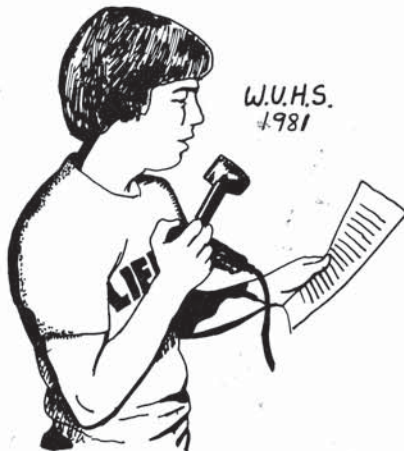

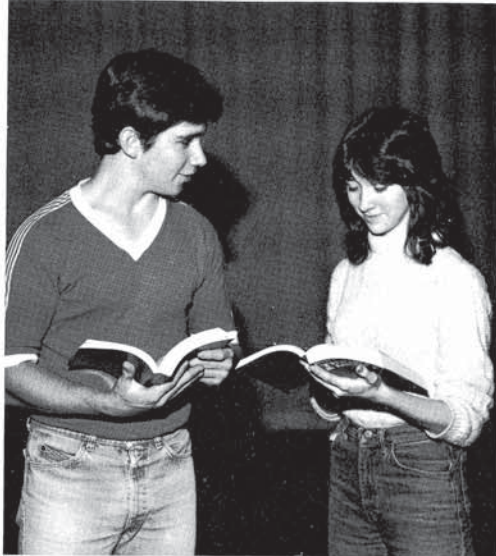

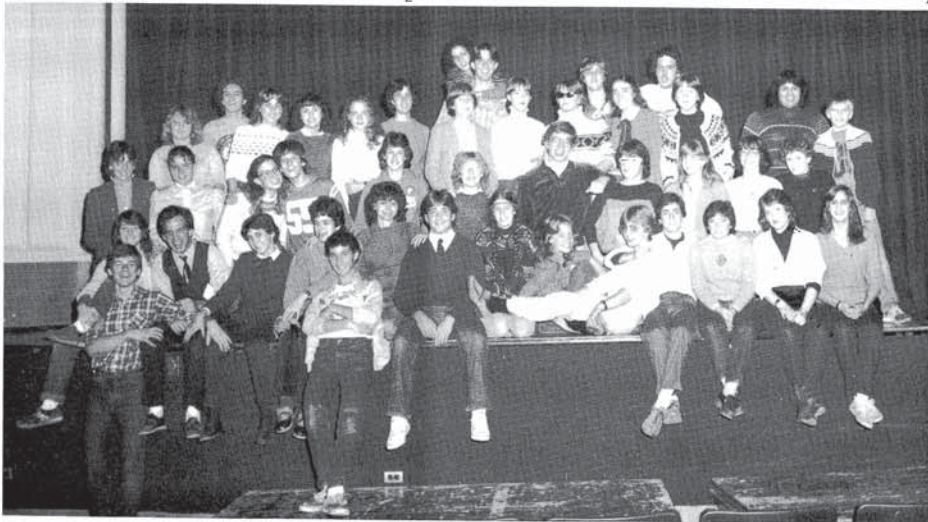

# Speech team forges full s

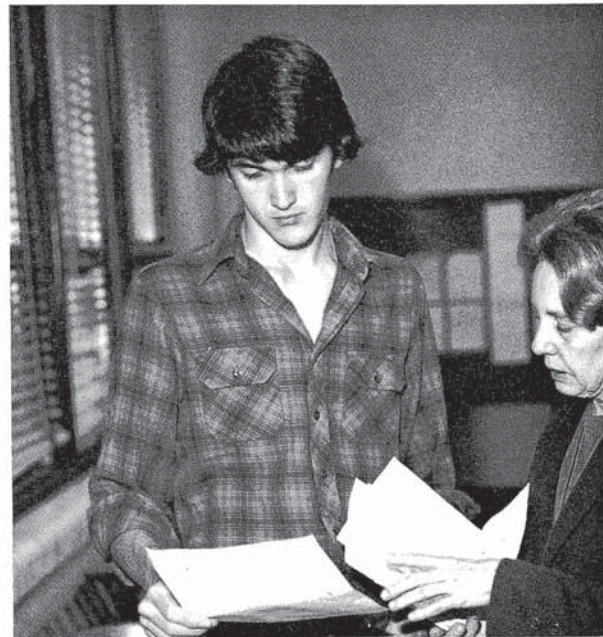

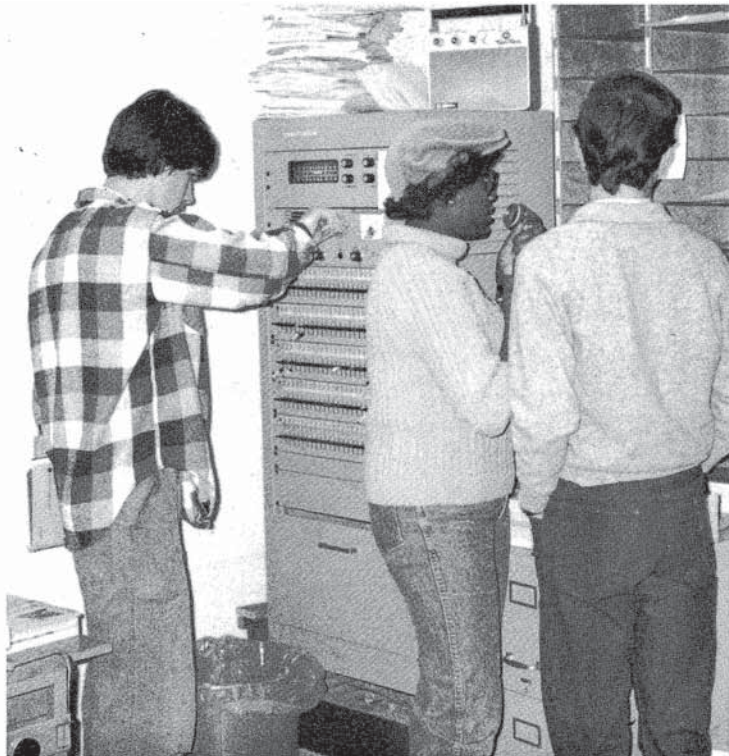

After the football season, the marching band became the concert band and began preparing for concerts