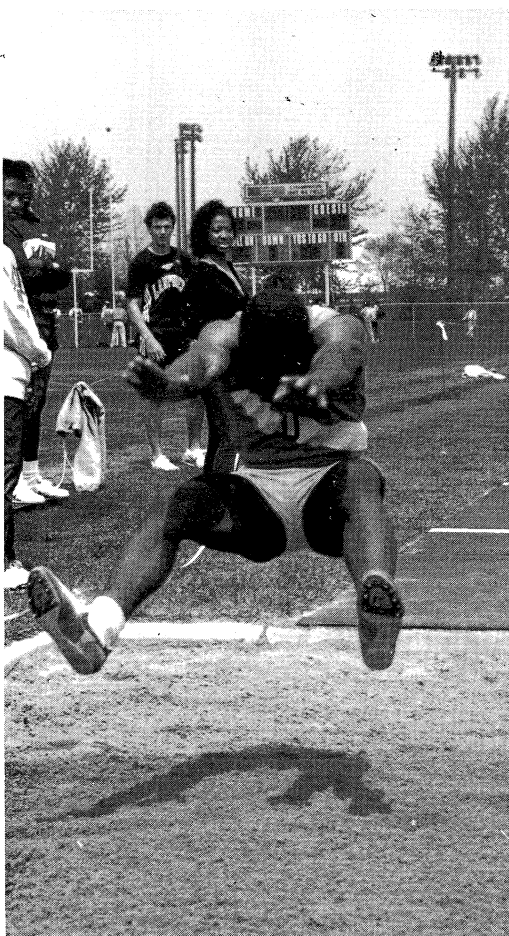

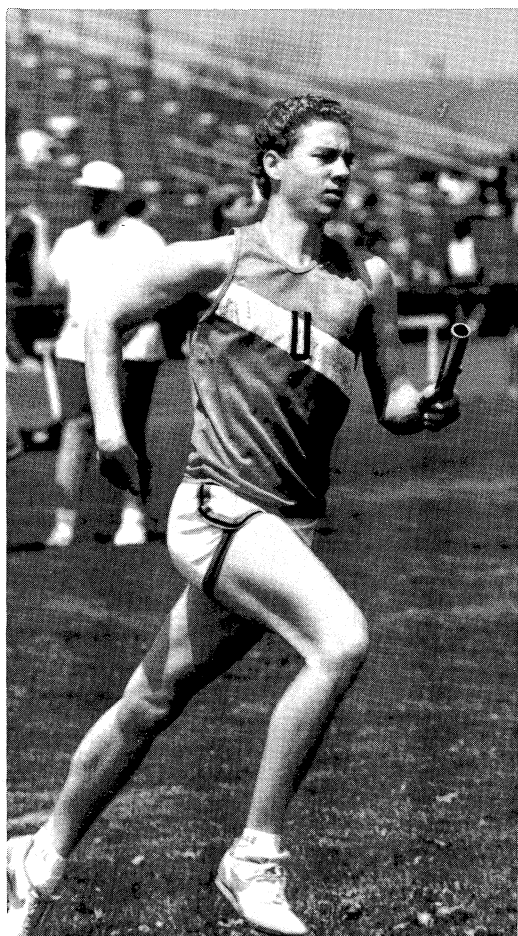
The Tigers are looking forward to a more successful season in '90 with the return

of a strong field of runners from last year and an anticipated addition of some new runners with cross-country experience.

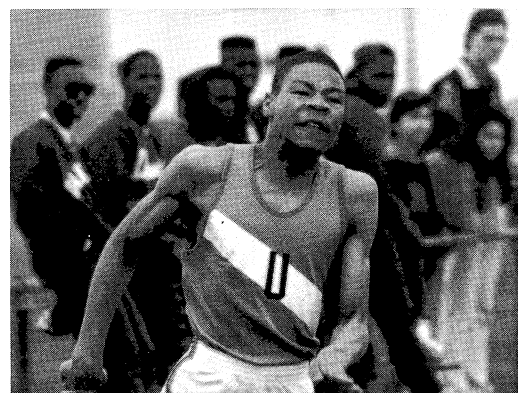

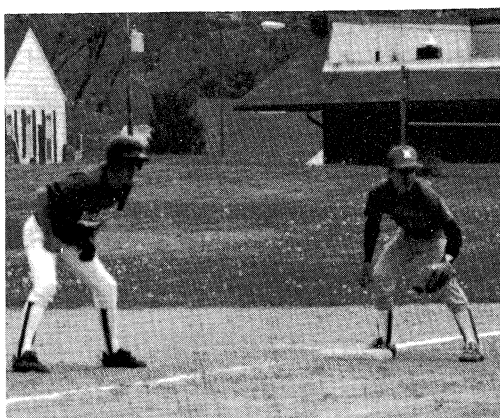
Todd Short, and sophomores, Josh Kelso and Josh Shelmadine.

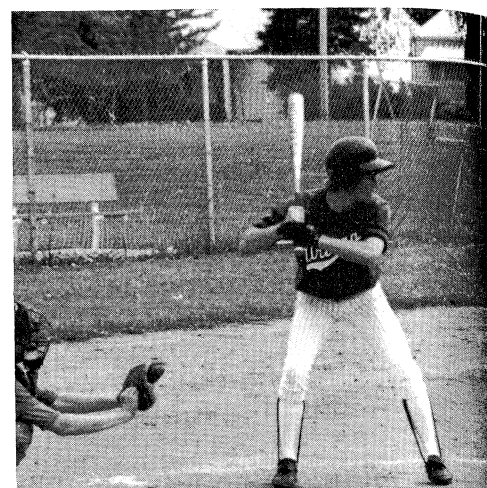
also included a split double-header against a tough Charleston team in Charleston.

The Wrestlettes had a great season. They were led by senior captain Aimee Townsend and were sponsored by Mrs. Hanner. The Wrestlettes had participated in

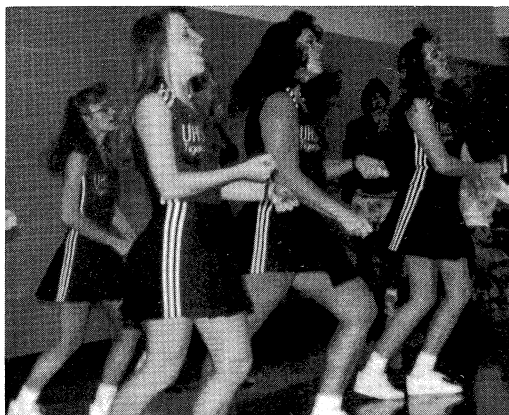

an individual level, Mark Huls, Brian Madsen, Jarrard Davenport, and Ryan Birt, all won regionals and qualified for sectionals.



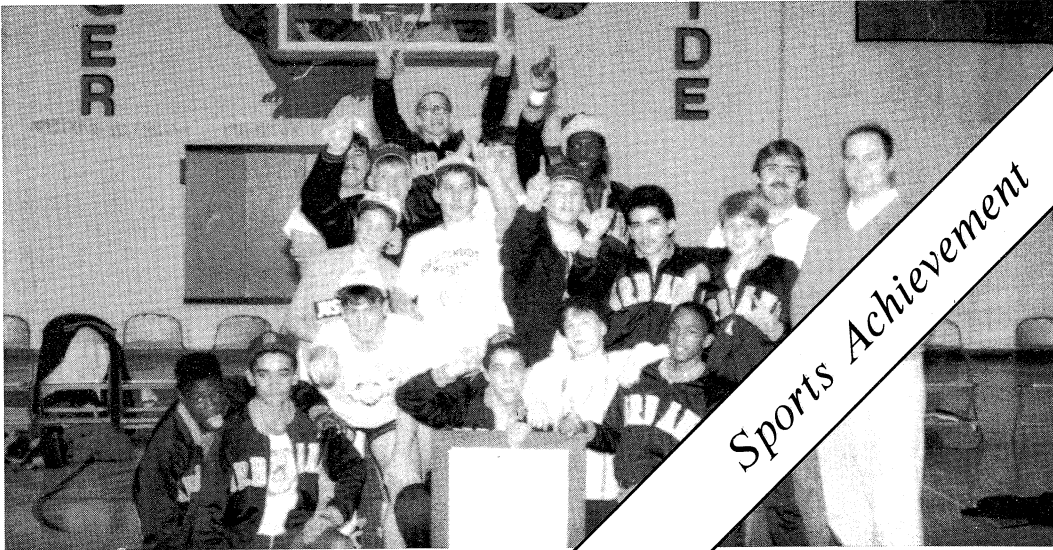

year," commented trumpet player Todd Peters.

