SALEM BAPTIST CHURCH HISTORY ~ABREVIATED VERSION~

In late 1866 and early 1867, a group of Spiritually motivated people envisioned organizing themselves into a church body. In 1867, Susan Franklin Johnson, Kitty Lee, T.J. Shore, J.W. Randolph and Martin Dandrage met with the Council of Recognition. The Council was composed of selected members of First Baptist Church of Champaign, IL, First Baptist Church of Urbana, IL and Bethel Church of Mahomet, IL. The purpose of the Council was to consider the newly organized church, its Articles of Faith, its Covenant, the circumstances of its organization and to recognize it as a Baptist Church.

After several pastorates, in 1902, the name was later changed to Salem Baptist The church was to be called Second Baptist. Church under the pastorate of Reverend Edwards. In 1948, a parsonage was later

purchased under the pastorate of Reverend R.A. Lillard In 1948, Reverend Lillard recommended Reverend W.H. Donaldson to Salem Baptist Church. On June 20, 1949, Reverend W.H. Donaldson was called from Murfreesboro, Tennessee. He accepted the call and relocated to Champaign, IL in August of 1949. Several Ministries were established under leadership and are still active today. He later resigned, July 1, 1953 and accepted the Pastorate at Zion Baptist

After an absence of 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ years, Reverend Donaldson returned to Salem on Church, Peoria, IL. December 20, 1968 to complete the work that the Lord had ordained him to finish. Reverend Donaldson labored faithfully until ending his pastorate at Salem Baptist Church on April 16, 1981 after having completed 50 years of dedicated service as a Pastor. Salem Baptist Church voted unanimously to name Reverend W. Howe Donaldson

On August 28, 1981, Salem voted unanimously to call Reverend Dr. Claude E. "Pastor Emeritus" on February 27, 1981. Shelby, Sr. to serve as Pastor. Reverend Shelby has worked diligently through the years to help establish numerous Ministries at Salem including Operation Excellence (an after school tutorial program for Salem's Youth), The Dr. Martin Luther King Scholarship Program, Grandma's Soup Kitchen (began July 8, 1995 under the direction of President, Sister Alvena Monroe with a primary mission to feed the hungry and homeless while sharing the love of Jesus Christ. Salem began assisting the Grandma's Soup

Kitchen Ministry in December of 1999.

Other Ministries partnering with the Empty Tomb, Salem's Read-In under the direction of Sister Audrey Keaton-Mock to assist youth from the community in developing their reading skills, the MOCK ACT tutorial program under the direction of Deacon Dr. William Hoff to assist youth from the community in preparing for the ACT. Kingdom Seekers under the direction of Sister Pamela Wilson and Reverend Wilson, Tuesday Teen Talk under the direction of Reverend Lorenzo Bolden and Sister Cynthia Keaton-Williams and facilitated by Taylor Moore who was recently featured in the Chicago Tribune for her contribution in the fight for abstinence and who provides our weekly. seminar for the teens. Previous ministries include Share Food and partnering with Mental Health to assist young, unwed teen mothers.

All of these vital Ministries have either been initiated or supported by our beloved Pastor, Reverend Dr. Claude E. Shelby, Sr., and have not only benefited our Salem

Family, but others living in the Champaign-Urbana community. Reverend Shelby has served as Moderator for the Wood River District, hosts the Wednesday broadcast for WBCP radio, member of the Planning and Implementation Committee (PIC) -Champaign Unit 4 schools a committee created to deal with equity issues within the school district and had the faith and vision to help make dreams of a new sanctuary a reality. He has established a Contemporary Worship Service and most recently supported the Friend to Friend Evangelism Workshop that took our beloved Pastor and members of our congregation "door-to-door" sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ to more

In 2009, Salem and several other churches in the community decided to leave the Wood River Baptist District Association after serving faithfully for many years. We are now proud members of the Fellowship Baptist District Association under the Direction of Moderator Lundy Savage, Pastor of the Mt. Olive Baptist Church. Our beloved. Pastor Reverend Dr. Claude E. Shelby, Sr. serves as President of Congress. Our new district has been a blessing to all those that serve under their leadership.

Salem has been blessed to come a long way during our 144 years. In 2005, Salem Baptist Church was named a Historical Landmark and in February of 2009, our church family began efforts through Operation Pay Off to burn the mortgage of our beloved church. Our 143rd Church anniversary chaired by Sister Audrey Keaton-Mock and Sister Elaine Owens, held Sunday, May 17, 2009 was a glorious day for our church. It is the day we completed our goal of Operation Pay Off and paid our church mortgage. Our theme was "Where there is Unity There is Strength", Psalm 133. On August 16, 2009, Salem Baptist Church held its Mortgage Burning Ceremony. We thank God for our many blessings and the leadership of our beloved Pastor. In September 2010, Salem and Reverend Shelby will celebrate 29 years of dedicated service to Salem Baptist Church.
