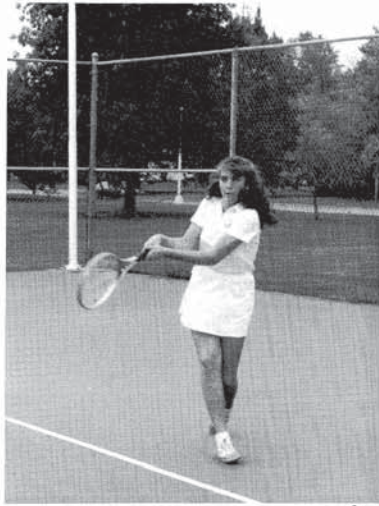

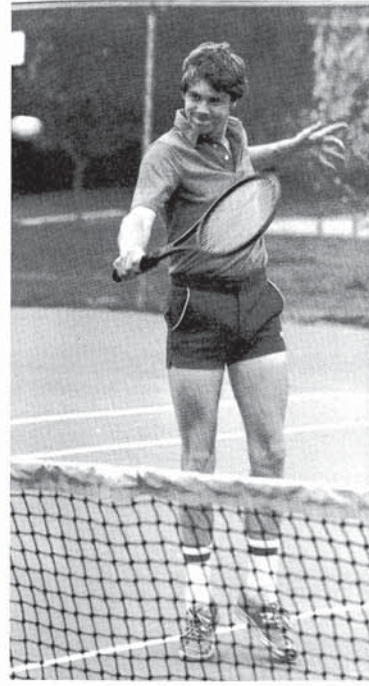

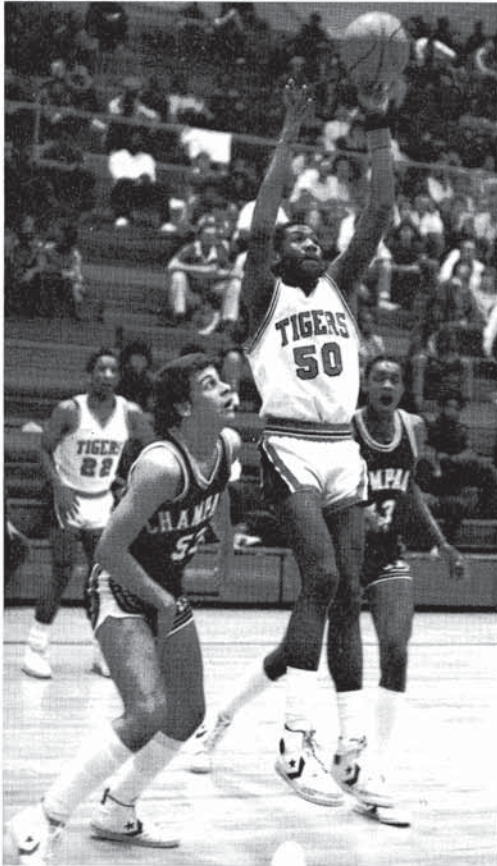

season record was 22-7



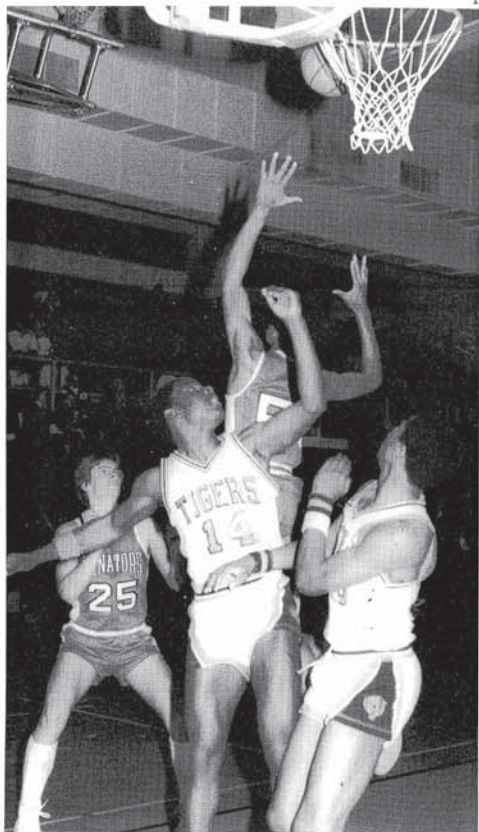

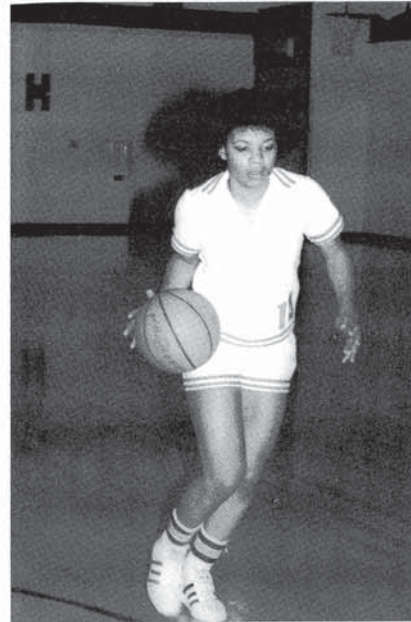

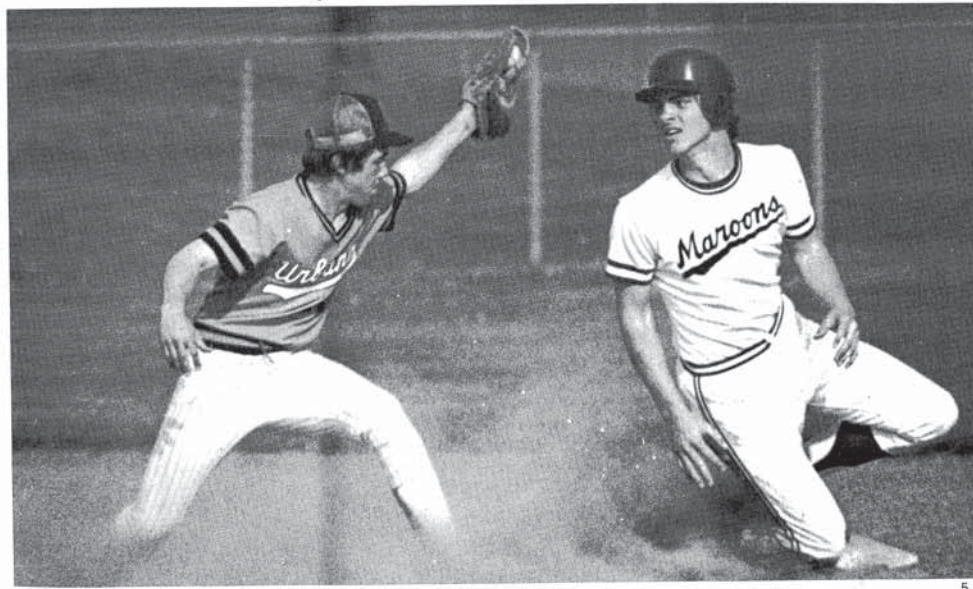
