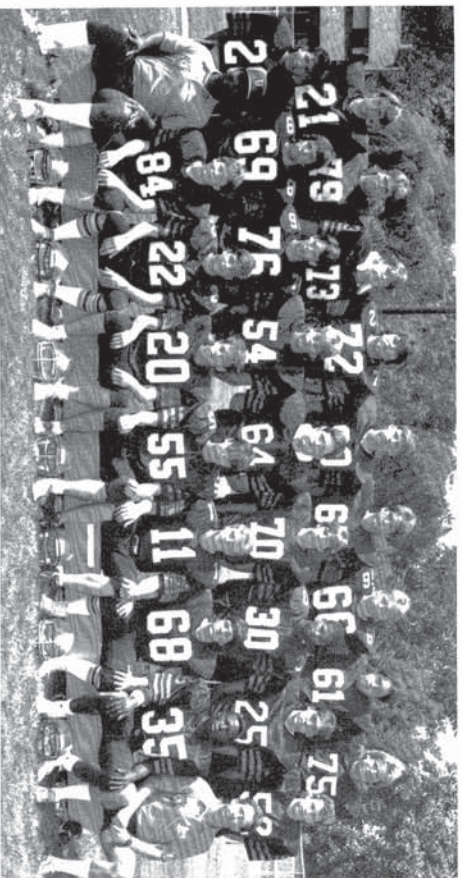

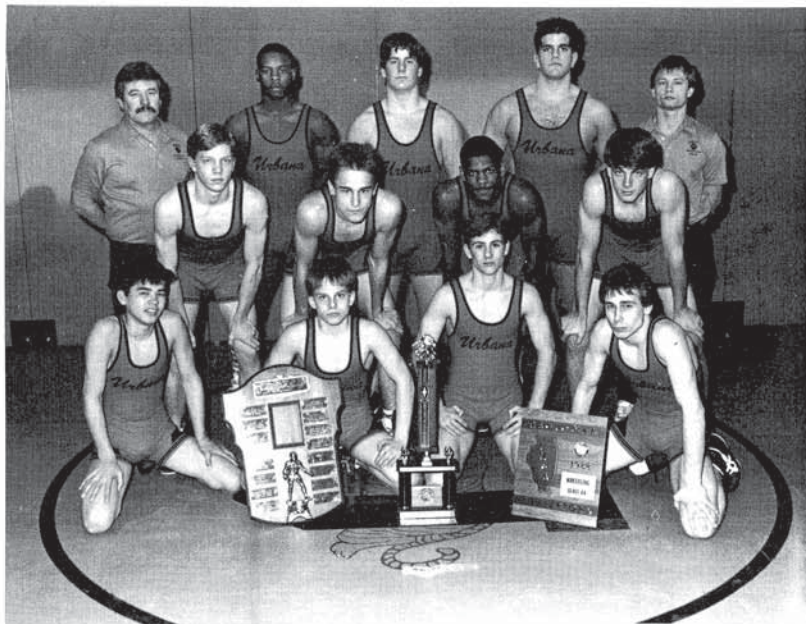


Grapplers Pin The Competition

Due to the renovation, the team had to find new accommodations for practices and home dual meets. These changes, however, didn't affect the grapplers' performance. They ended the season with a winning record of 14-8 and became twin-city champions for the sixth year in a row. They also made good showings at tournaments, placing tenth out of 24 teams at the Rockford Boylan Invitational; fourth out of 12 teams at the Morton Invitational; and won first place in their own Invitational against 11 other teams. In the Big 12 Conference meet, Urbana fell short of Bloomington and placed second. Matt Madsen walked away with the Most Outstanding Wrestler award of that meet. 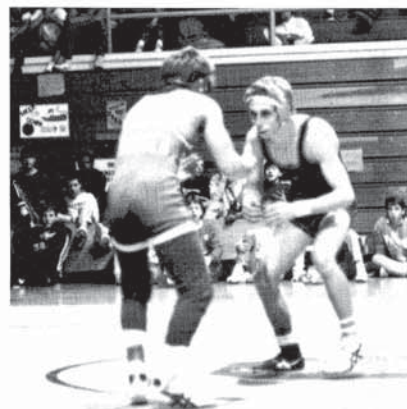

