



This Sunday's The News-Gazette featured a Guest Commentary talking about the changes at Frances Nelson Health Center. The Guest Commentary was written by Mark Ballard, President of the Interim Board of Promise Healthcare, the local non-profit that working to take ownership of Frances Nelson Health Center. You can read Mr. Ballard's Guest Commentary, which follows the end of this message.

But first, I wanted to provide some information about the transition process, and remind everyone also of the upcoming meeting on Wednesday that will focus on how to honor Frances Nelson's history (details below).

Here are some basic facts that might be helpful for understanding the Frances Nelson transition:

- 1. The goal for returning the Frances Nelson Health Center to local ownership and operation is to improve and expand health services for the medically underserved, a growing population in our community.
- 2. About 11 years ago, under federal direction, Decatur Community Health Improvement Center (CHIC) took over Frances Nelson Health Center, and Frances Nelson as a separate corporation ceased to exist. Decatur CHIC has been running Frances Nelson ever since that time.
- 3. Frances Nelson Health Center is currently owned and operated by Decatur CHIC. Please note that they are allowed to have a different corporate name, yet still keep the name of the clinic as Frances Nelson.
- $4.\ \,$ The local non-profit that is working to purchase the assets of the Frances Nelson Health Center in order to improve and expand health care services for the medically underserved is called Promise Healthcare.
- 5. Promise Healthcare is the former SmileHealthy organization, which has reorganized itself into a new non-profit in order to meet federal requirements for operating a "federally qualified health center" (FQHC). Technically, SmileHealthy is a d.b.a. (doing business as) for Central Illinois Dental and Education Services (CIDES). SmileHealthy provides dental services for low-income children, adults, and families, and operates the Frances Nelson Dental Center.
- 5. The ONLY name change that is happening is from CIDES/SmileHealthy, to Promise Healthcare.
- 6. Promise Healthcare does NOT have the rights to the Frances Nelson name.
- 7. Once the Frances Nelson Health Center has been acquired by Promise Healthcare, it *may* be possible to keep the Frances Nelson name for the health center.
- 8. Why is there an Interim Board for Promise Healthcare? The Interim Board exists for the purpose of negotiating with Decatur CHIC and working with the federal government for the acquisition of Frances Nelson Health Center (FNHC). Once Promise Healthcare has acquired FNHC, then a new Board will be established that will meet the federal regulations for operating a federally-qualified health center. That Board will be made up of 51% users of the health center.

I hope this information is helpful.

Also, the Interim Board of Promise Healthcare is looking for community input on how best to honor Frances Nelson and the history of the clinic. To that end, a community discussion meeting has been scheduled:

Community Discussion: Honoring the Legacy of Frances Nelson Wednesday, May 23, 2012 at 4:00 p.m.

P.S. Below is the Guest Commentary about Frances Nelson that appeared in yesterday's (Sunday, May 20, 2012) The News-Gazette, written by Mark Ballard, the President of the Promise Healthcare Interim Board of Directors.

GUEST COMMENTARY: CHANGES IN STORE

Ms. Frances Nelson was an important figure in the history of our community. Starting in the 1940's and continuing into the 1960's, when African American children were not accepted at the Cunningham Children's Home, she would take care of these orphans in her home and raise them to be members of our community. It was in honor of this selfless act that the Frances Nelson Heath Center was named for her and in 1969 moved into her former home. The volunteer-staffed health center originated to address the chronic problem of the high infant mortality rate in the African American community but transformed itself over the years into a health center with on-staff physicians dedicated to providing free or affordable medical services to the under-served in our community.

It is based upon this history of providing medical services to an under-served population that a local group, Promise Healthcare, has entered into negotiations to acquire the clinic from a Decatur organization who has managed it the past eleven years. I am the President of the Interim Board of Directors and want to share with you what is happening and why.

Our goal is to increase access to healthcare in Champaign County. Our group has secured the promise of private funding that will assist expanding the primary care available to clients that use the current location and that will supplement the Medicaid and Medicare reimbursements that are payable by the government. This promise of private funding will also allow us to expand the types of services that are available to the clinic's patients - we are particularly excited about the prospect of expanding the mental health services offered - as well as expanding the geographic reach of services beyond the current location.

Our group already has a history of expanding services at the clinic: the new corporation was formed by the original SmileHealthy board of directors. SmileHealthy, many of you know, opened and is coordinating the Dental Clinic at Frances Nelson. Based upon the success of expanding services at the clinic to include affordable dental care, this corporation has filed the paperwork to change its name to Promise corporation has filed the paperwork to change its name to Promise Healthcare in order to acquire the clinic from the Decatur group. I know that a number of people are concerned because it was reported that the name of the corporation will be something other than the current Frances Nelson Heath Center. The corporate name was chosen as Promise Healthcare for a couple of reasons: (1) we were encouraged by someone at the State to choose a name that did not include Frances Nelson to avoid any confusion in the application approval process and in the process of securing grant funding in the future; and (2) given our goal of expanding the geographic reach of the services we offer, the Promise Healthcare name seems more portable to locations outside of Champaign/Urbana. Champaign/Urbana.

However, we understand the importance of Frances Nelson to this community and from the start we have planned to form the Frances Nelson Legacy Project to help find the proper way to honor Ms. Nelson for her contributions to our community. This group will be given wide latitude to make recommendations on how Ms. Nelson can be honored – anything from naming a Frances Nelson Community Resource Room at the clinic to naming the clinic itself the Frances Nelson Clinic. We, as an interim board, want this group to meet and discuss all possibilities so that the right thing can be done. Their recommendation will be given to the permanent board for consideration and action once it is formed.

The meeting of the Frances Nelson Legacy Project working group will be held on Wednesday, May 23rd, at $4\!:\!00$ p.m., Champaign Public Library Main Branch, Meeting Room C, 200 West Green St., Champaign. If you have an interest in this and want to join the discussion, please plan to attend.

The permanent board of Promise Healthcare will be formed according to the Federally Qualified Health Center regulations of the Federal Government. This 17 member board will have 51% of its members as patients of the clinic. The decision on how to honor Frances Nelson will be theirs but we want to have the working group well on its way to having a recommendation ready for them to act upon early in their tenure.
