## BAPTIST GENERAL STATE CONVENTION

The 82nd Annual Session of the Baptist General State Convention of Illinois convened at the Providence Baptist Church, Chicago, Illinois, June 4 - 8, 1984. Attending from Salem were Pastor and Sister Shelby, and daughter, Faith, on Thursday, June 7.

One of the bright spots of the day was a stirring message preached by the president of the National Baptist Convention USA, Inc., Dr. T. J. Jemison. His message centered around the thought, "Now is the Time." In it he emphasized the importance of our people doing something constructive, economically to make our future secure. He is asking onemillion of the over seven million members of our National Convention make a one-time contribution to be combined and invested, which would bring returns to the contributors on a monthly basis at retirement.

The day's highlight was the annual message brought by President R. B. Lyles. This was his final annual message, after serving the convention for the past sixteen years in that capacity. His message was very spiritual and soul-stirring.

#### THE TRINIDAD STORY

On May 14, 1984 Pastor Shelby and I left St. Louis International Airport for Miami, Florida enroute to Port of Spain Trinidad. We boarded our Eastern Airline at 6:10 p.m. As we began to climb out over the ocean, we could look down and see a boat far off in the distance. The sky was a beautiful blue, with fluffy white clouds scattered about. As we soared higher, we could look down and the clouds looked like beautiful puffs of snow. My mind went back to the book of Genesis, the first chapter, where it says, "In the begin-ning God created the heavens and the earth." To see these beauties of the world, I knew that nothing but a God could make something as orderly as our universe. I said to myself, "what a mighty God we serve."

After a brief stop at the Barbados Airport, we traveled on to Port of Spain where we were met by Rev. Nelton Richardson. We spent the night there; and the next morning I traveled by car to Cocoyea Village where Rev. Richardson lives. Pastor Shelby and Rev. Richardson went to the television station where they appeared on a public affairs program.

We attended several churches where the pastor preached; and ten souls accepted Christ into their lives. They worship pretty much as we do, but they do not have many choirs or pianos, so everyone joins in and sings acappella. All the women there have to wear a hat or some type of head covering when entering the church.

As I rushed to finish this quarter's issue of Salem Speaks, I sat in my office thinking, "how can I get around writing my closing remarks?" I simply did not have time to be creative -- and finish the necessary typing and layout, before my deadline. I looked around my office for a quick idea, and what immediately came to mind was "confusion" -- mass confusion. Besides realizing that my office needed to be straightened out, I imagined that other (normally very wellorganized) people must be feeling some of the same confusion and state of panic as me.

We are indeed living in a day and time that is filled with confusion at every level. New things are happening in the political arena -- a black presidential candidate and a woman vice-presidential candidate?! Religious freedom in America is fading fast -- religious leaders are going to jail. Brand new incurable diseases are cropping up -rather than cures for old ones. People are constantly tampering with medicine, food, mouthwash, and even Girl Scout cookies! A day care center was recently closed for sexually abusing one and two-year old children, and the list gets longer and longer.

With so much going on at once, it's not easy to offer consolution to people who feel as I do -- that there must be an end to all of this soon. I will say, though, that "God's grace is sufficient for you ...." (II Corinthians 12:9). His power is made perfect in our weakness. This lets me know that things will not get the best of me, no matter how weak I feel at times. I can always rely on God's grace.

There are other people who, in the midst of everything, do not feel weighed down by all this confusion, but would like to make sense of a very puzzling situation. They need (and search for) answers to all life's mysteries. For those persons I recommend this "Trust in the Lord with all thine heart and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge Him and He shall direct thy paths ...." (Proverbs 3:5-6)

My week's study centered around Christian Education. Information was gleaned from our class study that will be helpful as we strengthen our Department of Christian Education. Sister Shelby's class dealt with youth work and Faith studied on the Baptist Youth Fellowship.

On Wednesday, Dr. Jemison delivered a message to the Congress. In it he reinforced the idea of economic progress for our people, which he talked about at our State Convention. On Thursday afternoon, June 21, the Reverend Jesse Jackson paid a visit to the Congress. He brought an inspiring message to a nearcapacity crowd. Dr. Jemison, who had invited the Reverend Jackson, called for a day of appreciation for him in Baptist churches around the country on the first Sunday in July or some other designated day.

Dr. T. Oscar Chappelle, Sr., President of the National Baptist Congress of Christian Education, brought his annual message on Thursday evening. He dealt with the Congress theme, "Teaching and Growing Our Churches Through Evangelism." His scripture text was from Habakkuk 2:2. He said, "to me the program of Christian Education in the local church has to be made plain so that those who participate in the program can be better prepared in the field of Christian Education." He pointed out the need to return to Baptist doctrine, and Biblical preaching.

In a short column like this, it is difficult to condense such a report and yet do it justice. I trust that you have gained some insight from these few words. Further, I hope that you gain more from those things that we infuse into our overall program.

> "I ascend up to heaven, thou art there: if I make my bed in hell, behold, thou art there. If I take the wings of the morning, and dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea, even there shall thy hand lead me" (Psalm 139: 8-10).

Our biggest and greatest day was the day of Fellowship that was held in Port of Spain on Sunday, May 20. It was held at the Jean Pierre Complex Stadium where 3,000-4,000 people gathered to worship the Lord. There were also singers from other churches. Rev. Fitzroy Richardson preached that morning; and our own pastor preached the afternoon message. Both messages were very inspiring. It is not very often that you can get that many people to come together and give praises to God. It really made me feel good to know that this can be done, if we, as God's children, can unite in a spirit of love and put our trust in Him.

Trinidad is a small country with lots of fruit trees, sugar cane, coffee, cocoa, and coconut trees. It is very densely populated with trees. The roads are very narrow, and the people drive on the left side of the streets. It takes a long time to drive from place to place; and there are many traffic jams, because of so many cars on the roads. The weather in Trinidad was hot and humid, so it was uncomfortable for me; but the people there were very kind and friendly to us. We enjoyed their hospitality. Everyone wanted to feed us (and we had to accept).

It was a great experience for me, and I thank the Lord that he blessed me to be able to make the trip.
