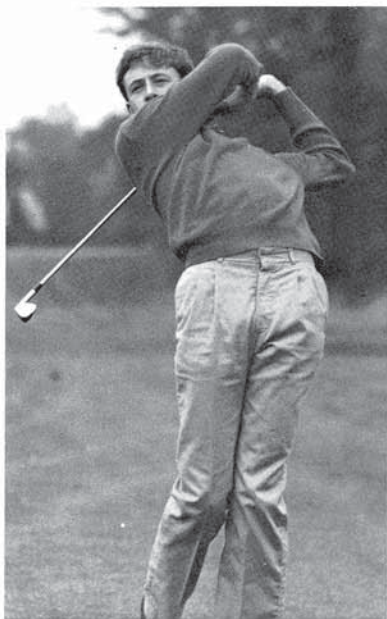

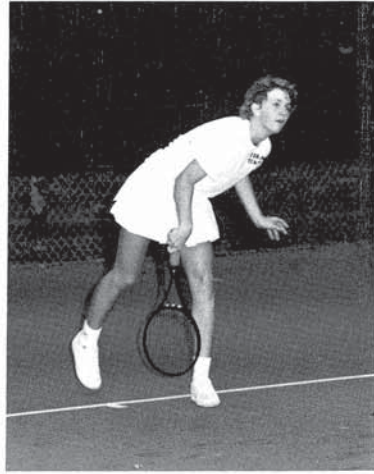

Boys Raise Rackets

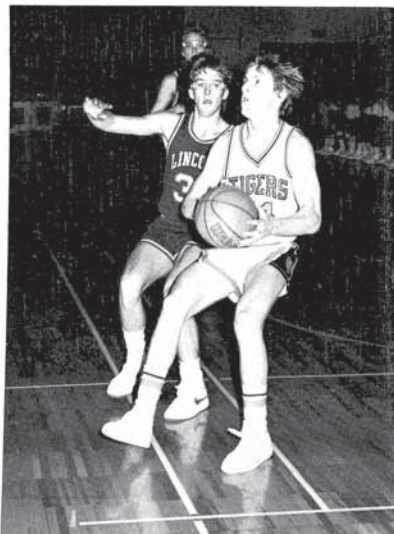

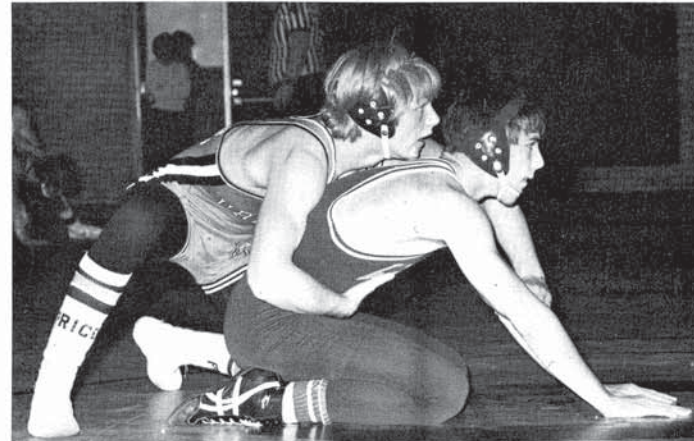
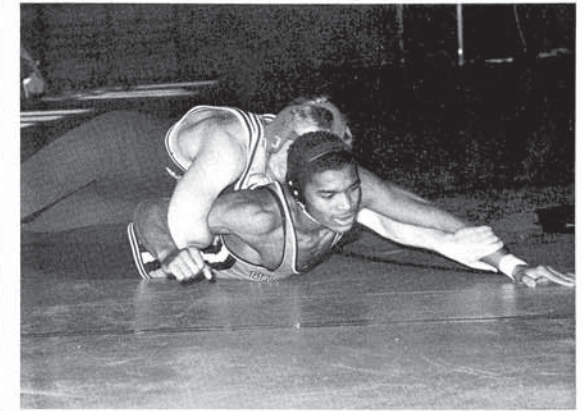
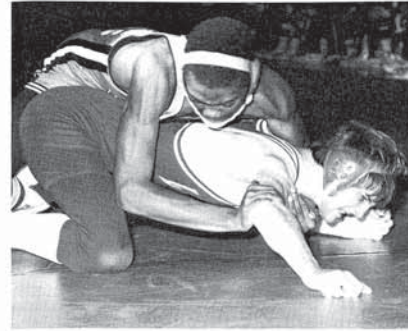
Tigers Snarl Off Invaders

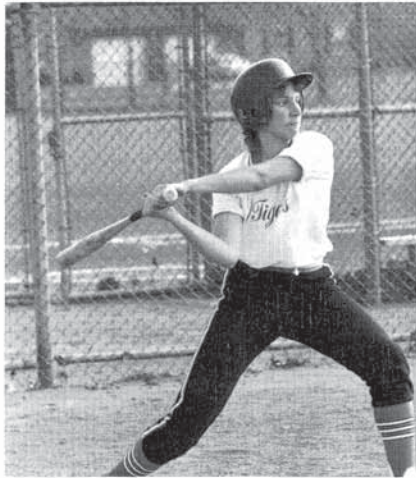

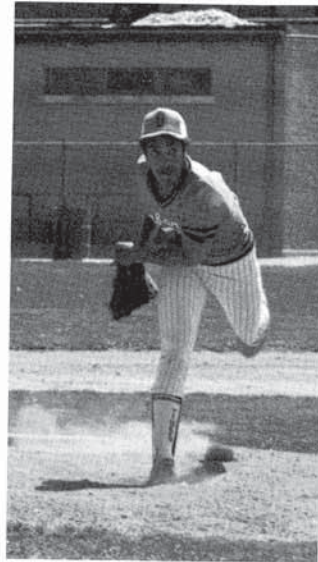
The girls wound up and set a respectable 15-8 season in the record books. After Big 12 competition, the girls played through three games in Re-

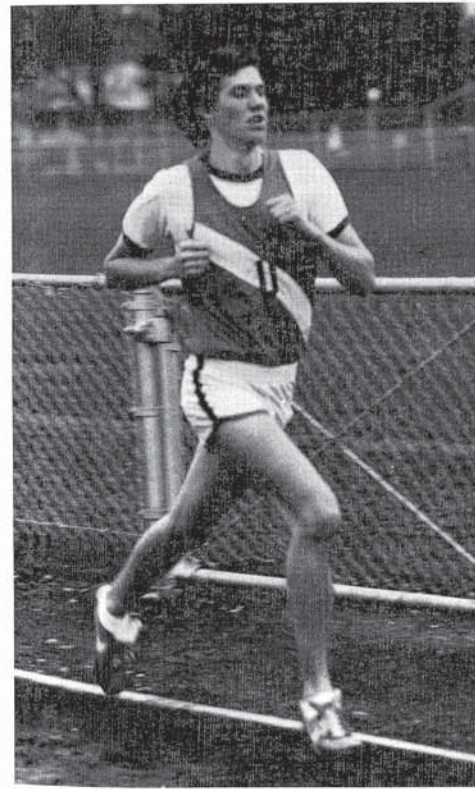
