INFORMATION SHEET FOR ART AUCTION

Pyramid Auction Tours will provide the following services:

- Select all art to be shown and have it framed
- Will bring, at least, 100 pieces - one of each piece
- Price range of art \$75-\$100 (market value)
- Donate a door prize - one framed photo-lithograph
- Set up display at the auction site
- Provide brochures listing each piece of art to be auctioned
- Provide an auctioneer who will conduct the auction
- Design flyers or posters for you and provide them at a minimum charge
- Design and print tickets or invitations for the auction and provide them at a minimum charge
- Will provide a list of those persons who attended auction
- Will come to C-U for "publicity tour"

National Council of Negro Women - Champaign County Section will be responsible for the following:

- Sell tickets to patrons (30 selling days suggested)
- Arrange for local publicity such as newspaper coverage, television spots and radio spots
- Distribute literature to other organizations and guests
- Provide ten (10) people as art walkers during the auction
- Provide four (4) people as art wrappers during the auction
- Provide three (3) people to check purchases after the auction
- Obtain hotel room, meeting room, or other suitable room for conducting the auction
- Assure availability of a microphone, podium, chairs and 20 ten foot tables
- Determine and provide the refreshments to be served during the auction
- Obtain tickets and/or invitations
- Guarantee the attendance of 250 adults at the auction
- If this attendance level is not met, the group(s) will be charged a service fee of \$350.00. This \$350.00 service fee will be waived if the auction attains gross sales revenue before taxes of \$5000.00 or more
- Will pay 20% of revenue from tickets sales on day of auction
- Company would prefer to have money sent to them as it is available, prior to auction date
- OPTIONAL - Group may want to provide one piece of art as door prize

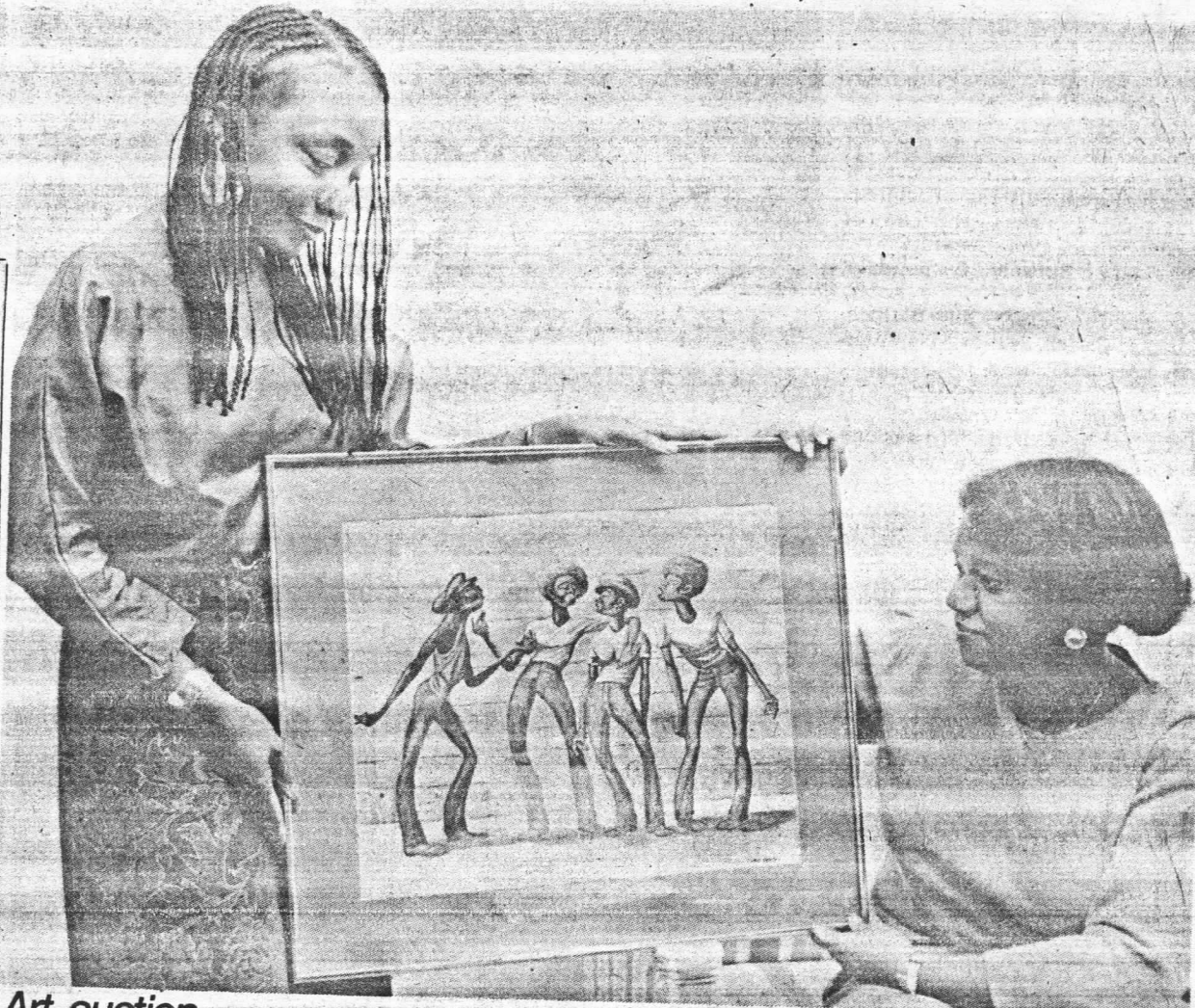

# Candidates skip NCNW forum

Republican candidates were conspicuous by their absence at a candidates' forum held recently in Champaign.

GOP contenders Dan Crane and Stanley Weaver were no-shows at the forum, to which the Champaign-Urbana chapter of the National Council of Negro Women (NCNW) had invited all candidates for national, state, and county offices.

Terry Bruce, the Democrat who is challenging incumbent Rep. Crane in the 19th District, said he was running on his record as an Illinois legislator.

One Republican who did attend was Linda Frank. She is opposing incumbent Helen Satterthwaite in the race for state legislator in the 103d District. Both candidates, however, drew some fire from audience questioners for responses given to a question about what blacks could expect from them in Springfield.

Frank said she was

not aware of any special concerns of the black community, and Satterthwaite said she did not represent special interests. The answers apparently were not what the group of black women expected, because indignant comments and barely whispered comments followed.

State Sen. Stanley Weaver, R-Urbana, was not on hand to respond to the comments of his Democratic opponent, William Siler, also of Urbana.

Following Siler's comments, forum moderator Anna Wall Scott introduced candidates for county offices who were present. These included Laurel Lunt Prussing, Betty Smith, Naomi Jakobsen and Mary Lee Sargent. Smith is Republican. About 25 persons were on hand to question the candidates during the forum and a reception period that followed.

NCNW is a service organization of black women; its founders include Mary McLeod Bethune and Mary Church Terrell.
