The Urbana Tigers "did it again." Impressively! The offense, including the best backfield in Urbana history, rushed for a total of 2670 yards. Of that total, 2170 yards were gained by backs Bill Lilliard (550 yards), Brian Ford (623 yards), and All-State halfback Charlie Bareither (997 yards). To relieve the pressure on these three break-away threats, blossoming quarterback Herb Sliger threw well-placed passes to ends Jim Primmer, Mike Casey, Don Carter, and Doug Koch. Sliger proved especially effective in the Danville game, completing 8 of 10 tosses for 143 yards.

Defensively, the Tigers were the toughest ever, allowing only 437 yards rushing in 245 attempts for a 1.8 yards per carry average and a 48.5 yards per game average. Against such a stingy line, opponents took to the air but completed only 39 of 125 passes.

This year Urbana was picked as favorite in the Champaign game—a rarity. But unlike their rivals, Urbana did not allow an upset, steam-rolling to a 19—0 lead before Champaign managed to score. The victory brought Urbana its second Big 12 crown and second win over the Maroons in a row. This was also the Tiger's fifth conference championship in 9 years and the third victory over Champaign in 4 years. How did they do it? "Unselfishness," said Coach Smith. He also praised the leadership of co-captains Dan Franklin and Brian Ford.







Cross Country Team Shines

Urbana's 1965 cross-country team proved to be one of the finest, if not the finest, of Coach Gene Armer's career. To achieve this description, the harriers accumulated an impressive list of accomplishments.

They were undefeated in 12 dual meets, including 2 shutout victories over Champaign and 2 near-perfect victories over last year's Big 12 champion, Danville. They placed second out of 31 teams at the Peoria Invitational, possible the toughest early-season invitational in the state. Using their second team, they placed first at the Mattoon Invitational and had 4 in the top 20. They won the Big 12 Championship crown, picking up the first 2 places. And they won the district meet, scoring a record low of 21 points, the nearest competitor being some 70 points away.

Urbana's success was a result of hard individual work over the summer, great desire during the official season, and the outstanding leadership of returning captain, Alan Taylor. So well did the team perform that Coach Armer felt that this was the best group with whom he had worked. "They always did what I asked," he was quoted as saying.





Tigers Gain Berth in Sweet Sixteen

Balance, shooting, and speed were key factors in a great season for the 1965-66 Tiger basketball team. Each of the starting five gained scoring honors in at least one game, and early in the season their pre-game averages were within 2 or 3 points. As the season progressed, however, scoring responsibilities fell more heavily on forwards Larry Johnson and Don McDonald and center Mike Casey. Urbana made good use of the speed of its two guards, Clarence Winfrey and Jerry Lyman, who pressured opponents into a great many errors. Adding to Urbana's strength were Jerry Wells, Gary Ruppel, and Bill

Close losses suffered early in the season managed to keep the strong Urbana team from gaining its first Big 12 Championship in 20 years. In fact, close contests, victorious and otherwise, were a characteristic of this team, as 12 of their games were decided by 6 or fewer points. The season was highlighted by victories over strong Schlarman, Springfield, and Lincoln teams, and two victories in three games over Champaign.

The real prowess of the Tigers was exemplified as they powered their way through Regional and Sectional tournaments and into the Sweet Sixteen. A new school and team spirit was evident as the tournaments began and the Tigers crushed Uni High 105—58, setting a new school point record. A victory over a talented Bellflower team preceded an Urbana win over Champaign in the finals of the Regional tournament. A week later the Tigers shaded state-rated Schlarman 69—67 and then beat Armstrong 63—54 to earn a Sectional trophy and a berth in the Sweet Sixteen.






Urbana Proves Tigers Can Swim






