### Stamp introduced

Patrick Jolliff, Urbana postmaster, and Anna Wall Scott, first vice president of the Champaign County Chapter of the National Council of Negro Women, check sheets of the new 22-cent stamp commemorating the noted educator and social activist Mary McLeod Bethune, the eighth in the Black Heritage Series. The stamp (inset) was issued March 5 in Washington, D.C. In 1904 Mrs. Bethune founded the Daytona Educational and Industrial Training School for Negro Girls at Daytona Beach, Fla., which merged with Cookman Institute in 1923 to form the Bethune-Cookman College. She served as the college's president until 1942. In 1935 she founded the National Council of Negro Women, forming a coalition of the leading black women's organizations. The local chapter of NCNW meets at 2 p.m. the second Saturday of each month except July and August at Mount Olive Baptist Church, Champaign. Rebecca J. Williams, Rantoul, is the president.

The meeting was opened at 2:10 pm by Anna Wale Scott 1st V.P. who was presiding in the absence of our President Rebecca Williams. The agenda was passed out and Mrs. Callie Embury led us in the Lords Prayer, followed by everyone singing Lift Every Voice. The financial Secretary gave her report - at last meeting <sup>we</sup> had collected \$21.00 in dues. Treasurer gave her report we had a balance of \$378.66 in checking account. Our savings account had a balance of \$739.68. The treasurer recommended that a check for \$138.00 which is a year old, made payable to National Headquarter be stopped. It was suggested that the Treasurer check with bank and see whether check would be honored before paying for a stop payment. There was a discussion of fair share this was tabled until the president is here. Report from the Mary McLeod Bethune Celebration will be here on July 13, 1985 - observe 50 years of N.C.N.W. The minutes were read and approved with correction - Mrs. E. Bridgewater instead of Mr. Haywood asked for volunteers for education

The check that was given to the Observance Committee was for invitation and mailings. The fundraiser for the United Negro College Fund will be Sept 14 at 7 P.M. with William Warfield being the honoree. There had

been no committee meeting yet.

Jean Rice our 2nd Vice President's mother died and she was given a \$25 ~~cost~~ <sup>Floral</sup> arrangement. Anna Wall Scott was reimbursed for the \$25.00. A check was also given to Mrs. Odessa Hudson for \$25 for the death of her brother. Mrs. Hudson gave the check to the scholarship fund in memory of her brother Norris A. Burnett.

Scholarship requirements were discussed and some of the things that the committee should look for are need, extracurricular activities, whether they are academically accepted by the school. Mrs. Peggy Minor suggested that the school counselor give names of students and the students be asked to give a letter of proof of their needs. The ~~cost~~ <sup>committee</sup> will ~~should~~ <sup>could</sup> choose from these letters. The rent for the room was paid for 3 months May, June, July. It was moved by Mrs. Hudson and by Mrs. Hendricks' motion was carried. It was moved that a plaque for Mrs. Williams our outgoing