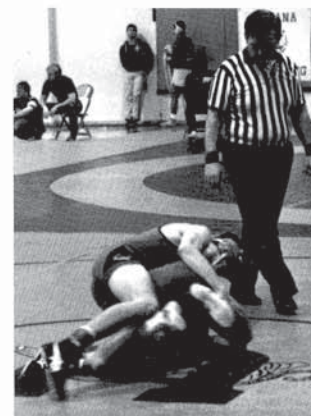

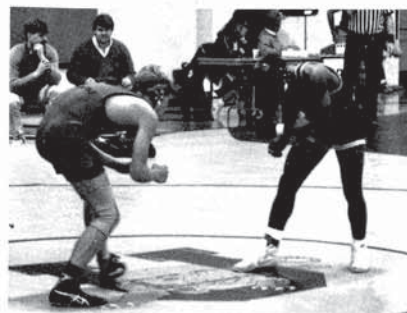

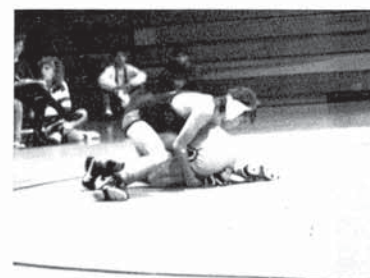

Boys Give Their All

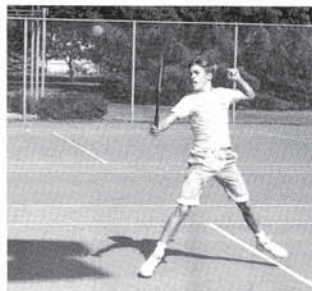

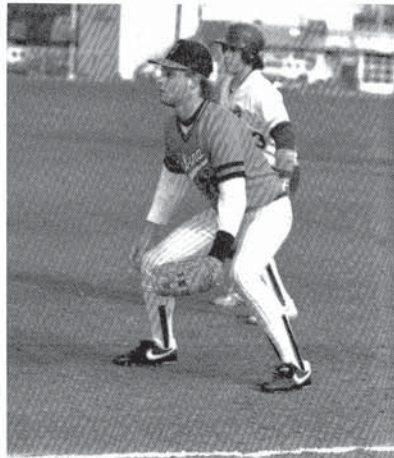

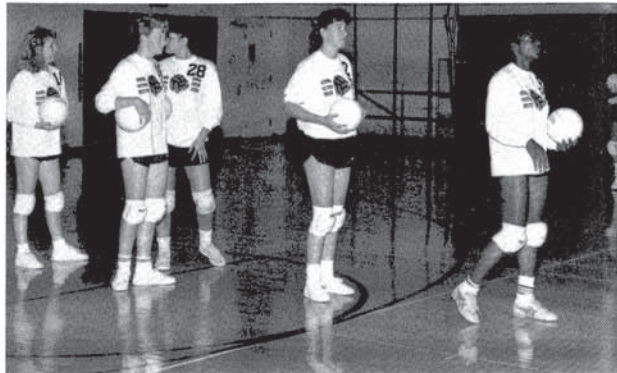

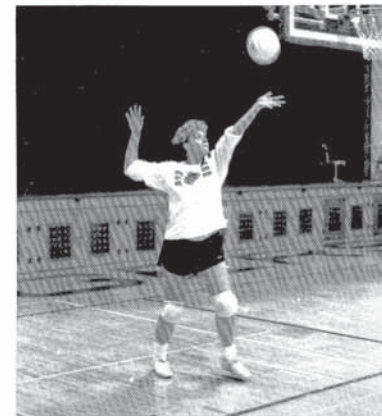

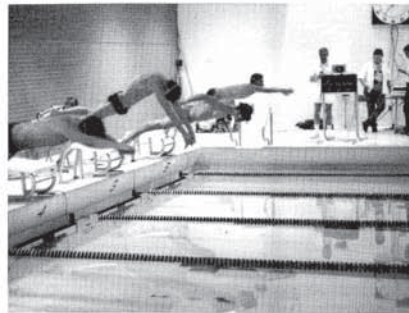

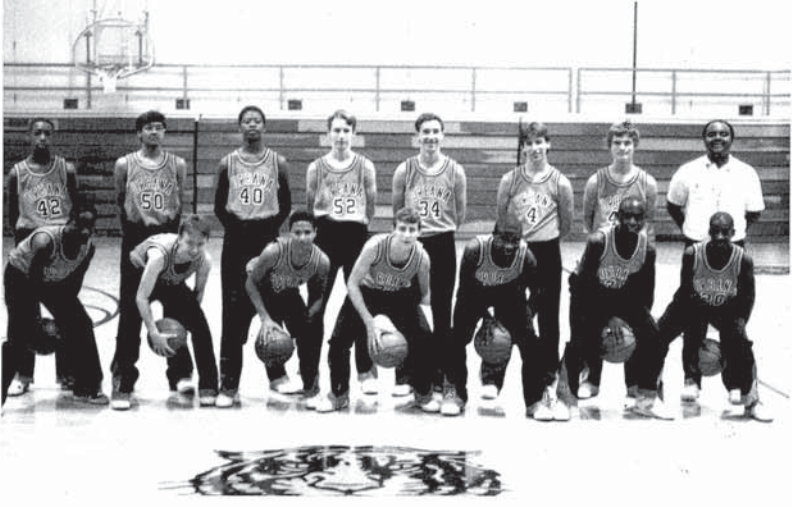

Their dual meet record was 5-2, while during the season, they finished 5th at the Springfield Invitational in a tough field of runners, and also turned in a third place finish at the Big 12 meet. After finishing 4th at the Regional meet in Danville, the Girl's Cross-Country team moved on to the Sectional meet, which was for the first time since 1982. 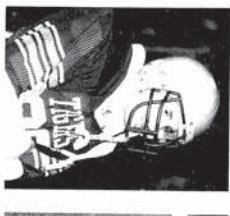