and music competitions. Later in the year, the concert band participated in district and state competition.

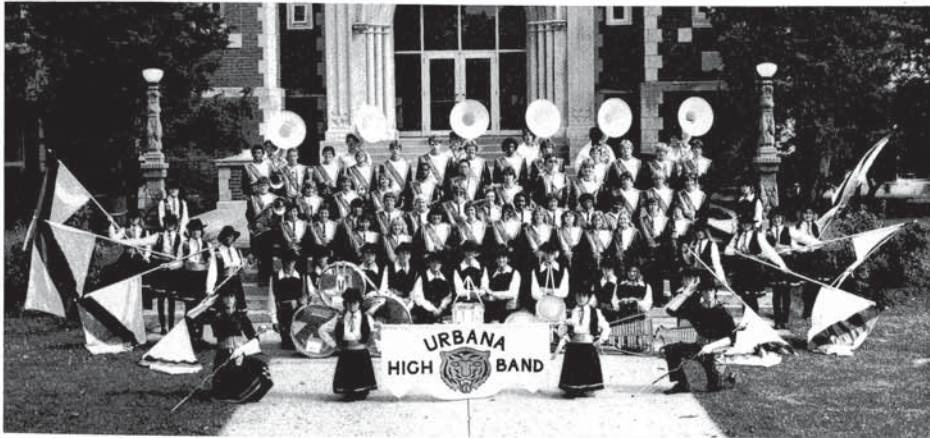

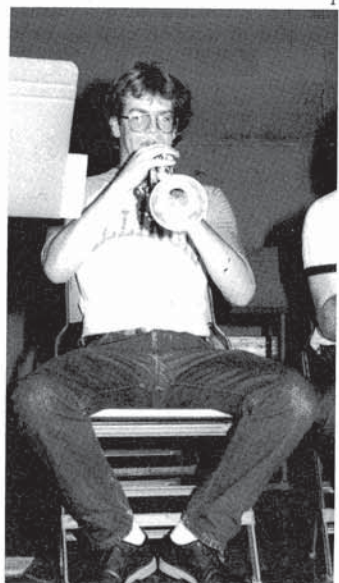

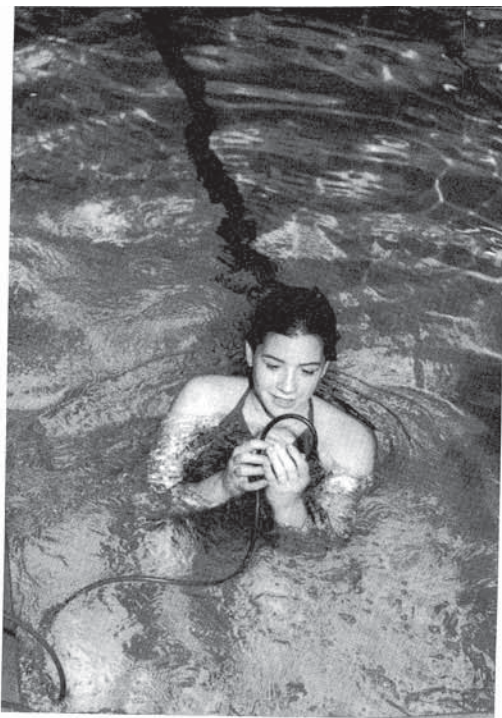
## Girls Synch flicks



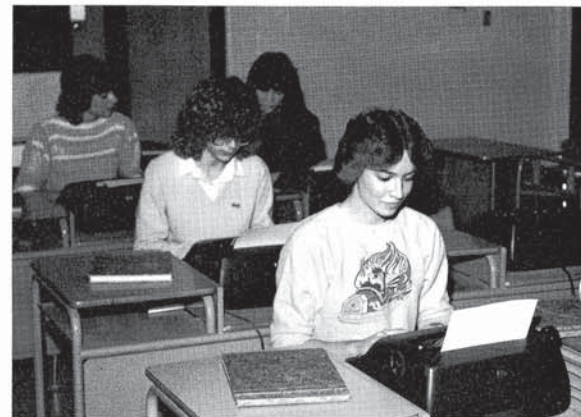

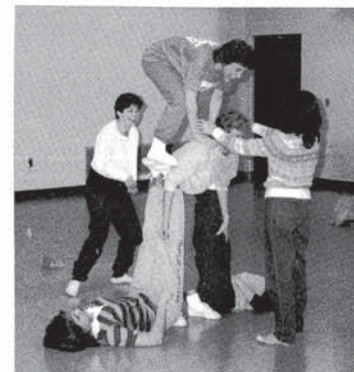
