
### Suspense


likely that Richard Nixon would be our next president.




#### Tough Rugged Tigers

No matter how you slice it, the Urbana football team had a highly successful year despite its mediocre 5-4 record. They beat Champaign Central 13-6, came within seconds of defeating 4th ranked Belleville Althoff, defeated previously unbeaten Springfield and placed three men on all-conference teams with 4 honorable mentions. The three all-conference selections were co-captain Jeff Smith, Mike Rusk and Mike Daly. Bruce Walker, Pete Jones, Pete Alagna and Willie Southall made honorable mention. Pete Alagna was "Most Valuable", Mike Rusk "Most Improved" and Jeff Smith "Best Offensive Lineman". Kerry Hopkins was winner of the "Defensive Player of the Year" award. The Tigers started the season with 25-0 and 26-0 victories over Rantoul and Decatur Mac Arthur. Urbana lost its next two games 7-0 to Danville on a questionable call and then a 27-25 heartbreaker to Belleville Althoff. Urbana was led to 25-7 by quarterback Kerry Hopkins, only to see their lead dissolved by the superb passing of the opposing quarterback. Coach called Urbana the hardest hitting team he had ever seen against a team which outweighed them twenty pounds per man. Urbana recovered to beat Springfield 39-15, but they lost at homecoming to Bloomington 25-7 in a very uninspired game. However Smitty's men won "The Game" giving them a winning season and enabling Coach Smith to even his record against the cross-town power at 8-8.







#### **Up and Coming Tigers**


It was another successful year for the Urbana Sophomores. They compiled a fine 6-3 record which included a victory over cross-town rival Champaign Central. The Tiger Cubs, coached by Dave Casstevens, had five men eventually moved up to varsity. Sophomore Mike Franke was the varsity place kicker most of the year. Other sophomores lost to the varsity included center Steve Lovett as back-up man to All-Stater Jeff Smith, Reggie Clark, and B. J. Brown, both of whom were used to fill in at safety. 

# Young Tigers Gain Experience


Young tigers gain experience and finish strong. Coach Oscar Adams' '68-69 Tigers entered the season young and inexperienced, but emerged as an efficient and much improved ball club. Barely able to buy a game early in the season, the Tigers came back to revenge several earlier Big 12 losses, upset Centennial and advance to the Regional finals before bowing to Champaign. Despite their slow start, the Tigers came back to even their record and finish with a respectable 12 wins and 15 losses. The '69 Tigers were generaled by Captain and all-Big 12 guard, Willie Southall. Willie was indispensable as both playmaker and scorer (13.0) and provided the team with much needed stability and experience. He was supported by A. C. Upshaw, Ron Williams and John Huett up front and Mac Bigger in the back court. Amazing (jumper) Upshaw led the team in rebounding and was second in scoring (12.4). Together with Biggers (10.6), Huett (8.2) and Williams (9.1), he should help lead a strong and experienced offensive attack for next year's Tigers. The Tigers started four juniors and have thirteen underclassmen. If they continue to improve next year, as they did in '69, Urbana could again become a major basketball club in Central Illinois. Later Urbana went out and proved that they're the team to watch with a brilliant win over Centennial to catapult them into the District finals against state ranked Central.



# Engles-Tigers Are Successful

Pete Engels, third place finisher in the state wrestling meet, signified the end of a successful wrestling season. The Tigers managed to scrape out a 6-9 season mark, despite the loss of two outstanding wrestlers of a year ago, Ron Dix and Pete Alagna. Unlike many Urbana teams of the past, the Tigers starred not in the duel meet season, which their 6-9 season record indicates, but in the major tournaments preceding. The conference, first major tournament of the season, found Urbana placing seven men and finishing a strong fourth, just behind Champaign who took third. The Tigers outdid themselves the following week at the district tournament in Rantoul. This time the Tigers placed eight men and finished third, some 20 points ahead of Champaign. Urbana was topped only by Danville and a mighty Rantoul team unbeaten in 17 duel meets. The district meet saw Urbana qualify four wrestlers for the sectional meet at Norman. The champions were Pete Engels, Nick Gibala, Ford Mautz, and second place finisher Carl Lyman. Later on in the week, they were joined by third place finishers Chris Copeland and Steve D'urso, qualifying as a result of injury to a qualifier ahead of them. With six sectional qualifiers the Tigers charged into Normal where they captured 4th in one of the toughest sectionals in the state. Rantoul, the district winner and one of the favorites finished with a mere 4 points. Pete Engels and Nick Gibala, state qualifiers for the second year in a row, carried the Tiger hopes into the Assembly Hall. Although Nick dropped his first match, Pete managed with a fine third place finish, giving Urbana 11 points and a 15th place finish. Coach John Gremer will lose five lettermen to graduation; 112 pounder Jeff Stein; (9-10), conference and district champ, 127 pounder Rod Humes, 133 pounder Neil Richardson, and conference champ, district champ, and sectional champ, Pete Engels.


## Almost Great


The Urbana swimming team developed into one of the midstate powers in '69. Their record was a mediocre 5-5 but they rose to the occasion in the district and conference meets, finishing third and second respectively. It was a tremendously successful year from the standpoint of individual performances, as five new records were established and three men plus a relay qualified for state competition. Leon Yankwich qualified in the 50 freestyle and set a new district mark of 22.7. He also set a school record of 57.0 in the 100 freestyle and won two conference crowns. Ted Odom closed out his high school career in freestyle as he qualified før state on the strength of his district diving win. He also set the conference diving mark. Andy Miller was indispensable in winning two firsts in conference and district, setting a 400 freestyle record of 4:07, and qualifying for the state meet. The 400 yard freestyle relay team of Creighton Laz, Jim Glasa, Jim Weisiger, and Leon Yankwich also qualified for state as they broke the school record in 3:33.5. Another record, the 160 medley relay, was tied in 1:24.5 by Jim Weisiger, Chris Brown, Creighton Laz, and Leon Yankwich.

Many swimmers contributed to the effort, Chris Brown in the I.M., John May in Butterfly, Jim Glasa and Creighton Laz in sprints, Jim Weisiger in Backstroke, and Bob Glasa in Breaststroke. The necessary depth for any successful team was provided by Pete Brown, Neil Frownfelter, Bob Hutchinson, and Dave Mussey.





# Harrier Depth Proves Potent

With the help of three exceptional Sophomores and six returning lettermen, Bill Plymire's '68 Tiger Harriers compiled a fine 10-4 dual meet record and finished third in both the conference and district meets. Among these four losses, two came against a powerful Danville team and the other two were suffered to teams which the Tigers beat convincingly in later invitationals. To their dual meet record, the varsity added a first at the Paris invitational, and the Sophomores were undefeated in dual meets, first at both Paris and Centennial. Despite an injury to Captain Larry Abernathy and sickness of other top runners, some good individual performances and substantial depth proved potent against most opponents.

Junior Gary "the Machine" Shaw and Senior John Sherrod led the Tigers to their ten victories and both qualified for the state meet at Savoy. A severe blow to the team was a knee injury to Captain Larry Abernathy, which put him out for the season. These two were supported by Sophomore Marc Chandler, Seniors Bob Werkman, Roy Roberts, Rich Cureton, Mike Giddens, and Jim Kruidenier and Sophomores Greg Shaw and Bill Judd.
