Stamp introduced
Patrick Jolliff, Urbana postmaster, and Anna Wall Scott, first vice president of the Champaign County Chapter of the National Council of Negro Women, check sheets of the new 22-cent stamp commemorating the noted educator and social activist Mary McLeod Bethune, the eighth in the Black Heritage Series. The stamp (inset) was issued March 5 in Washington, D.C. In 1904 Mrs. Bethune founded the Daytona Educational and Industrial Training School for Negro Girls at Daytona Beach, Fla., which merged with Cookman Institute in 1923 to form the Bethune-Cookman College. She served as the college's president until 1942. In 1935 she founded the National Council of Negro Women, forming a coalition of the leading black women's organizations. The local chapter of NCNW meets at 2 p.m. the second Saturday of each month except July and August at Mount Olive Baptist Church, Champaign. Rebecca J. Williams, Rantoul, is the president.