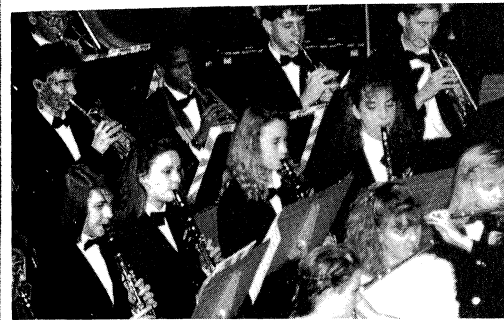
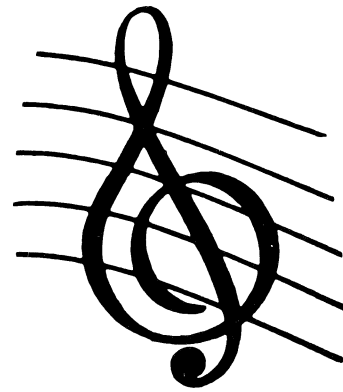

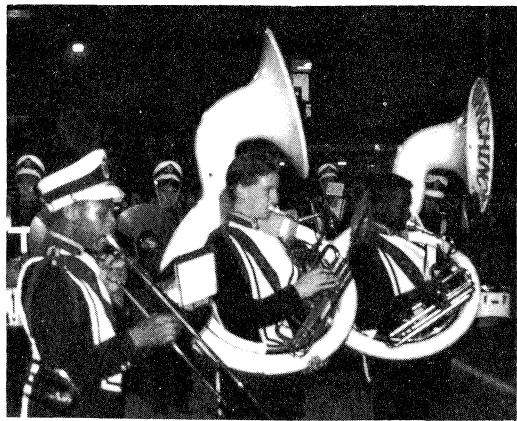
took a trip to Six Flags for a day filled with fun and excitement.

After losing several outstanding musicians over the past years, the band is well prepared for the new in-crop of students that await. Being a musician takes a lot of

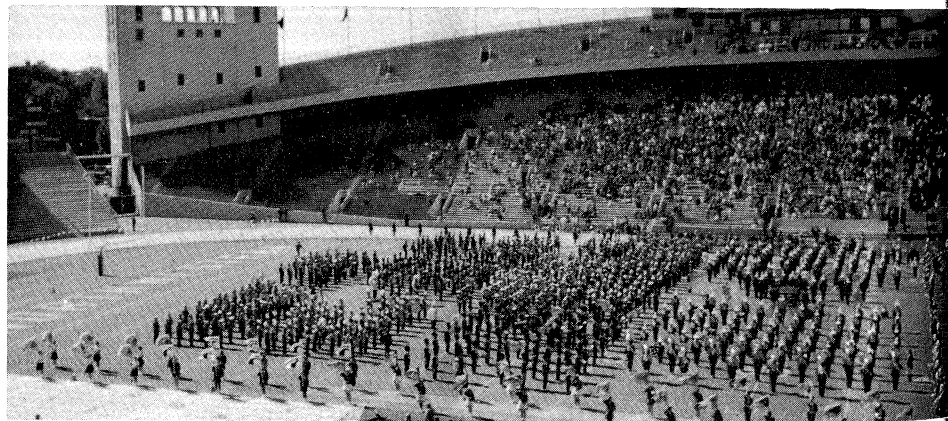
work, and especially sacrifices like summer school or taking a first hour class. But all in all, the band needs a big handshake and a salute. For where would we be

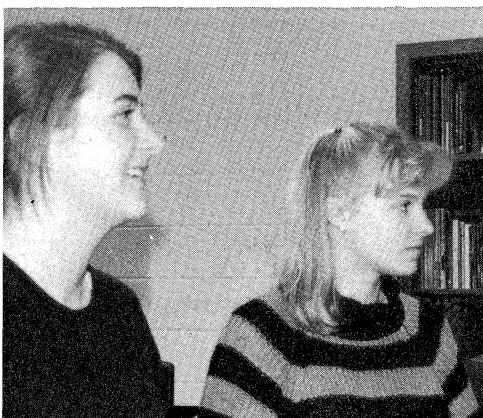
There are many different reasons why people join the Quiz bowl team.

before the Winter break. The articles contained in these pages ranged from Cari Anderson's expose on "Cheerleaders," to Michele's

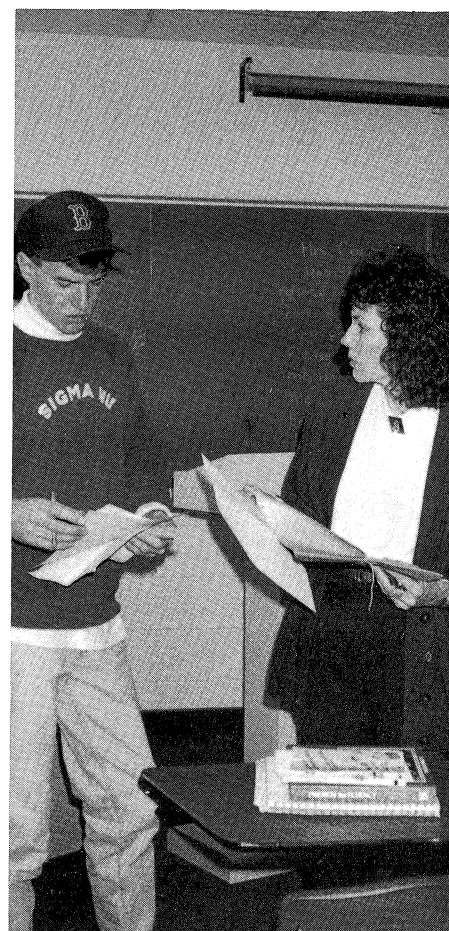
article on an "Out of Body Experience."

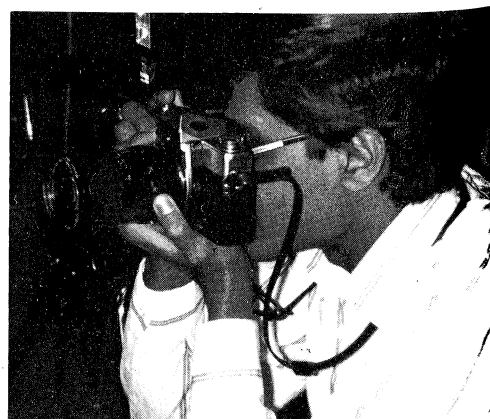

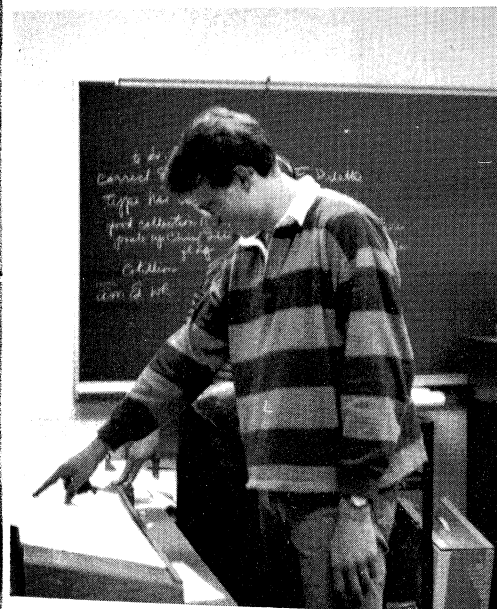

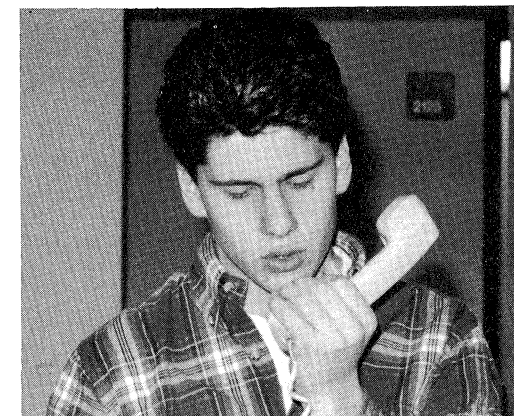
As in the past, the UHS daily student bulletin was read every morning by our

students. The days meetings and announcements were heard in the classrooms of the student body. With the many delightful voices the announcements brought about the start of every students day.

