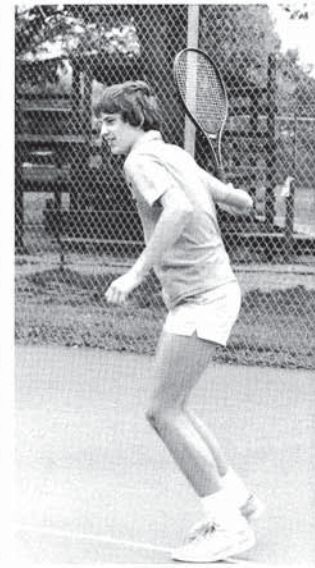
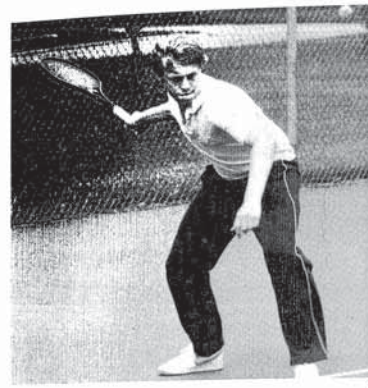

Boys Go 10-5; Send One To State

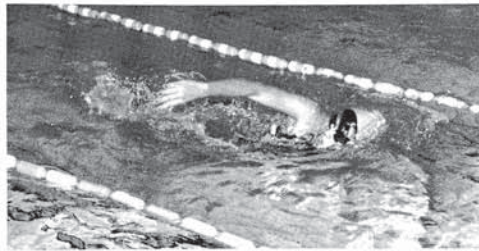
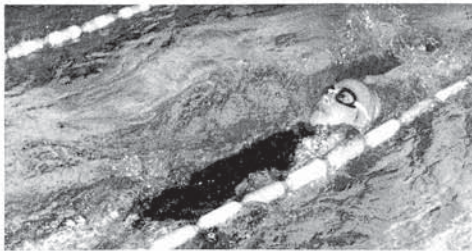

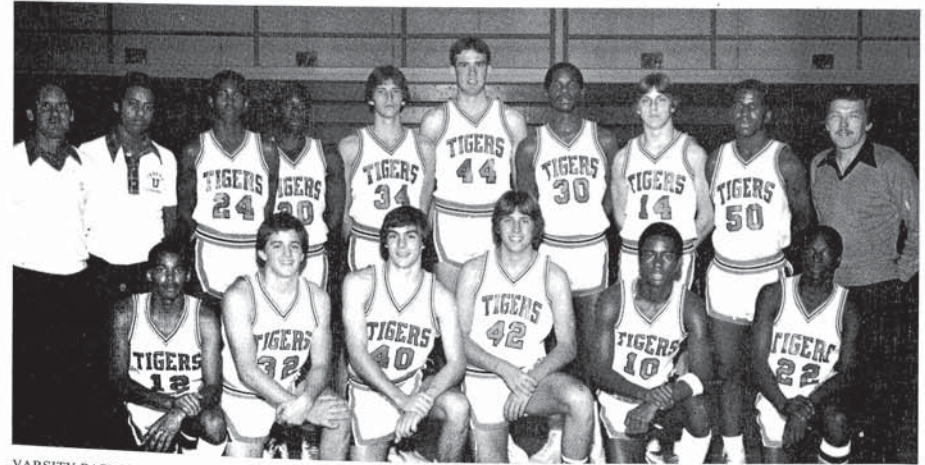

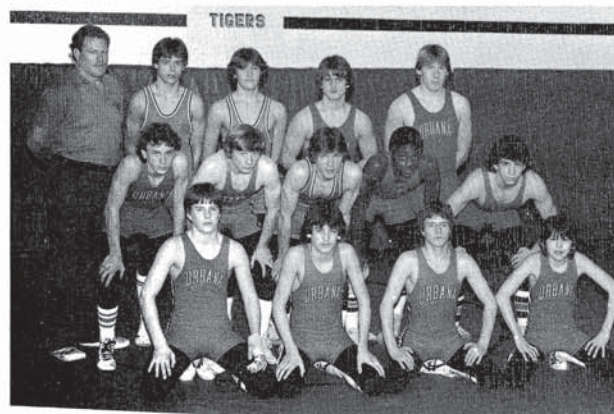

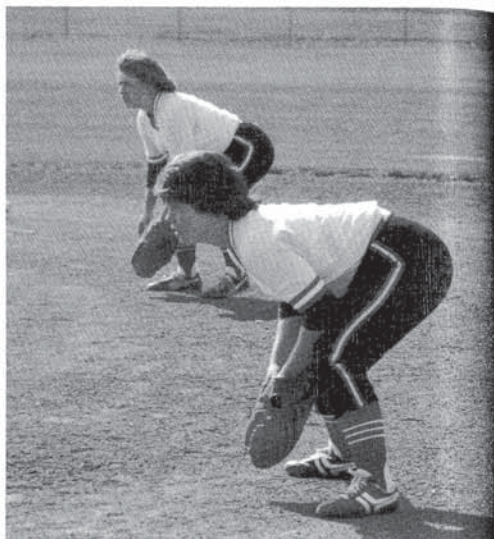
