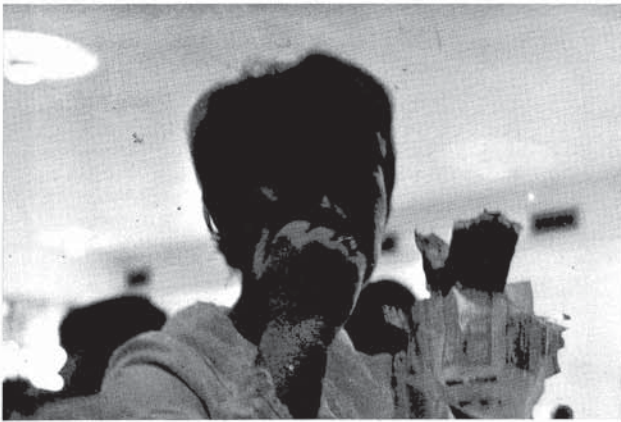

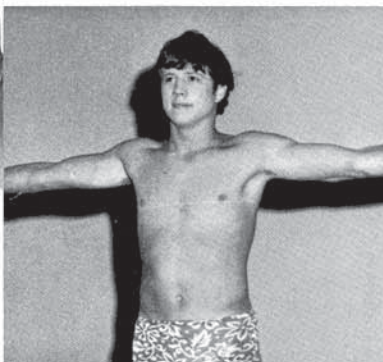

the same hush you came from.

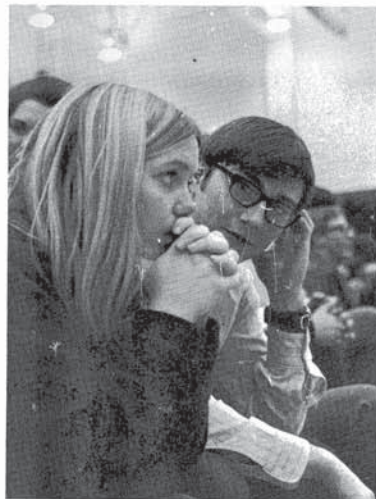

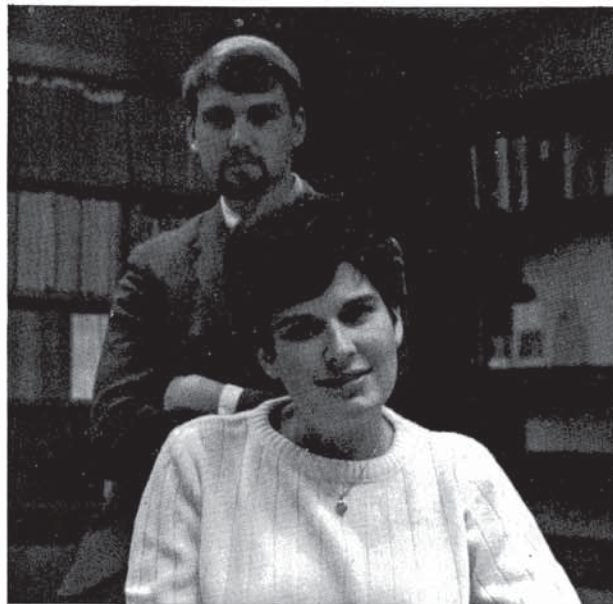

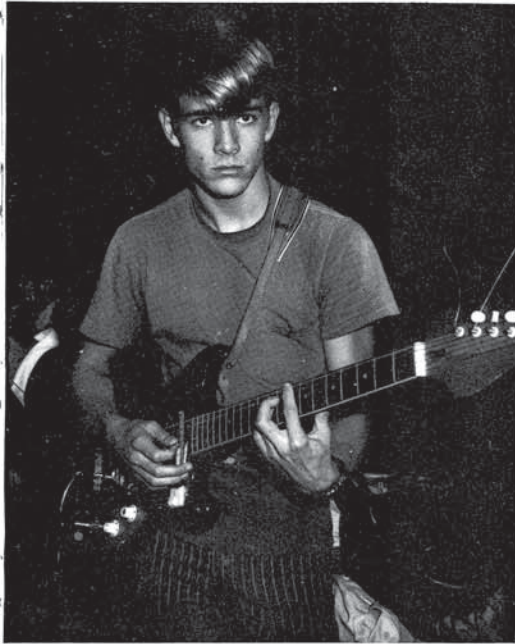