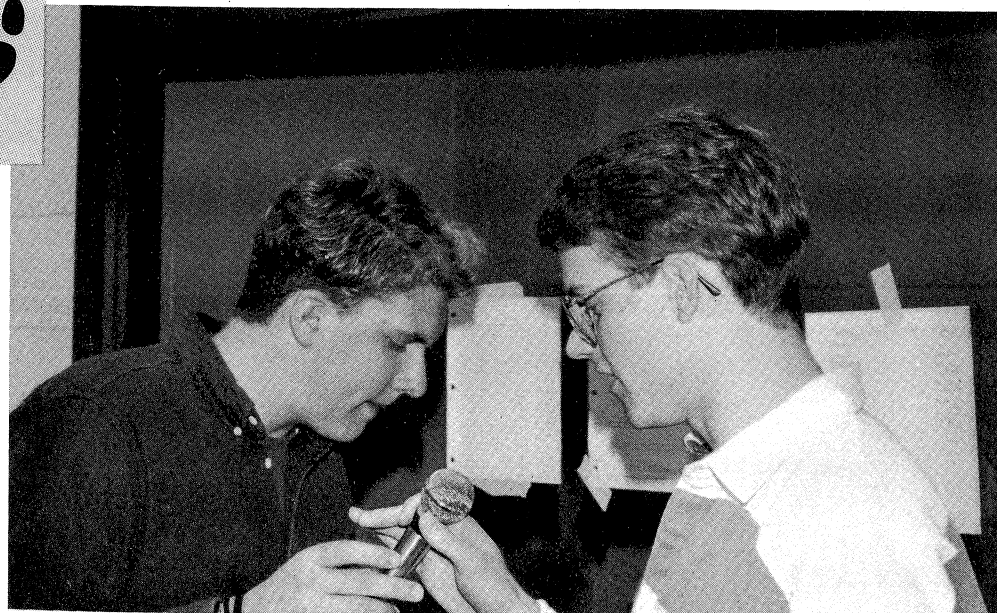

Senate is much more than a school service organization though, it's also an organization

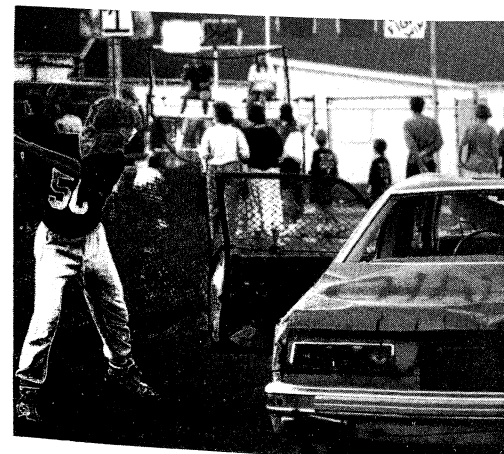

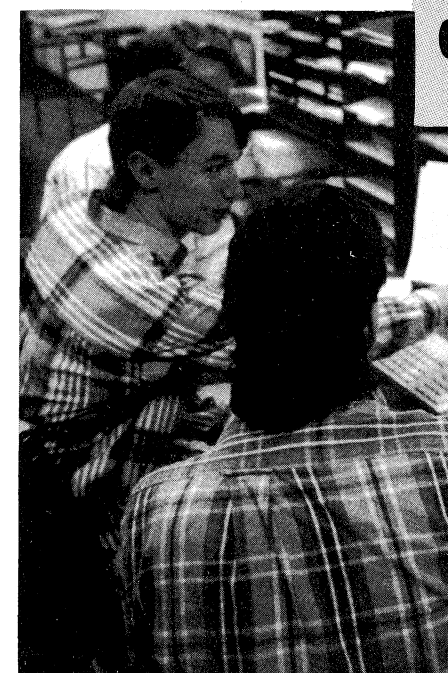

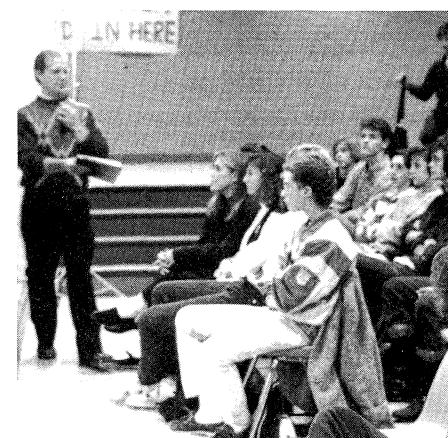

February was Black History month and one group at UHS was hard at work to inform its members about their own humanity and past, while simultaneously working to create a desirable future.

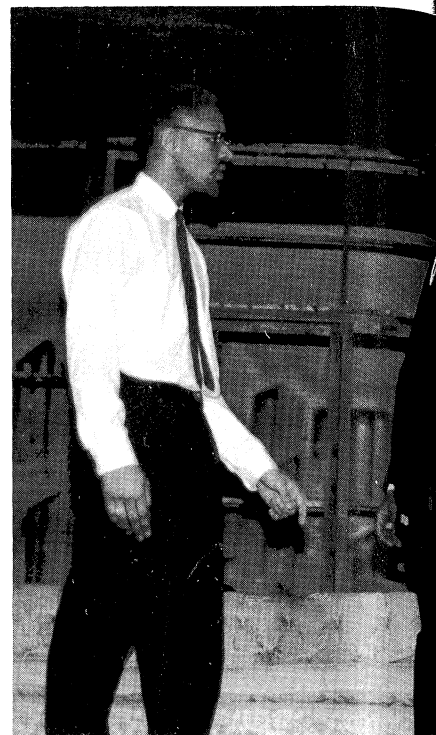

The group kicked off the month

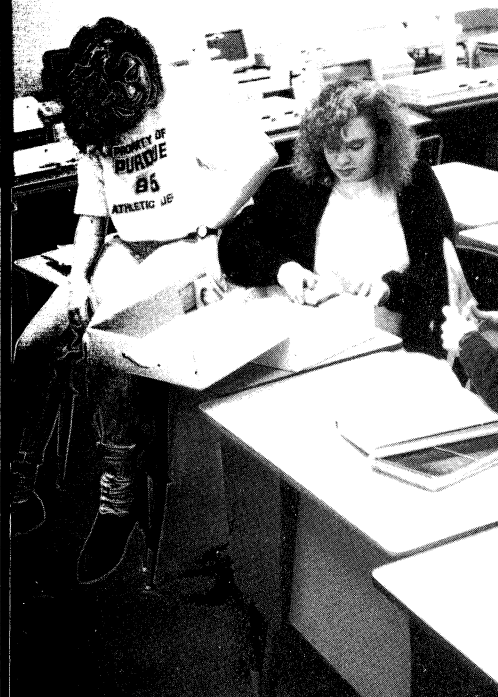

more prosperous in the upcoming years.

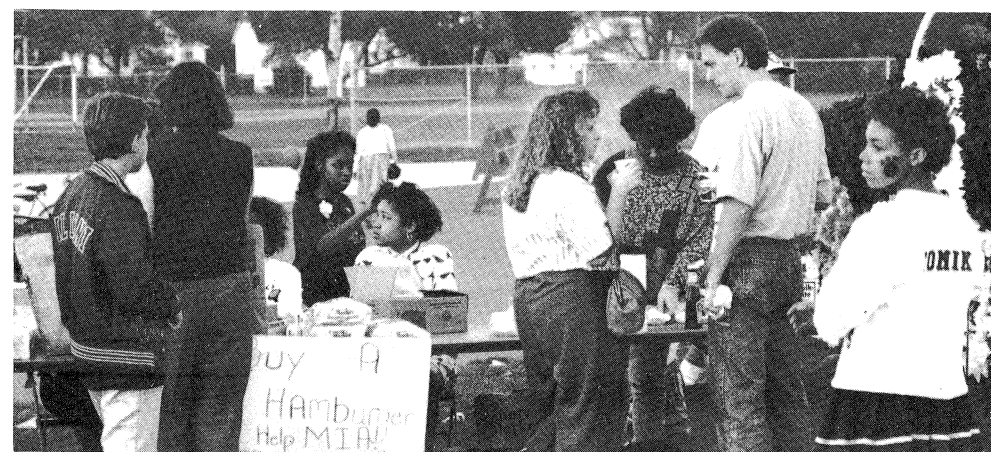
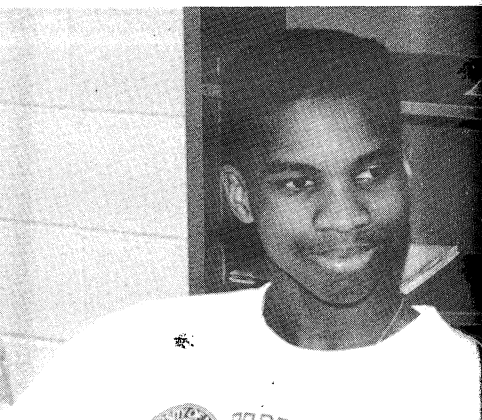

