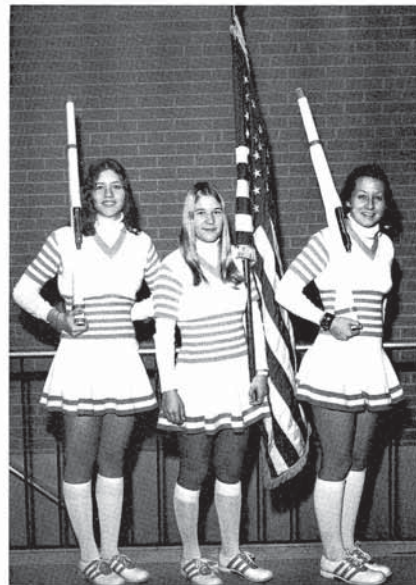

As early as Student registration in the fall, Student Council members have had their hands full.

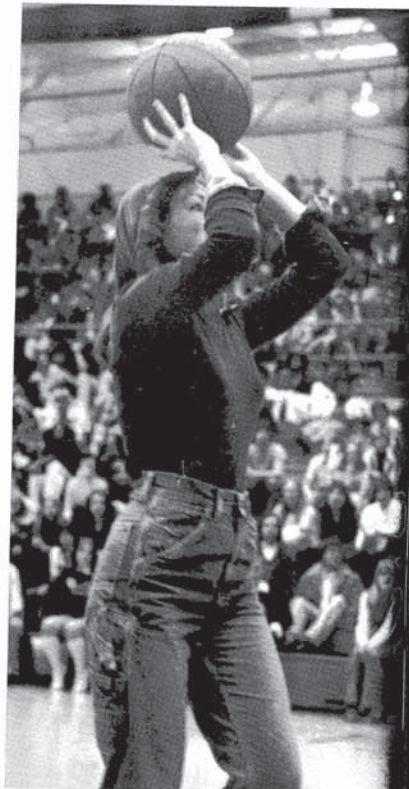
Under the direction of Student Council President Dave Neuman, and sponsor George Valentine, the club carried out many new ideas.

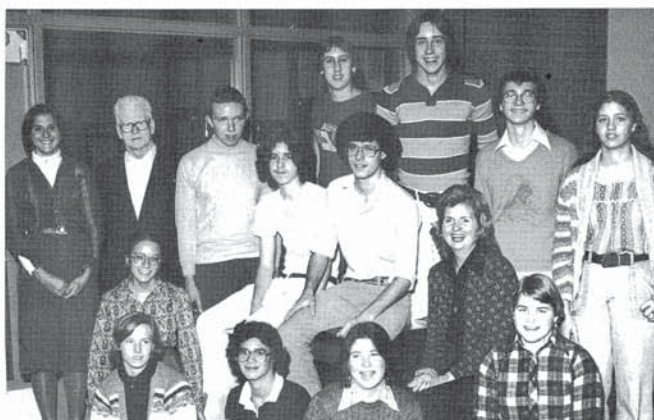

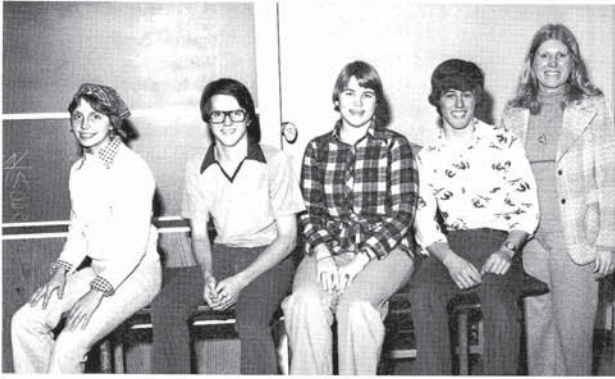

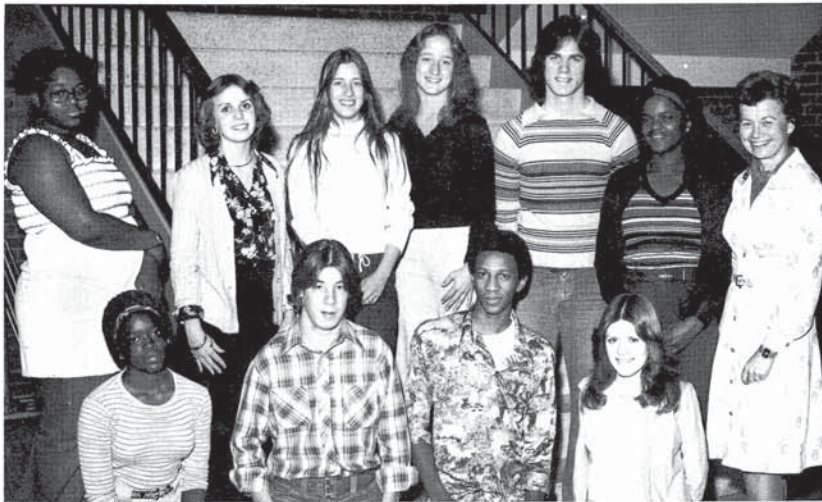
