



Beauty Enhances a Successful Homecoming

Sophs Ready for Varsity






Urbana Harriers Dominate Downstate Illinois




Cagers Up and Down, but Exciting

For the Urbana Tigers the 1966-67 basketball season was one of ups and downs, hot nights and cold nights, good breaks and bad breaks. Potentially, the team was as good as Urbana's best. They had depth, scoring ability, rebounding power, and speed. And actually, their 16—10 record was better than it appears, for 7 of their 10 losses were to state-rated teams.

Despite discouraging losses for a team which through junior high and high school had become accustomed to winning, several bright moments were registered. The team's 16 wins included a rare defeat of Decatur in their gym and a 3rd place finish at the Danville Tourney. Some of the best games played by any Urbana team were this year's devastations of Mattoon, Bloomington, Monticello, and Peoria East. Even some of the losses had encouraging aspects, as the Tigers nearly twice defeated Schlarman and achieved a half-time lead against powerful Springfield.

The scoring this year was extremely well balanced with the averages of captains, Larry Johnson and Jerry Lyman, and teammates, Bill Mock, Mark Beckrum, Ron Butler, and Jerry Wells, all within 5 points. Rebounding, led by Bill Mock and Larry Johnson, was the team's strong point. Shooting was their weak point. The latter category, however, was plagued more by inconsistency than by lack of ability. In fact, inconsistency was the team's affliction all season long. At times they were mediocre, and at times they were great. But when they were great, they were unbeatable.




Sophomore Cagers Finish Strong

As usual, individual strength surpassed team depth. This fact accounted for several close losses in which Urbana swimmers, weary from previous races, were forced to compete against fresh opposition.


Nevertheless, tremendous individual effort and fine coaching from Stan Summers accounted for several new records and an outstanding swimming season.

Jet Age Progresses




Expanding Band Talents Accommodated















Superintendent Ray Braun




To the Class of '67

Charles M. Carpenter

A Tribute to Charles Carpenter

Charles Carpenter taught U.S. History and Economics at U.H.S. from 1952 until his death March 22, 1966. While at Urbana, he served as sponsor of the junior classes of 1954 and 1965, the senior classes of 1955 and 1963, and the Travel Clubs of 1954 and 1955.


As a major and later lieutenant colonel during World War II, he gained national fame as "Bazooka Charlie" for knocking out Nazi tanks and planes. Lt. Col. Carpenter piloted a reconnaissance Piper Cub which he mounted with six "bazooka rockets" that fired from a trigger in the cockpit.

After the War, Mr. Carpenter became Commander of Cadets at Roosevelt Academy and later joined the University of Illinois History Department where he taught for five years before coming to U.H.S.

It is perhaps impossible to do Mr. Carpenter justice and no words can really tell what kind of man he was. A war hero who never spoke of the war—a rugged athlete who also wrote poetry—a gentleman who spoke with tolerance and wisdom. This he was and more.








Distance, Depth and Team Balance Keys to Tiger Success





Miler Alan Taylor breaks the tape far ahead of the pack.