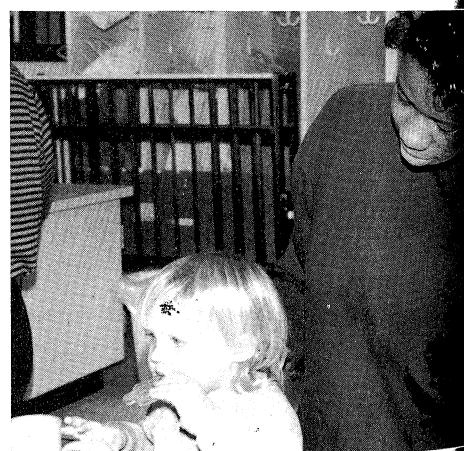

One teenager is killed every hour throughout the United States by someone driving under the influence of alcohol. In fact, more young people between the ages of 15 to 25 die from drinking and driving accidents than from war, drugs, and disease.

Students involved in the 1989-1990 Saferides program, a chapter of Students Against Drunk Driving (SADD), participated in three sections — community awareness, school education, and safe rides.

Students involved in community awareness gave speeches, volunteered time, and helped make the public aware of one of the country's largest problems: drinking and driving. The Staying Alive Peer Education

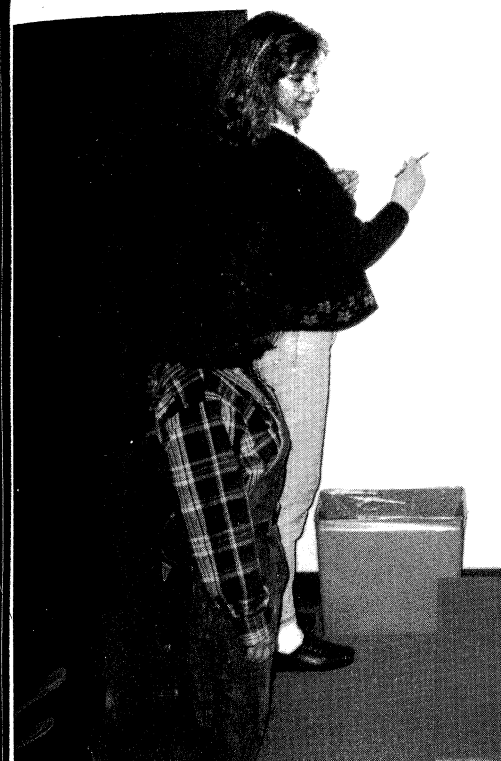
Program is a student developed, 45-minute classroom presentation in which the SADD members actively involved other peers in the effort to prevent teenage death and disability caused by drinking and driving.

The Cooperative Education program, COOP, and the Work Experience and Career Exploration program, WECEP, provide the opportunity for students to receive credit toward graduation while employed at "training stations" throughout Champaign-Urbana. These training stations are selected job sites where employers have agreed to work with the COOP and WECEP coordinators. The employers work with the students to teach them responsibility and discipline. They are also there to ensure a rewarding and successful experience for the Urbana High School students who are enrolled in these programs.

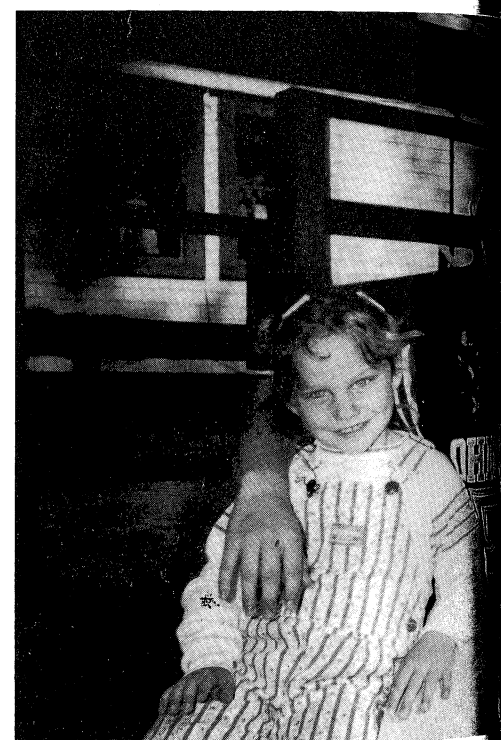
These programs allow qualified students to experience "the best of both worlds." Academic subjects of interest can be studied while gaining first hand experience in the work place. To be eligible to enroll in the Co-op course students must be at least 16 years old, while the eligibility limit for WECEP is 14-15. Students can earn up to one credit for the classroom portion of the program and credit for the training segment per semester. The classroom portions of these programs are designed to include what has been deemed as important employment skills. The edition of the valuable job experience works to compliment the



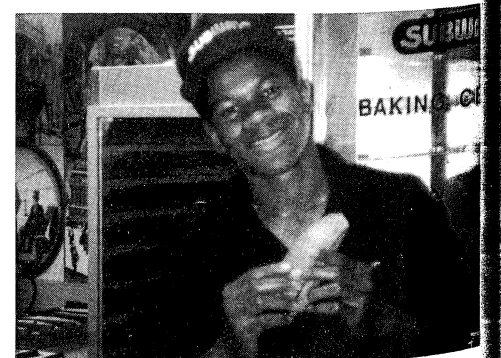

Students held weekly meetings to discuss world wide political activities.

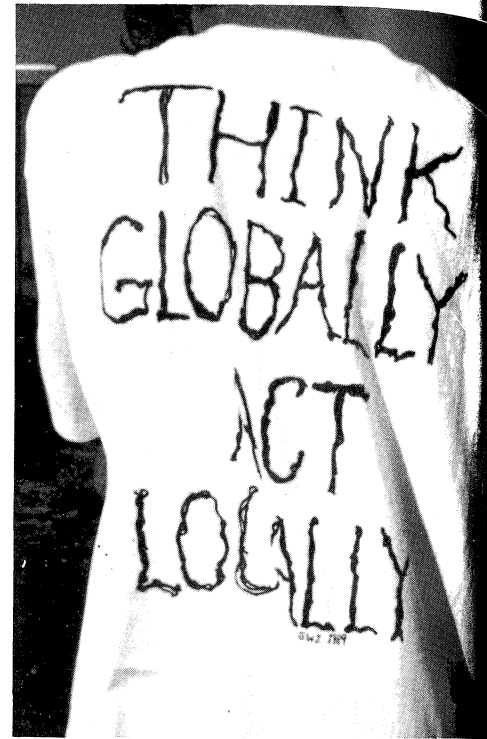

rights, environmental hazards, and animal rights. They acted locally when they boycotted a well-known pizza place that was against animal rights.

