

#### Pep Club Peps Up U.H.S.














# Tigers Finish in Triumph




#### Strong Sophs Have Varsity Potential




#### Tigers Cope Regional Title, Best Record Ever

They finished a very close third in one of the state's toughest conferences, and the greatest triumph of all was defeating arch rival Champaign Central two out of three times, to establish their rule over the twin-cities.








#### Tanker Performances Impressive






Man versus Machine.


