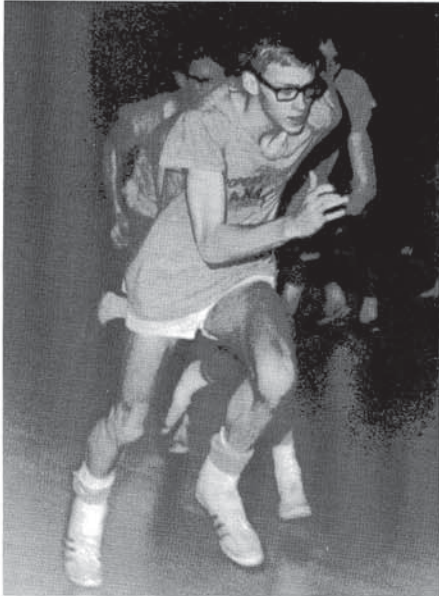




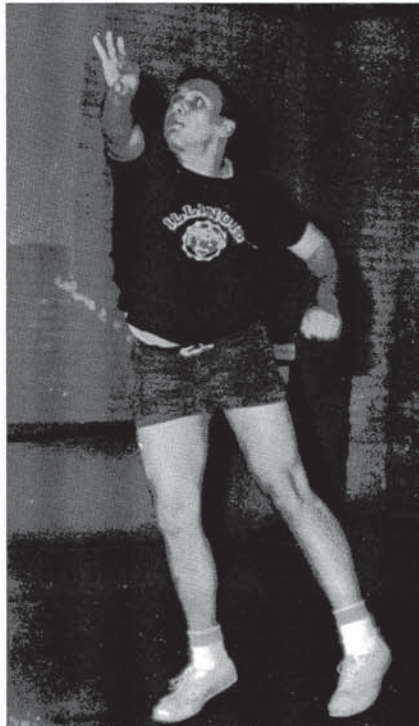

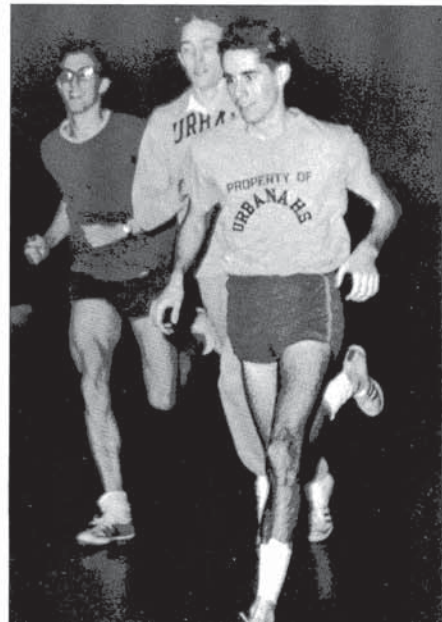

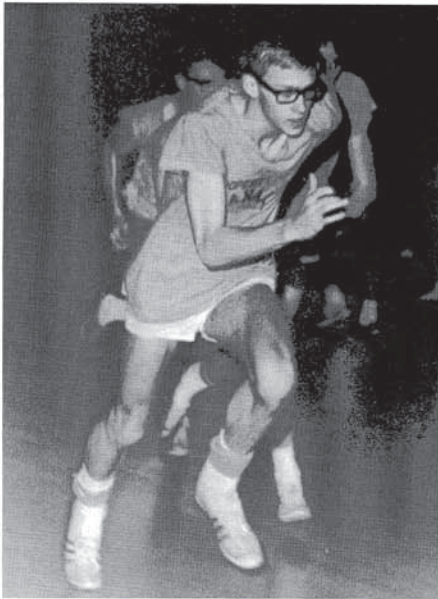

The 1966 Tiger Track Team, one of the finest in school history, should successfully round off a fantastic year of sports at UHS. Proof of this prediction is already evident as the Tigers flexed their muscles in two large meets, the newly organized Central Illinois Relays and the MacArthur Invitational Track Meet. In the CIR, held in the U. of I. armory and co-sponsored by UHS and CHS, the team swept all four relays to outscore the nearest contender (CHS) 48 1/2 to 30. But that was only a warm-up, for at MacArthur a week later they amassed 79 points to the 36 of second place CHS.

Standouts for the Tigers are captain Charlie Bareither in the 220 and 440, Chuck Warwick in the 880, and John Lockard in the mile. The excellent early season times of these three boys rank them high in state competition. Others who show great promise are Alan Taylor, John Mamer, Bill Enlow, Dave Parkinson, and Mike Eastin in the middle distances and Gary Ruppel, Jim Primmer, Clarence Winfrey, Bret Sutton, Bill Lilliard, and Mike Casey in the sprints and hurdles. Brad Humes should be strong in the discus, and Herb Tiedemann and Rex Renfrew in the shot. In the pole-vault Dan Franklin and Dan Sherrod should do well, in the long jump Clarence Winfrey, and in the high jump Mark Childress.

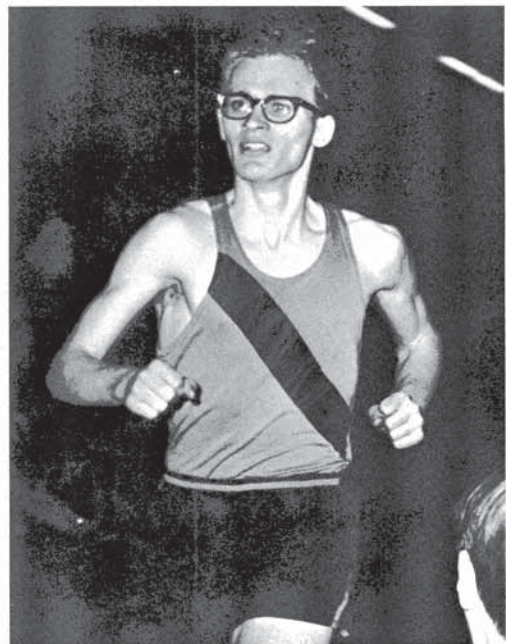
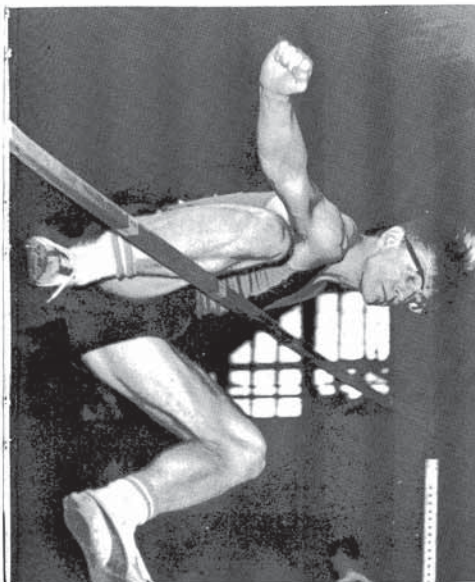