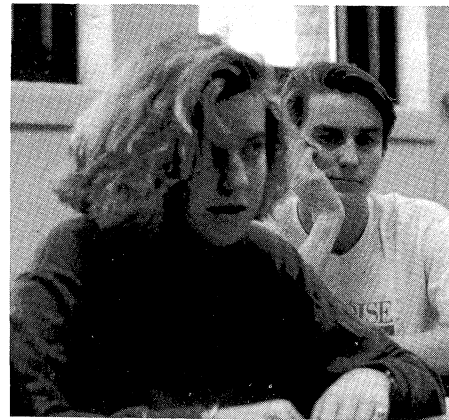

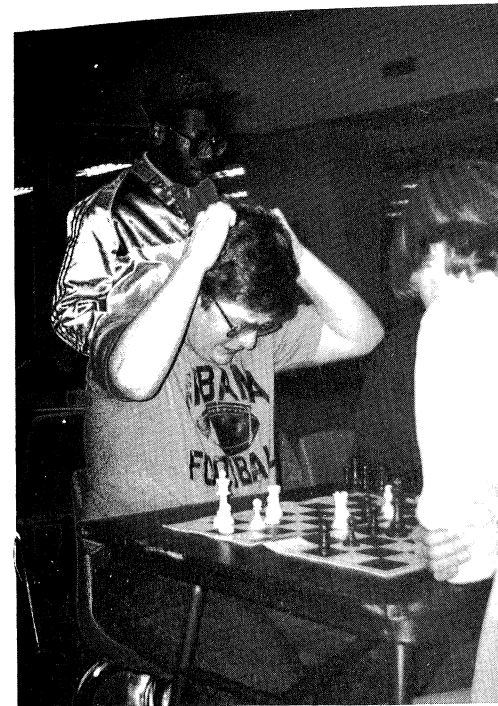

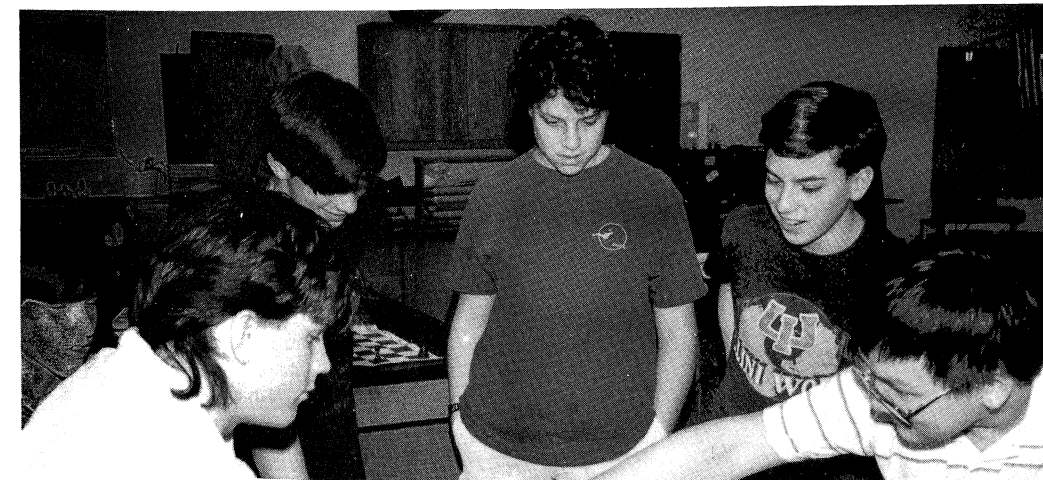
Chess team finished the season with a remarkable record of 28-3.

At the Individual State tournament many outstanding victories were also accomplished by a select number of the Chess team members. The members who qualified for the Individual

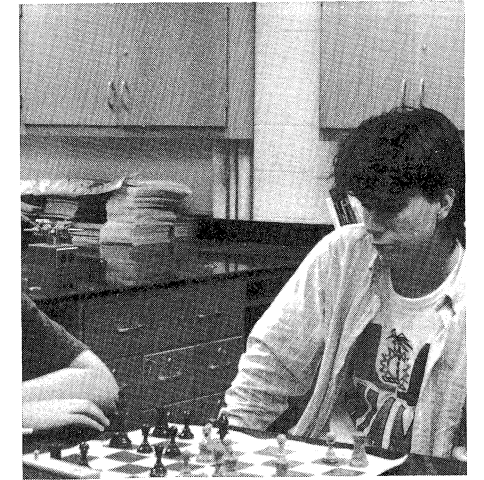
Tournament were Malcolm Carroll and Greg Leuthold. Malcolm Carroll finished the tournament with five wins, one draw, and he

came in second place overall. Greg Leuthold was just as impressive as Malcolm Carroll with two wins, two draws, one loss, and he finished in the top 25 overall.

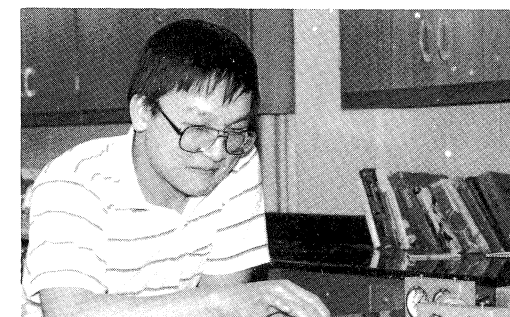

Cultural Experiences

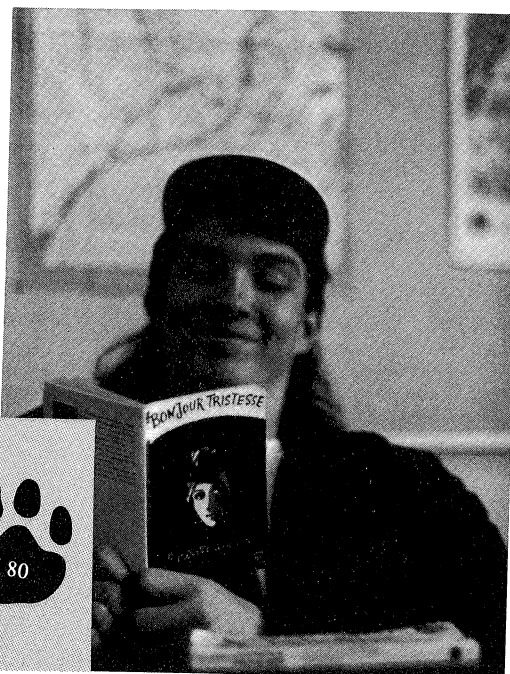

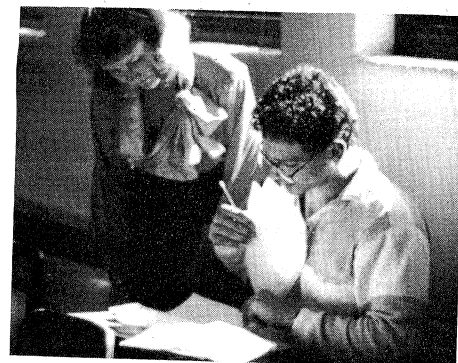
emarked, "I enjoyed getting out on the field and kicking the ball, as well as other teams around."

and danced to the songs selected by D.J.'s Dan Larson and Jeremy Kaufman.

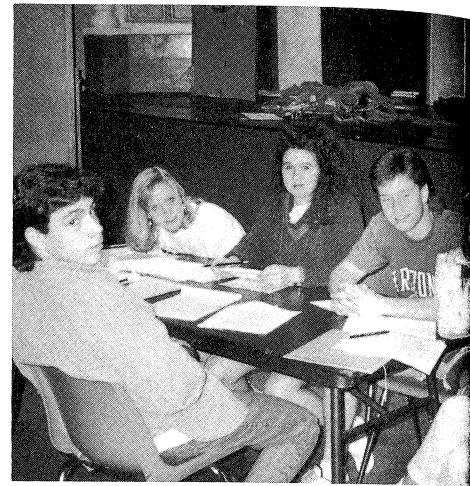
Another new idea adopted by NHS were the forums. These forums allowed students to discuss current event topics in small groups and with guest speakers. Topics discussed in these forums

included terrorism, the environmental problems of man made land fills, and the issue of student right's.

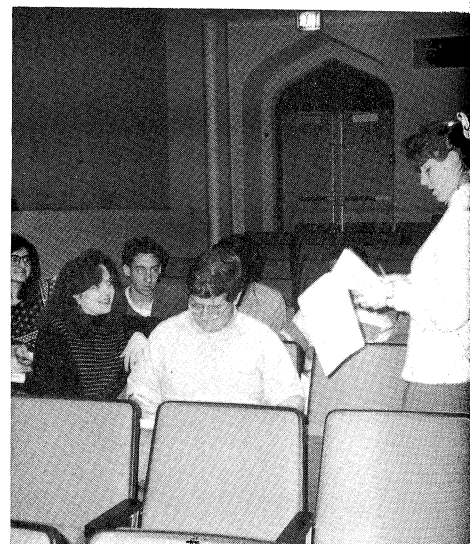
NHS also carried on the tradition of the Volleyball Bonanza.

