Our organization pledged \$2,500 to the telethon and our banquet for the purpose of raising those funds will be forthcoming.


Thanks to our secretary Mrs. Nettie Cook for eliciting such a successful response for our membership in paying their dues. If you did not respond, please do so.



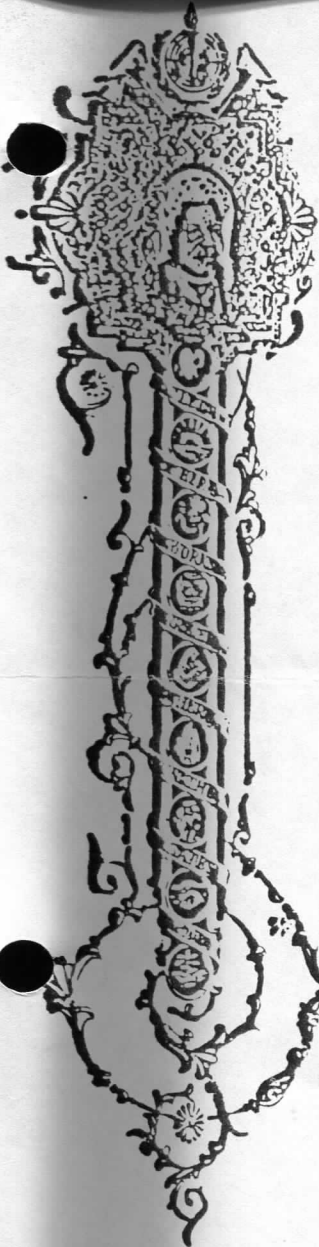

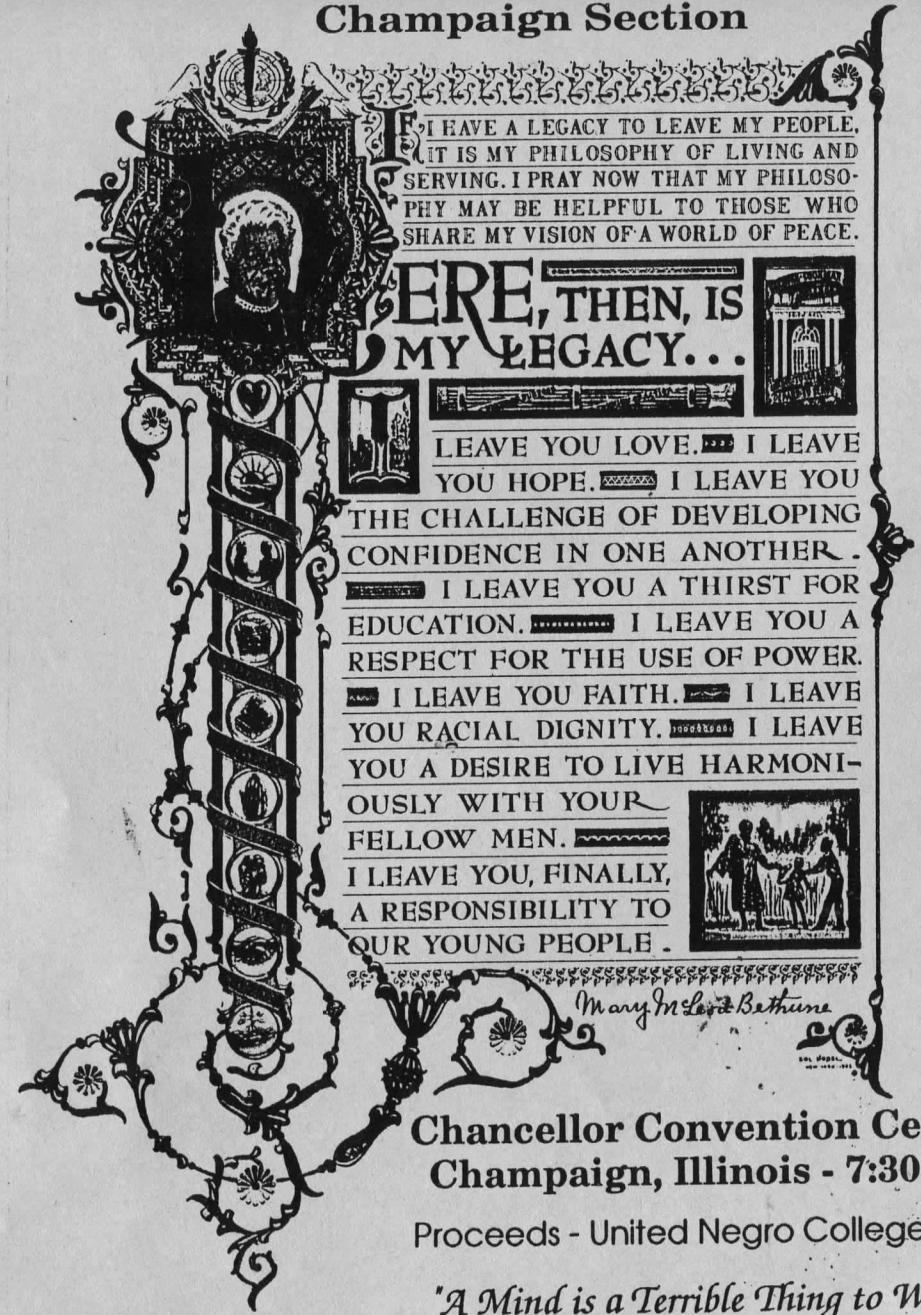

Father Clements to speak at awards dinner Friday

The Rev. George Clements, pastor of Holy Angels Church in Chicago, will receive an award Friday from the Champaign County section of the National Council of Negro Women.

Clements, 58, originator of the successful "One Church, One Child," adoption program, was the subject of a made-for-television movie, "The Father Clements Story," three years ago. His program, in cooperation with the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services, asks churches to encourage their black congregation members to adopt orphaned black children. Clements himself adopted a black child.

Also appearing at the dinner Friday will be the Right Rev. J. Haskell Mayo and his wife, Theodora. Rev. Mayo is presid-

ing bishop of the Fourth District of the African Methodist Episcopal Church, made up of Illinois, Indiana, Michigan and Canada.

Like Clements, the Mayos have been involved in social justice issues.

The dinner, which will benefit the United Negro College Fund, will be held at the Chancellor Convention Center, 1501 S. Neil St., C. Dinner will be served at 7 p.m. String music will be provided by members of the University of Illinois Symphony Orchestra.

Tickets are \$25 apiece and are available by check or money order by writing to National Council of Negro Women; 309 W. Michigan Ave.; Urbana, Ill. 61801. Tickets will be held at the door. A reception will follow the dinner.

Given the short time we have to execute this process, a swift response from all members is in order. Thank you in advance for your cooperation and your **rapid** response.

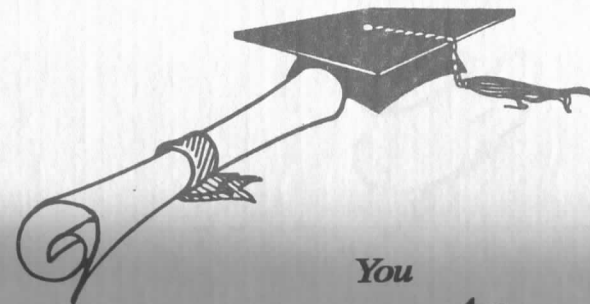