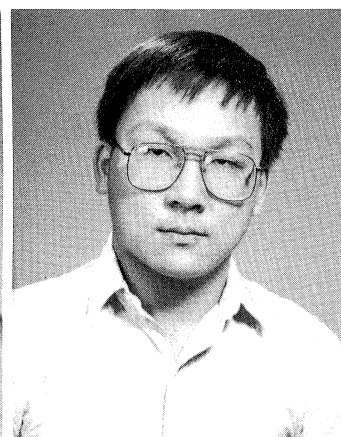


A Class With Class

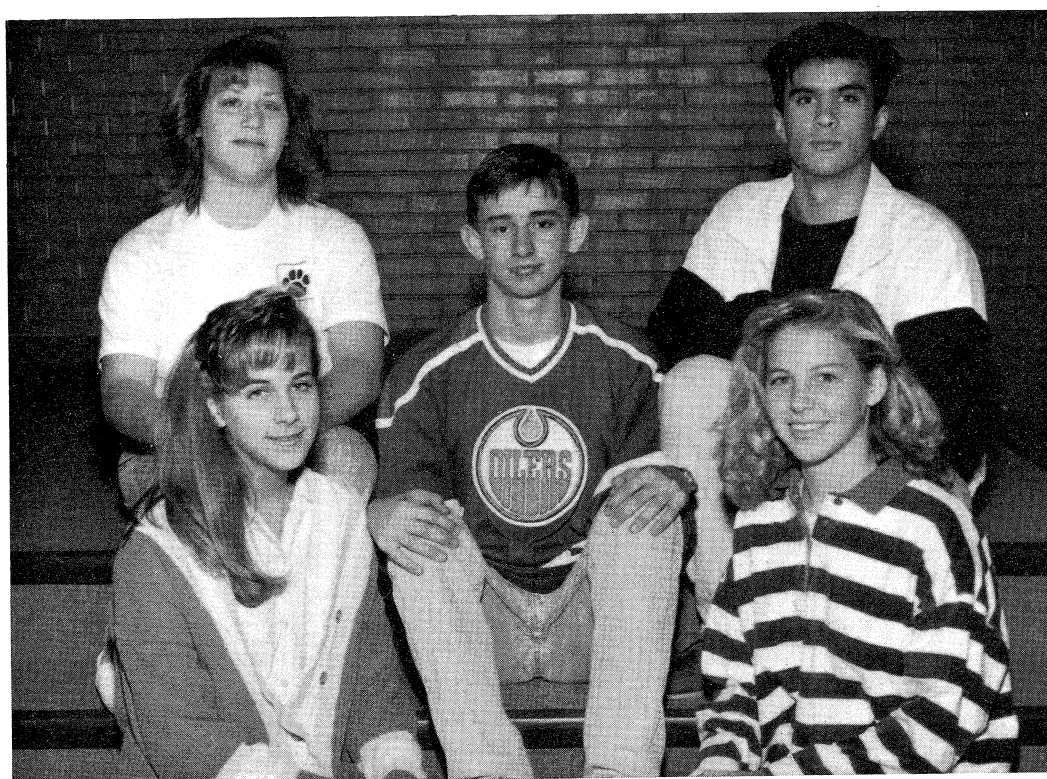
SOPHOMORES

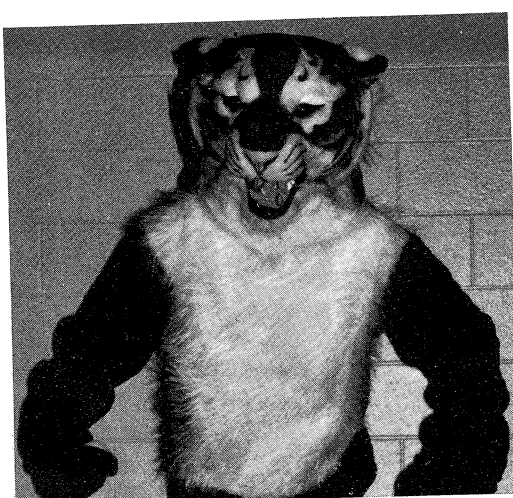
"This move may have been the hardest on the sophomores," commented Mrs. Greenhalgh on the transition from the junior high to the high school.

However, they succeeded in surviving the move. Though difficult for some, it was all-in-all a much awaited change making the adjustments to the high school easier.

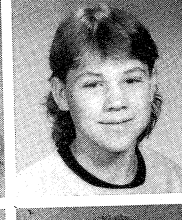
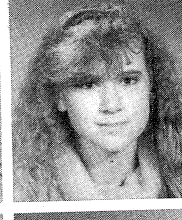
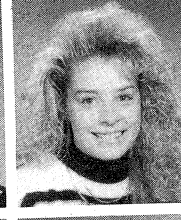
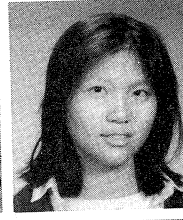
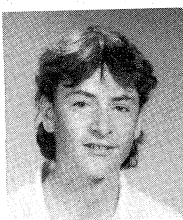
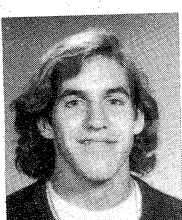

No one got stuffed in lockers or trash cans or toilets. In fact, they turned out to be one of the best freshman classes ever. It just goes to show that good things can come in small packages.

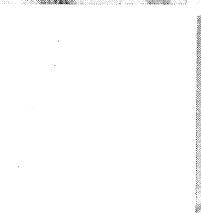
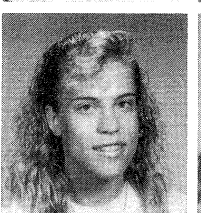
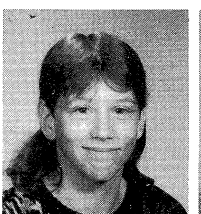
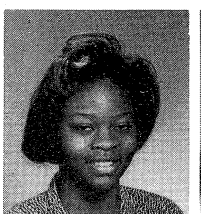
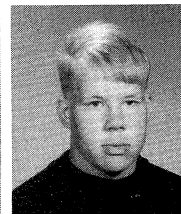
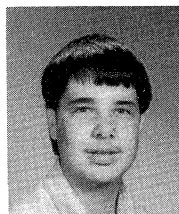
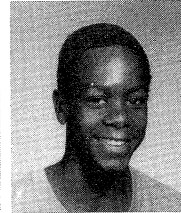
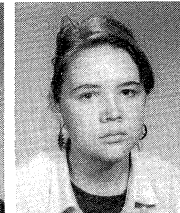
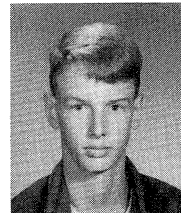
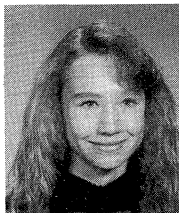
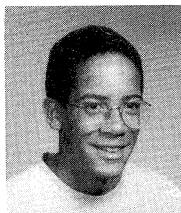
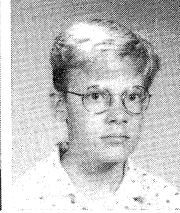
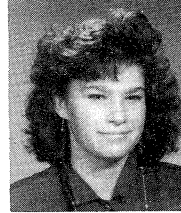
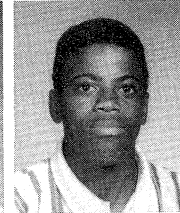
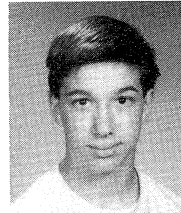
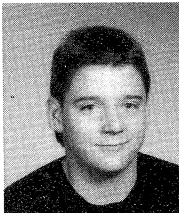
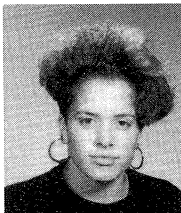
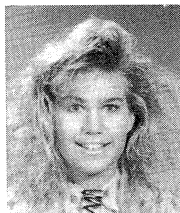
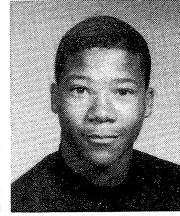
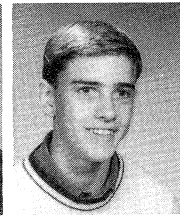
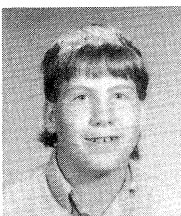
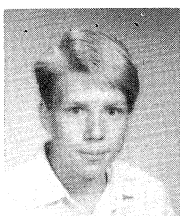


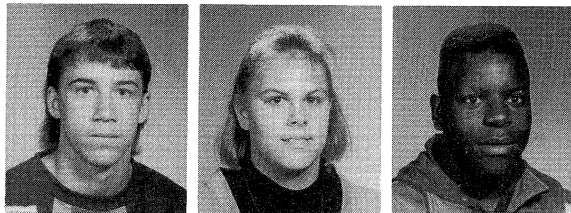

This was also the first year that freshmen had participated in the whirl of Homecoming activities.

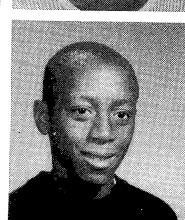
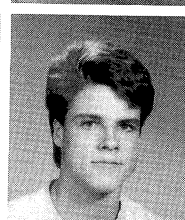
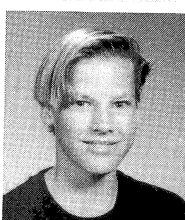
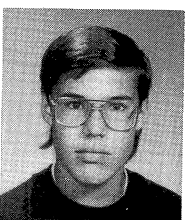
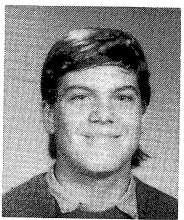
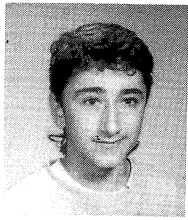
"It was a really busy week, but it was so much fun. I can't wait till next year," said one stimulated freshman about Homecoming week.

ble for the romantic atmosphere.

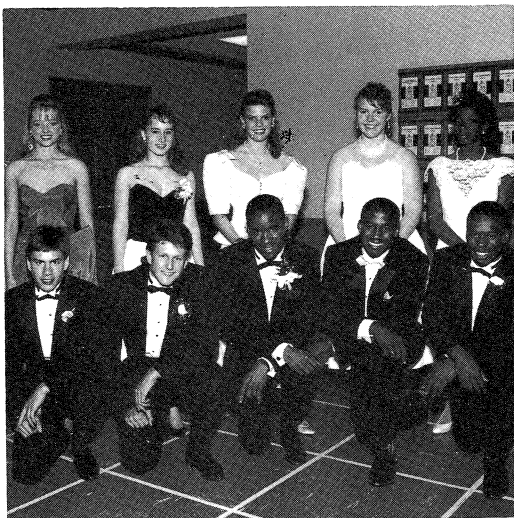

UHS Excellence

Each year at Urbana High School many students are awarded special recognition for their excellence in extracurricular involvement, leadership, community service, or academic pursuits. In acknowledgement of the time and dedication these students put into making these awards possible the Rosemary has set aside this page to honor some of them for their achievement.

Writing Challenge: This year Rachel Katzenellenbogen and Adam Wilson became the first students at Urbana to place at the creative writing challenge held at the U of I. The challenge is a timed, collaborative, impromptu writing contest that asks students to examine and argue a current controversial issue. Rachel and Adam were awarded first in the senior division for their piece.

National Merit

Finalist/Semi-Finalist: Each year students from high schools throughout the nation are selected to be national merit scholars based on their PSAT scores. At Urbana Tom Trimble was the lone student selected for this honor. John Connor, Jason Hayden, and Alan Ostergren were designated commended scholars and Eric Lewis and Gabe Williams were also recognized for their performances on the test.

Principal Scholars: The Principal Scholars Program (or PSP) honored another group of students this year for their leadership, involvement, and achievement. Being selected as a Principal Scholar was an important honor because it makes them eligible for a variety of scholarships.

Chess Team: Few clubs at Urbana High School have consistently attained the type of excellence that the chess team is renowned for. In 1987 the chess team finished first in the state championship chess meet. They have followed up that great performance by finishing third in the state each of the last two years.

DAR/SAR Award: Once again the

Daughters and Sons of the American Revolution sponsored their annual award to recognize good citizenship. The criteria that the faculty at U.H.S. considered when voting on students for this award included: leadership, dependability, service, and patriotism. This year's recipients were Rachel Katzenellenbogen and David Traugott.

Speech Team: The speech team had tremendous success at the regional tournament where the team finished fifth and Shauna Whetten, John Schomberg, Matt Tepper, and Eben Gillette all qualified for sectionals in their individual events. Shauna also qualified for All-State competition by winning at the Urbana Invitational and the Regional Tournament.

Music: This year there were three individuals Robert Klug, Jenny Woodward, and Elizabeth Lim, who excelled far beyond the

parameters of the classroom in music. Robert, an accomplished trumpet player, is now playing on a regular basis with the Chicago Youth Symphony and has already won a music scholarship for his achievement in competition. Jenny, who plays the clarinet, placed third in district competition this year which qualified her for the All-State Band. Elizabeth was a finalist in the Stravinsky International Piano Competition. This is the highest competition that young musicians have the opportunity to play in.

Senior of the Year: On May 10, 1990 the Rosemary Outstanding Senior Award was presented to Adam Wilson for his accomplishments throughout high school. Also honored were Todd Fryer, Rachel Katzenellenbogen, John Smith, and Alan Ostergren. The winner of this prestigious award was selected through the voting of the student body at Urbana. The criteria for the award is a student who: maintains a good academic record, participates in school activities, assumes leadership responsibilities, works congenially in the school community, and achieves excellence in areas not necessarily academic.

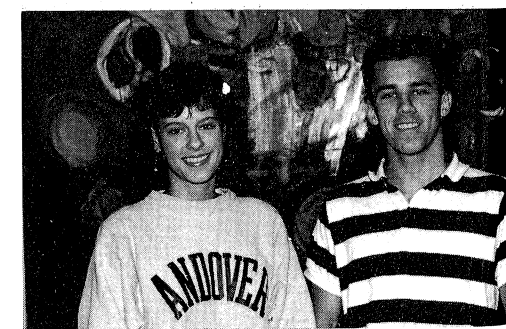

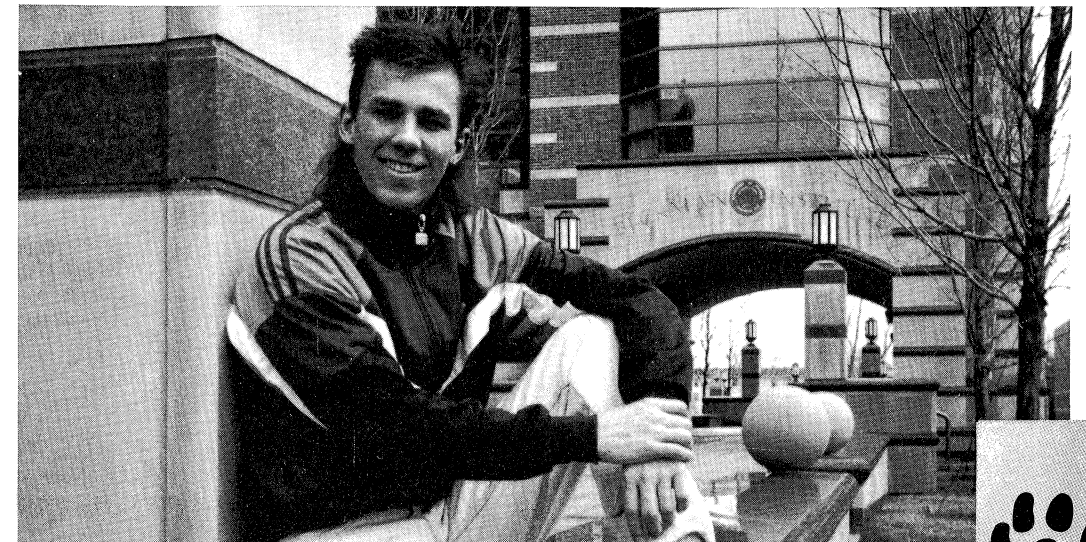

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The Year in Review

August

The continued decline of Communism affected Poland this month. With the political shrewdness of Lech Walesa, a new government was formed which peacefully pushed Communism aside. In the United States, we chuckled at the stubbornness of Zsa Zsa Gabor after she was incarcerated for slapping a police officer. Janet Jackson debuted her new album "Rhythm Nation 1814."

On August 23 UHS students walked the renovated halls of the new school for the first time as school began its first day.



September

South Africa elected their new President, F.W. deKlerk. Due to his obvious disregard to attempt any black-white negotiations, violence broke out which marked one of the bloodiest battles in South Africa since 1985. In the occupied West Bank, Yasir Arafat got fed up with what he considered a lack of concern by the U.S. for the PLO's movement. The U.S. had discontinued peace talks between the Palestines and Isrod, and many PLO members feared what no negotiations would come about. President Bush waged his war on drugs this month by nationally broadcasting a speech where he asked the entire nation to get behind him and help stop this serious problem. Jim Bakker's trial closed the chapter on his charade when he was found guilty on 24 counts of fraud and conspiracy.

November

The walls came tumbling down in November, literally. The Berlin Wall, which was erected in 1961, came down at the hands of its people. After more than 28 years the city was reunited as one, and the people were free to walk the streets of East and West Berlin without fear. What was only a dream became a long awaited reality. Continued fighting in El Salvador claimed the lives of 6 Jesuit priests and hundreds of other citizens that were stalked down by the infamous death squads. The great piano player Vladimir Horowitz at age 86 died this month. He was considered the last great romantic for he captured a genuine 19th and 20th century sound. Paul McCartney's solo tour hit the states, and as always was a show to please. Once again the annual Student Senate Thanksgiving Dinner was a success serving over 500 people on Thanksgiving Day.

December

Just a month after the Berlin Wall came down and the government's reign over its people, Hungary, Czechoslovakia, and Bulgaria followed this pattern. The once powerful government control in these countries crumbled, and the people were free from fear. Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev and President Bush met at the Malta Summit this month with ideas of loosening the socialist world in the Soviet Union and sketching an arms-control plan for both countries to follow. Leona Helmsley, "the Queen of Mean," received her sentence for tax evasion in December that added up to \$7.1 million in fines, 750 hours of community service, and 4 years in jail.

October

The United States shook along with the rest of the world in October as we watched the horror of the '89 earthquake in California. The earthquake which struck the Hayward Fault on October 17, 1989 just across the San Francisco Bay caused an excess of detrimental damage. An estimate of 400 people were killed along with thousands of others who received injury. Another major "quake" occurred in the U.S. due to the start of the Rolling Stones American Tour. The English group rocked the U.S. from coast to coast selling out show after show.

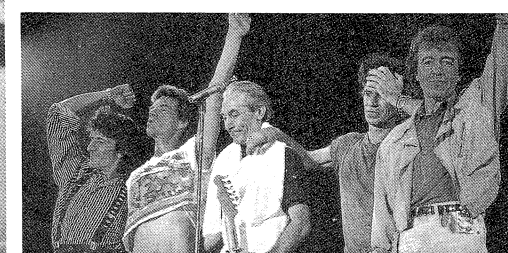
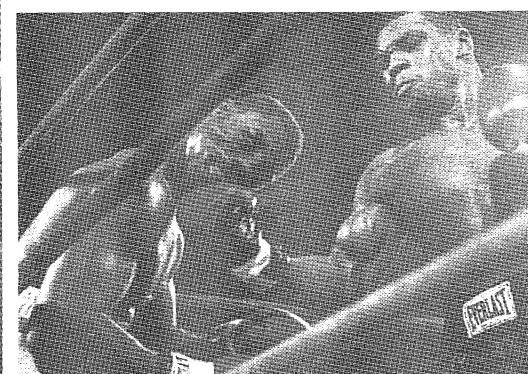
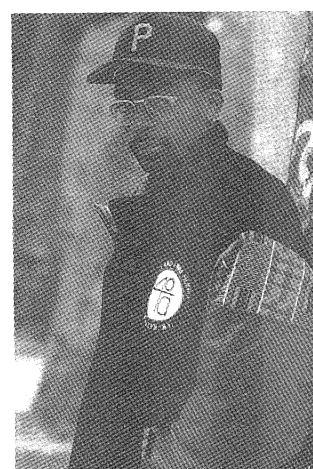
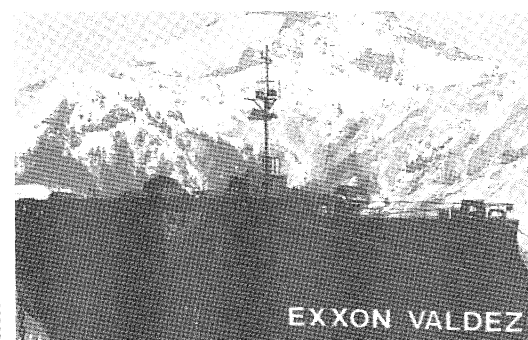
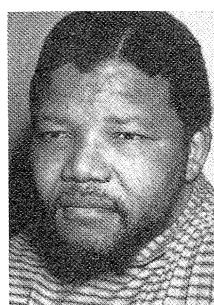
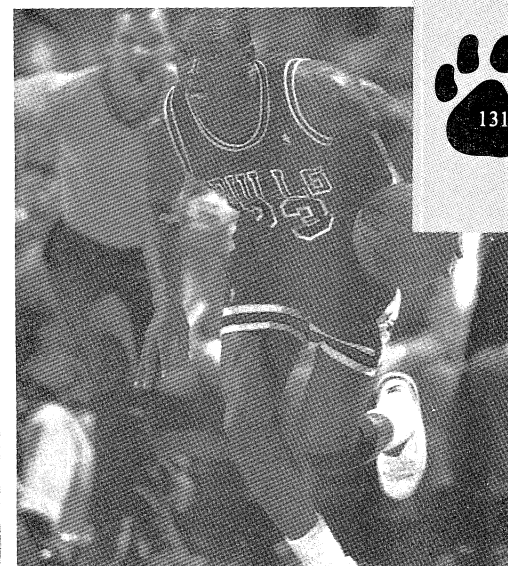
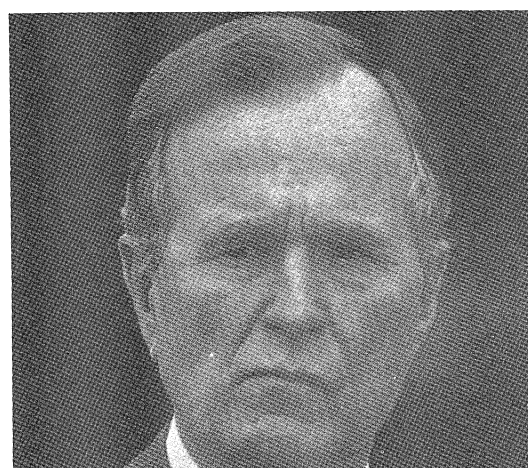
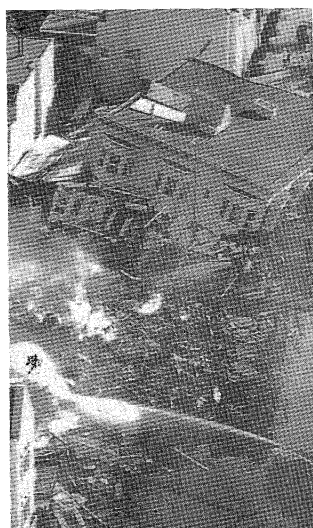
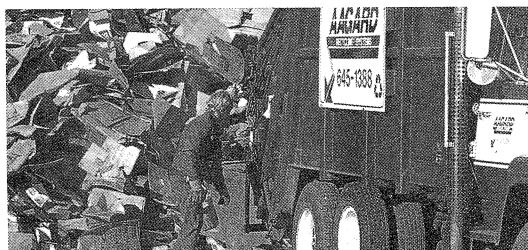
February

After 27 years of imprisonment in South Africa, Nelson Mandela the renowned political prisoner was released from his confinement. The ice storm of 1990 struck the Champaign-Urbana area severely in February. For nearly 5 days 15000 local residents were without power which wiped out all local schools for 3 days. Many trees in the area took an extreme beating from the ice which caused much of the local damage and took several weeks to clean up. UHS hosted the annual midwinter conference in its newly remodeled school and also celebrated Black History Month with several assemblies sponsored by MIA.

January

January 1, 1990, the start of not only a new year, but a new decade in which all sorts of exciting events occurred. President Bush ordered an invasion of Panama in order to arrest their leader and drug lord, Manuel Noriega. After several days of hiding, Noriega gave himself up to U.S. forces. There was also some exciting times in sports during January. Joe Montana led the San Francisco 49ers to their second consecutive Super Bowl championship. There was a mild winter for UHS students this year except for a few days in January when winter reared its ugly head and the temperatures fell twenty degrees below zero. The students of UHS experienced several sleepless nights trying to cram a semesters worth of work into 15 hours of studying for the infamous Finals.

ings and moved in to make this their new home.

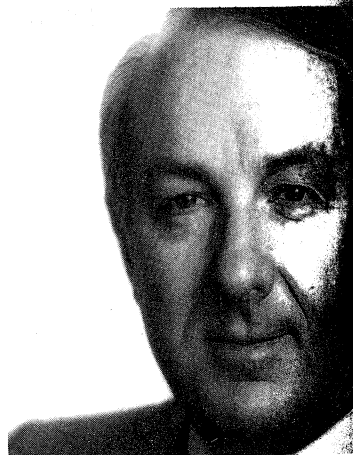
